Each year the industrial arts teachers pick some leader in industrial education to supply the main even's of their institute and this year Dean Bowman is it.

Dean Bowman will arrive at Flint early Monday morning and will be taken on a tour of the schools from 10 a. m. until 2 p. m. For most of the remainder of the afternoon he will attend the meeting of the Industrial arts teachers and will speak on "Present Trends of Industrial Education." Tuesday morning Dean Bowman will visit the industrial plants of Flint and at noon will meet with the principals of the schools of the city to discuss with them their problems in industrial education. Flint has 45 industrial arts teachers in its schools and a large share of these are graduates of the Stout institute. Leland H. Lamb, superintendent of the Flint schools, is also a graduate of Stout.

INTERVIEW WITH THE FUTURE

By Thomas Smalldon, 9th Grade
Garfield Junior High School

A week ago my mother, father and I went to the General Motors Personnel Department in Flint, Michigan, to have an interview with the Supervisor of Student Training, Mr. Harry A. Burnham.

A few months ago, I received a letter from Mr. Burnham asking me to come and have a talk with him. He knew I was interested in information on General Motors Institute Co-operative Engineering Program.

We arrived at Mr. Burnham's office at 9:45 a.m. and talked with him until 11:45 a.m. He gave me guidance and counseling regarding my next three years of high school. In order to qualify for General Motors Institute, one must maintain a B or better average throughout high school. College preparatory courses must be taken. He stressed taking a lot of mathematics, chemistry, physics, English and four semesters of a foreign language. In addition

to the subjects, he said that you must prove that you can be a leader by taking part in as many school activities as you have time for. He mentioned sports, class plays, student council, class offices, etc. He said outside activities were also weighed in admittance to G.M. He mentioned church work, Boy Scouts, YMCA and other

worthwhile activities that help to build character.

If I am to succeed in maintaining the necessary grades, I will take an examination at General Motors during my senior year in high school. After taking this exam, you must go before the Board of Review. The board tests you on leadership abilities, personality and every factor involved in becoming an engineer. Good grades alone will not make you acceptable at General Motors.

The total basic cost, including room and board, for a student is close to \$2,000 the first year. With the Co-operative Engineering Program, you go to school one month and work the next month in order to put your knowledge to practical use. While working, the student is paid and the annual income

amounts to approximately \$2,000 before taxes. In other words, you can earn while you learn. With the exception of your clothing and personal expenses, you can pay for your college education yourself.

After talking with Mr. Burnham, I know that I am going to have to work very hard to achieve the goal I have set for myself.

Pastor and Wife to Fete Golden Wedding, 50 Years in Ministry

Diamond Bluff, Wis., Couple
Served 37 Years in
State Churches

It was not always easy getting from one country church to another in the old days before automobiles or buses or trains whisked one about from place to place. But somehow or another they did it—these two young members of the clergy who were more than that since they were also husband and wife working side by side in their respective parishes.

And so, when Rev. and Mrs. William Woolley observe their golden wedding anniversary tomorrow at their home at Diamond Bluff, Wis., it will be more than a rejoicing because they spent a half century together. It also will mark a half-century as ministers.

They were young when they started their work. They are young still since Mr. Woolley is only 73 and his wife 71. Both were born in England and came to Canada in their youth, marrying at Toronto July 15, 1885, and working in the ministry there before coming to the United States.

For 37 years Mr. Woolley served in parishes of southern Minnesota as a member of the Minnesota Methodist Conference. Mrs. Woolley worked too, but not at first as a full-fledged minister, since it was not until 1916 that she received her ordination, the first woman in Minnesota licensed to preach in Methodist churches of the state.

The last work of the two "Reverends" was in parishes at Zumbrota and Goodhue, Minn. Eight years ago they retired from active service and have since made their home at Diamond Bluff.

To their union were born six children, five daughters and a son, three of whom are still living. Their daughters are Mrs. Charles Richardson, 4805 Drew avenue S., Minneapolis, and Mrs. Harry A. Burnham and Mrs. Leonard Simonson, both of Flint, Mich. There are five grandchildren—a son of Mrs. Richardson, and a son and daughter of each of the Michigan daughters.

Tomorrow former parishioners, children, grandchildren and the whole community of Diamond Bluff will meet to honor the "bride and

groom"—the "pastor and his wife." Among the 150 expected guests will be one, perhaps two, of the young people who "stood up" with them when they were married in Toronto so long ago.

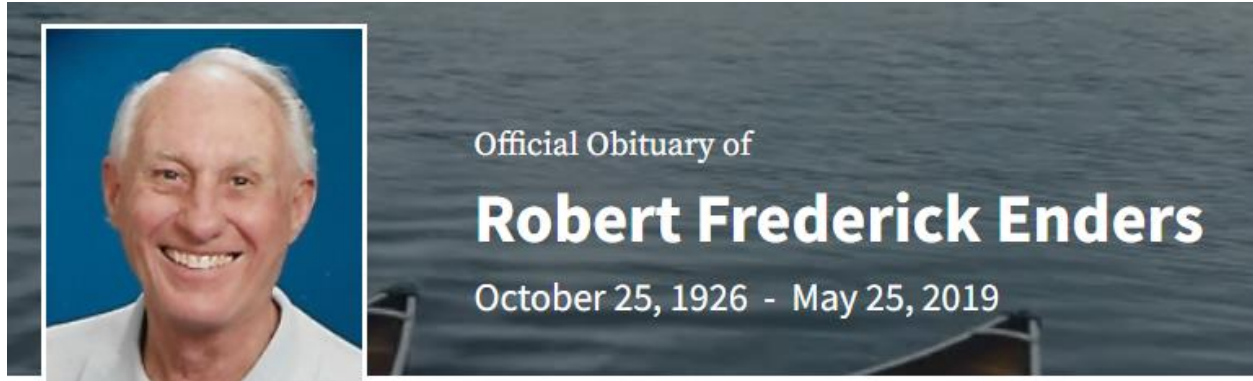

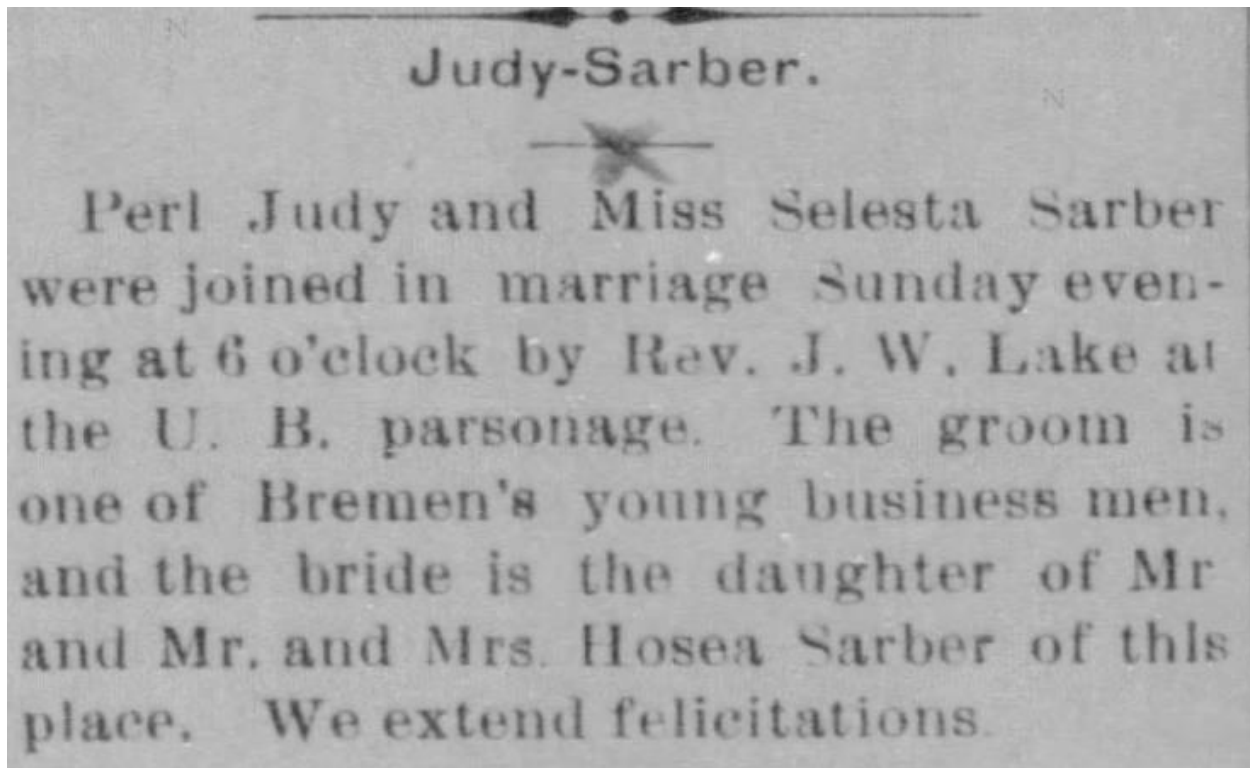

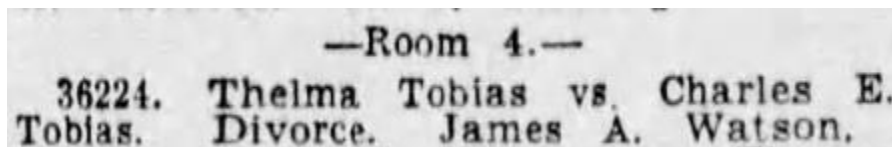

“Battle Creek (MI) Enquirer” 22 Apr 1934 p 2 – The meeting of the Michigan Industrial Education Society elected Harry Burnham of Flint MI its president. He was vice president the previous year. Harry is superintendent of industrial arts in Flint schools.

“Lansing (MI) State Journal” 21 Feb 1936 p 2 – serves on committee to write a booklet on safety education for all MI schools

“Detroit Free Press” 25 Nov 1938 p 15 – Harry is president of the Flint Housing Commission. He & another man turned down an offer, to be paid by the city council, to tour a Cleveland housing project as they would not learn anything.

“Detroit Free Press” 27 May 1942 p 3 – Harry Burnham, director of vocational education in the Flint schools, resigned 26 May to join the personnel department at AC Spark Plug Division of General Motors.

“Detroit Free Press” 28 Jul 1942 p 14 – “Harry Burnham to AC” – The AC Spark Plug Division of General Motors announces the addition of Harry Burnham to its industrial relations department to succeed John Goetz, now a 1st lieutenant in the Army. Harry was formerly the chief of the Industrial Arts Division of the Flint public schools & supervised the high school placement department & placed many former students in industrial positions at AC & met many AC workers who attended night school vocational training classes. He will speak on readjusting veterans to society. He is superintendent of industrial arts & director of placement at the Flint public schools.

“Port Huron (MI) Times Herald” 20 Mar 1958 p 17 – 9th-grader Thomas Smalldon, of Garfield Junior High School, wrote an article “Interview with the Future.” Smalldon went a week ago with his parents to interview Harry A. Burnham in the General Motors personnel department at Flint MI. Harry is the supervisor of student training. Smalldon had gotten a letter a few months ago from Harry, asking him to come talk with him, as Harry knew of Smalldon’s interest in the General Motors Institute Cooperative Engineering Program. In the 2-hour interview, Harry provided guidance & counseling for Smalldon’s next 3 years of high school. A “B” or better grade average is necessary to qualify for the program, as are

college preparatory classes (mathematics, chemistry, physics & 4 semesters of a foreign language). A student must prove leadership through school activities such as sports, plays, student council, class officer. All outside activities are considered, such as church work, Boy Scouts, YMCA, as grades alone do not qualify a student. In his senior year, Smalldon will take an examination at General Motors, then meet with a Board of Review. It costs \$2,000 a year to attend the program; a student attends school for 1 month & then works 1 month alternately. While working, the student is paid – about \$2,000 a year, so the only expense becomes clothing & personal items.
