



FUND TO RAISE MONUMENT TO CITY WORLD WAR HERO

A ute to its first son to pay the supreme sacrifice in the World War, will soon rise over the grave of George Vincent Zimmerman, buried in Hackensack, N. J.

A native of New Rochelle, the late Mr. Zimmerman was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Zimmerman, of Odell Court Apartments.

Mr. Zimmerman was among the first to volunteer his services. He was assigned to Company F. Sixth Battalion, 20th Engineers. He lost his life enroute to France when a German "U" boat torpedoed the Tuscania off Scotland, Feb. 14. 1918.

MONUMENT, the City's trib- Star, one of the forerunners of The Standard-Star, sponsored a fund to erect a memorial in Mr. Zimmerman's memory, but no subscriptions were solicited, and the plan was discontinued to avoid conflict with the proposed World War Memorial.

> Voluntary subscriptions, however, poured in, and the money was deposited in the National City Bank by Robert L. Forbes, as treasurer, pending appropriate disposition, the amount (about \$300) being inadequate to meet the cost of a suitable monument.





Sisters in Dispute **Over Estate Expense** HACKENSACK - Judge A. Demorest Del Mar has reserved decision in a legal tilt between two sisters over the estate of their late uncle, John McHugh. When Mr. McHugh died in Hackensack in 1936, hp. Jeff his two Hackensack homes to the four daughters of his niece, Mrs. Margaret C. Gillen, of Hepworth Place, Garfield. His will named another niece, Mrs. Elizabeth Gottert, of Brooklyn, trustee of the estate. Margaret and Mary Gillen, two of the heirs, were the youngest of the four at that time and Mrs. Gottert, because she had no children of her own, volunteered to raise the children. The other two, Rochel and Clara, remained with their mother. For nearly seven years Mrs. Gottert had charge of the two girls. She is now asking the court, through her attorney, George F. Losche, to pay her for taking care of the children. She wants \$500 a year for each, a total of \$6,500. Mrs. Gillen, through her attorneys, Jack Rinzler and Peter N. Perretti, oppose the application, stating that she is not entitled to any funds and that it was not her duty, as trustee of the estate to care for the children.

In the 1870 census for Hackensack, Bergen NJ, Charles Zimmerman (5 DC) lived with his parents Christian Zimmerman (35 Prussia) & Eliza (30 Hesse) & siblings. After the death of his first wife, Rachel McHugh, who was the mother of his 4 children, he married Mary Loretta Marvel. According to his obituary, Carl is buried in Hackensack, Bergen Nj.

- Charles Zimmerman, 17 Jul 1890 Manhattan NY 21 Jul 1925 Brooklyn NY. Husband of Elizabeth Laijer, whom he married 21 Jun 1919 in Queens NY. Buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery & Mausoleum, Hackensack, Bergen NJ but not on Find A Grave as of 5 Sep 2023.
- Margaret Zimmerman Gillen, 6 Jun 1895 New Rochelle, Westchester NY 13 Sep 1983 Wood Ridge, Bergen NJ. Named as surviving sister Mrs. Gillen of Hackensack NJ in her brother Charles's Jul 1925 obituary. Wife of George Alfred Gillen, b. 21 Oct 1899 Arcola, Bergen NJ, died 15 Apr 1973 New Milford, Bergen NJ. In the 1940 census, George Gillen (40 NJ, painter, painting) lived with wife Margaret (43 NY). In the 1950 census for Garfield, Bergen NJ, Margaret Gillen, 55 NY, an elementary school teacher, lists herself as "separated." When her daughter Clare Gillen married Sgt. Joseph C. Mayer in Garfield, Bergen NJ, on 12 Jan 1952, her husband is not mentioned in the account of the wedding. Buried in George Washington Memorial Park, Paramus, Bergen NJ but not on Find A Grave as of 5 Sep 2023.
- Elizabeth R. Zimmerman Gottert, 4 Apr 1900 NY Apr 1987 NY. Named as Miss Elizabeth Zimmerman of New Rochelle NY in her brother Charles's 1925 obituary. Elizabeth R. Zimmerman married Joseph Gottert 28 Jun 1926 in Hackensack, Bergen NJ. In the 1950 census of Queens NY, Joseph A. Gottert (51 Germany, painter, painting construction) lived with wife Elizabeth R. (50 NY), a census enumerator for the US Department of Commerce, who filled out the census page that the couple is listed on.

Notes:

Records for this family are lacking on Find A Grave. It is likely that several are buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery & Mausoleum, Hackensack, Bergen NJ.

In November 1952, George's two sisters have a dispute being heard in court. When their uncle John McHugh died in Hackensack NJ in 1936, he left 2 houses to the 4 daughters of his niece (George's sister) Margaret Zimmerman Gillen. He named his other niece, Elizabeth Zimmerman Gottert of Brooklyn NY trustee of his estate.

Since Elizabeth had no children, she took the 2 younger girls – Margaret & Mary Gillen – and raised them for the next 7 years. The 2 older (Rochel & Clara Gillen) stayed with their mother, Margaret Gillen.

Then Elizabeth brought legal action to be paid \$6,500 for the care she had provided for the past 7 years to the two Gillen girls. Their mother, Margaret Gillen, said it was not her duty to raise them, in her role as trustee.
