



SUIT OVER COKE PLANT

Thomas J. Bennett, the contractor, has brought suit against the Dunlap-Connellsville Coke Company for the recovery of \$3,510.28 alleged to be due him for loss incurred while carrying out instructions from officers of the company and from their civil engineer Thomas B. Young. Bennett recites that on May 27, 1907 he was taken to a site near Simpson station, Redstone station by Young and a site for a coke plant pointed out to him. He states that Young gave him a description of the proposed plant and thus induced him to submit a bid for the erection of the plant. Bennett said he did this and was awarded the contract, afterwards ratified by the corporation when the charter was secured. He declares that he expended considerable money in quarrying stone, excavating and in other work, when he was notified that the plans for the plant has been changed. On account of this change in the plans, declares Bennett, he believes that he is entitled to the amount stated for

the expense and labor incurred by him.

HORRIBLE BLUNDER MADE

Mistake Is Soon Discovered and He
Is Rushed to Bellevue Hospital.—
Associates Direct That Everything
Possible be Done for Him.

(Special Telegram to The Herald)

NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—The attack of aphasia which caused Thomas B. Young, president of the Brownsville Engineering company, of Brownsville, Pa., and one of the wealthiest business men of that city, to walk into the apartments of Mrs. Mary Menahan, at 201 East 66th street, Tuesday, for which he was arrested on a charge of burglary, is puzzling the physicians at the Bellevue hospital where he is now confined under observation.

On Tuesday afternoon Mrs. Menahan was sitting in her apartments when a strange man opened the door and entered. Mrs. Menahan says she was startled for a moment thinking the man was bent on burglary. He attempted no violence however and Mrs. Menahan observed that he had a fixed stare and acted as if he were in a trance. She took him by the shoulder and pushed him out into the hall. Then she sent for a policeman and had the man locked up.

PITTSBURG, Nov. 30. — Thomas B. Young, president of the Brownsville Engineering company, of Brownsville, Pa., and one of the best known young business men of the Monongahela valley, is lying in the Bellevue hospital, New York City, suffering from aphasia, an attack which is perplexing the New York police, as well as the Bellevue attendants.

Mr. Young according to information communicated to his friends here this evening, was arrested by the New York police as a burglar, but the authorities quickly found their mistake and sent him to the hospital where his condition is serious. He can give no account of himself. The police say Mr. Young was wandering about in a way which excited suspicion but it was soon found he was in a very

It was soon found he was in a very dazed condition.

On him at the time of his being taken in charge were \$30,000 in bonds of a well known Western Pennsylvania bank and a letter from Anna Bowman, of South Linden avenue, Pittsburg. It was through Miss Bowman that the identity of Mr. Young was clearly established. She explained that he had done much work on her properties in the Monongahela valley and the letter was in reference to this work.

Telephone communication with Brownsville tonight showed that Mr. Young, who is one of the best known men of the town, left for New York on last Sunday night. He did not tell his business associates when he would return or the nature of the business which took him there.

Great consternation attended the news of his illness and his business partner L. D. Moslener at once got in communication with Bellevue hospital and ordered everything possible done for Mr. Young. Mr. Moslener said Mr. Young usually carried several hundred dollars on his person and feared he had been injured by some persons after his money. Mr. Moslener knew nothing of the bonds which Mr. Young carried with him.

BROWNSVILLE MAN'S PLIGHT REMARKABLE

Prominent Business Man, Victim of Aphasia, Is Arrested on Charge of Burglary, Then Taken to Hospital

CASE IS PUZZLING TO THE PHYSICIANS

New York, December 1.—An attack of aphasia caused Thomas B. Young, president of the Brownsville, Pa., Engineering Co., to walk into the apartments of Mrs. Mary Menehan, at No. 201 East Sixty-sixth street, Tuesday. Mrs. Menehan summoned an officer and had Young arrested on a charge of burglary. He is now in Bellevue Hospital, under observation. His case is puzzling to physicians.

Mr. Young came to New York Sunday night on business. He carried \$200 in cash and \$30,000 in bank bonds of the Gates Coal & Coke Co. Tuesday afternoon Mrs. Menehan was sitting in her apartment when a strange man opened the door and entered. Mrs. Menehan says she was startled for a moment, expecting the man was bent on burglary. He attempted no violence, however, and Mrs. Menehan observed that he had a fixed stare and acted as if he were in a trance. She took him by the shoulders and pushed him out into the hall. Then she sent for a policeman and had the man locked up.

SENT TO HOSPITAL.

Young was arraigned before Magistrate Krotel in the Yorkville court yesterday. It was apparent to the magistrate from the valuable papers found in the prisoner's pockets that he was no burglar. In addition to the papers there was a bank book on the Monongahela National Bank, showing large deposits and a withdrawal of \$55 made last Monday. None of the \$200 the man carried from his home was found in his pockets. Magistrate Krotel said:

"This looks to me like a singular case of aphasia, and I think Mr. Young had better go to Bellevue for observation. What do you think about it, prisoner?"

Young stared blankly at the magistrate, but evidently did not comprehend his words. He made no reply.

Word was immediately sent to Mr. Young's family in Brownsville and Pittsburgh. Friends there thought at first it was a case of mistaken identity, but when they learned of the finding of the bonds, bank book and papers which included Masonic credentials, they were convinced the man was Mr. Young.

L. G. Moslener, of Mr. Young's firm, communicated with Bellevue on the long distance telephone and said he would be here to see to Mr. Young.

BROWNSVILLE STIRRED.

Brownsville, Pa., December 1. — News that Thomas B. Young, president of the Brownsville Engineering & Contracting Co. and one of the best-known business men of the Monongahela valley, is in Bellevue Hospital, New York, unable to tell his name or to give any information about himself caused a stir here yesterday afternoon. Nothing has been learned to throw light on the mystery of Mr. Young's condition, though there are several theories. Mr. Young and C. H. Blakeney of the West Side Land Co., left here last Sunday, in the interest of a big business project. Nothing has been heard here concerning Blakeney, and many who think Mr. Young a victim of foul play are anxious regarding the other's welfare.

Mr. Young, who is about 40 years old, is a son of David Young, bituminous mine inspector, residing at Freeport. He established the engineering and contracting company here. He is an indefatigable worker and some of his friends incline to the belief that he has suffered mental collapse resulting from over-application.

L. G. Moslener, Young's assistant as manager of the engineering company, is unable to account for his chief's presence in the New York hospital. He last saw Young last Sunday, when the latter said he would be away on business for several days, but did not mention his destination. Mrs. Young announced her intention of visiting relatives until her husband's return.

CARRIED FORTUNE, LOST HIS MEMORY

Queer Case of Thos. B. Young,
of Pittsburg, Arrested in
New York.

Seemed to Have Forgotten Ev-
erything, and was Taken
to Hospital.

[By Leased Wire from New York Sun.]

NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—A man from Pittsburg, who had his pockets full of letters, \$30,000 worth of bonds, checkbooks, Masonic credentials and cards bearing the name of Thomas B. Young, was arraigned before Magistrate Krotel in the Yorkville police court today on a singular charge of burglary.

Mrs. Mary Meahan, of No. 201 East 66th street, appeared as complainant. She said that the tall, well dressed stranger walked into her apartment yesterday in a sort of wooden trance, stood and gazed at her, and then allowed himself to be pushed out into the hallway as if he were a marionette on wheels.

Mr. Young, if it be he, was still in the same wooden sort of trance when he faced Magistrate Krotel today. There was a wooden stare in his eyes and his features were immobile as mahogany.

Although this man of mystery's clothing is of fine texture, it appeared to have had a strenuous time since he got to New York from Brownsville, Pa., a suburb of Pittsburg, on Monday.

Lieutenant Brown, of the East 67th street station, who arrested the trance

walker at the door of the East 66th street apartment, told Magistrate Krotel that he believed the prisoner had been riding up and down in dumb waiters or something of the sort. He looked as if he had been pushed through a small space. All the police could get out of him was an occasional "yet" or "no," dropped from his lips like the meaningless patter of a mechanical doll.

Upon searching his clothing, a letter addressed to Thomas B. Young, engineer and contractor of the Brownsville Engineering company, of Pittsburg, Pa., was found. Then there was a bankbook showing generous deposits (the police would not say how much) at the Monongahela National bank of Pittsburg. This book showed that its owner had drawn \$55 on Monday. A mileage book was also bought on the same day. Then there was a \$30,000 bond of the Gates Coal and Coke company and a blue print map of the property of the Domestic Coal company, a leather wallet stamped with Thomas B. Young's name, and under the name the lettering "compliments of the Ramsey Powder company, Brownsville, Pa."

There was also a letter from the Ingersoll-Rand company, bankers, of No. 11 Broadway. It related to invoices. Finally there was a card showing that Thomas B. Young was a member in good standing of McDowell lodge No. 107, F. & A. M., of West Virginia.

But when all these papers were spread before the man he gazed blankly at them. Magistrate Krotel couldn't get a coherent word out of him. Mrs. Meahan said of his intrusion:

"I was sitting reading when I heard a fumbling at the lock. It was about noon, and as I thought it was my husband coming home, I went right on reading. Then the first thing I knew this man came in, walking stiffly, as if his legs were made of wood. He stopped in front of me and looked at me with no more expression than a stone image."

"What do you want?" I asked, "but he only continued to stare. Then I rushed at him and pushed him out into the hall. He made no resistance and didn't utter a word. I got the janitor and the janitor got the policeman."

"It looks to me like a singular case of aphasia," said Magistrate Krotel, "and I think this man better go to Bellevue for observation. What do you think about it, prisoner?"

If the prisoner thought anything about it, he failed to express it, and the court ordered that he be sent to Bellevue.

His Friends Located.

PITTSBURG, Nov. 30.—Thomas R. Young, who has been mistaken for a burglar in New York, is one of the best known young business men of the Monongahela valley. He is president of the Brownsville Engineering company, of Brownsville, Pa., and has offices in Pittsburg. He left for New York on last Sunday night without telling his firm of his intentions, and that he had a great number of bonds on his person came as a surprise to his assistant, L. G. Moslener, this afternoon when informed of the trouble encountered by Mr. Young in New York.

The contractor is a rich man, and according to his friends has never been known to drink, and they cannot account for his dazed condition. His business associates learned this evening that he had but a couple of hundred dollars in cash with him when he left for New York.

Mr. Moslener placed himself in communication with New York authorities evening, saying he would go to New York at once if necessary; that he was at a loss to account for Mr. Young's condition. Mr. Young is well connected. He is married but his family is absent from Brownsville.

When arraigned before Magistrate Krotel, in Yorkville police court, he seemed to have lost all power of speech and was unable to understand anything said to him. The magistrate sent him to the psychopathic ward in Bellevue hospital for observation.

Dr. M. S. Gregory had tried every means to restore his memory, but he is still as much confused as at first, and is unable to tell at what hotel he stopped, what companions he may have had or whether he was drugged or robbed. His only answer to questions is a blank stare, except that occasionally he complains that his head aches. These are the only words he utters, and Dr. Gregory is unable as yet to diagnose his case.

A telegram was received at the hospital from his father in Pittsburgh today, saying he would arrive in New York to-morrow to take charge of his son.







He died 4 Apr 1926 in Pittsburgh, Allegheny WV of "acute alcoholism." Notes:

In 1910, Thomas Bruce Young, referred to as T.B. Young, a prosperous businessman & president of Brownsville Engineering, is the subject of many newspaper stories in PA & NY. Thomas heads for NYC on Sunday, 26 Nov 1910, along with C.H. Blakeney of the West Side Land Co. Later, Blakeney says when he left Thomas, he was fine. Thomas told no one of the nature of his business nor his destination.

Thomas later tells his father David that he lost his memory on Sunday night while riding on a Pennsylvania Railroad train. He remembered that on Monday night (27 Nov), he was walking, dazed, along Broadway. On Thursday (30 Nov 1910) – the night his wife Maria expected him home – Thomas opens the door of the apartment of Mrs. Mary Menahen at 201 E. 66th St. & walks in. She thinks he is a burglar but he offers no violence. She pushes Thomas back into the hallway as if he were “a mannequin on wheels” & calls the police. Thomas is arrested & arraigned before a magistrate on 30 Nov 1910. He appears to be in a trance & does not respond nor seem to understand words. It is believed at first he is under the influence of narcotics.

But upon examination of the well-dressed man in his 30s, he is found to be in possession of 1,600 shares of Gates Coal & Coke Co., worth \$30,000 – Masonic credentials – a letter from Anna Bowman of S. Linden Ave., Pittsburgh PA - a Monongahela National Bank book which shows large deposits & a \$55 withdrawal. The magistrate orders Thomas to be taken to Bellevue, New York’s psychiatric hospital.

The only statements he makes is that his head aches.

Anna Bowman, the letter writer, is contacted and identifies Thomas, reporting he had done much work on the properties she owned in the Monongahela Valley.

He remains in a trance for several days & newspapers say he has aphasia – “loss of ability to understand or express speech, caused by brain damage.” Thomas later claims he does not remember the arraignment but “comes to” in Bellevue.

There is no trace of the \$200 in cash he allegedly had on him, according to his partner, L.D. Mosener.

Newspaper accounts describe Thomas as one of the wealthiest businessmen in Brownsville PA and well-esteemed.

His father David and brother William come to New York to bring Thomas home to Freeport NY.

A year afterwards – on 23 May 1919 – the governor of PA submits the name of Thomas B. Young as a mine inspector.


