\$15,000 Fire Destroys Bush Hotel in Monroe This Morning

**GUESTS FLEE TO
SAFETY-CLAD IN

Frank Buck Is Forced to

Snohomish Fire Depart-
ment Aids Monroe Men
in Fighting Blaze

MONROE, Feb. 7.—Starting in the lobby of the Bush hotel, also known as the Healy, third and Main streets, fire Saturday morning destroyed the building, including the hotel proper, a dressmaking establishment and the Farmer's market. The loss was placed at approximately \$15,000, \$13,000 of which was sustained by Mrs. A. H. Bush, owner and operator of the hotel. She had \$6000 insurance on the building, she stated. The market was said to have been insured for \$3000 and the dressmaking shop carried \$1000 insurance.

Six guests at the hotel were in bed when the blaze started about 9 o'clock. Mrs. Otto Nelson and George Brock lost their entire possessions in the blaze and Mrs. Bush escaped from the flames in her coat and night clothes. Frank Buck, trapped in his room by the fire, gained safety by jumping from his window, fourteen feet from the ground. He was uninjured.

Snohomish Sends Aid

Monroe has only a small truck as fire fighting equipment and an emergency call was sent to Snohomish. Fire Chief Edward Hinkley and five men made the trip, taking the Snohomish department's 750-gallon pumper. The call for help was received at 9:12 o'clock and the route was traveled in fast time. Within twenty minutes after the Snohomish fire fighters had added their strength to that of the Monroe department the blaze was under control.

Provides Barrier

Greater loss was undoubtedly prevented by the brick building adjoining the hotel and Farmers' market to the west. This building, occupied by Skagg's store, blocked the spread of the flames down the block and while it was slightly damaged by heat and smoke, its loss was negligible. The arrival of the Snohomish pumper is also believed to have saved a number of frame buildings across the street from the hotel.

The hotel was built in 1900 by W. R. and H. E. Pearsall, shortly after a fire had razed the entire block. It was a three-story frame

structure containing 28 rooms. The dress goods shop in the ground floor of the building was owned by Mrs. Henry Buss and the Farmers' market, on the other side of the lobby, by Al Nelmitz of Snohomish. Part of the fixtures of this store were saved.

A number of valuable oil paintings in the lobby of the hotel were burned. These were said by Mrs. Bush to have been worth approximately \$500. The fire was believed to have started near the stove, located in the lobby.

A \$15,000 fire destroyed the Bush Hotel in Monroe. Starting in the lobby of the Bush, also known as the Healy Hotel, at Third and Main, the

fire destroyed the hotel proper, a dressmaking shop and the Farmers' Market. Mrs. A.H. Bush, owner and operator of the hotel reported that six guests were in the hotel when the blaze started at 9 a.m. and escaped

with only the clothes on their back. As Monroe had only one small truck as fire fighting equipment, Snohomish Fire Department responded. Chief Edward Hinkley and five men made the trip taking the Snohomish 750 gallon pumper. Within twenty minutes after the Snohomish fire fighters had added their strength to the Monroe department the blaze was under control and kept from spreading to the next door Skaggs Grocery Store. The hotel was a three-story frame building, and had been built in 1900, shortly after a disastrous fire had raised the entire block.

HIRAM ELLSWORTH PEARSALL

Hiram Ellsworth Pearsall, 88, of Monroe died at the Monroe General Hospital Monday following an extended illness. Mr. Pearsall was born in Clinton County, Iowa, February 5, 1864 and had resided in Monroe and vicinity for the past sixty-seven years. He was a member of the Monroe Lodge No. 160

F&AM. Surviving are a son, William H. Pearsall of Monroe; four grandchildren, and eight great grandchildren. Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Masonic Temple in Monroe. Monroe Lodge No. 160 F&AM will be in charge of the services. Burial will be in the family plot in Monroe Memorial Park. The casket is open to friends at the funeral home of Purdy and Walters.

Monroe Pioneer, Hiram Pearsall, Succumbs Mon.

Hiram Ellsworth Pearsall, who came to Monroe in 1885 and was credited with playing a prominent part in the building of that community, died at Monroe General Hospital Monday following an extended illness. He was 88 years of age.

Born in Clinton County, Iowa, 1864, Mr. Pearsall came to Snohomish and on February 5, 1885, filed a claim for land northeast of Monroe. He located there and cleared approximately 20 acres of the property, which then was in virgin timber. He also worked in the woods as a logger and continued to develop and expand his farm until 1900, when he moved to Monroe to enter the contracting business. Mr. Pearsall erected a number of buildings there, including the Pearsall Hotel (later the Healy Hotel), one of the first in Monroe. In 1909 he constructed the Savoy Hotel, which he operated until the mid '20s. Another of the buildings he constructed was the one that housed the Monroe First National Bank.

Although he lived for a time in Everett, most of his years in this county were spent by Mr. Pearsall in Monroe, where he was residing at the time of his death. He was interested in the schools, giving an acre of ground for the establishment of the Woods Creek School. He served on the school board for a number of years.

A member of the survey crew that laid out the original townsite of Monroe in 1892, Mr. Pearsall also was one of the organizers of the Monroe volunteer fire department. He served as its treasurer for a number of years.

Surviving Mr. Pearsall are a son, William H. Pearsall of Monroe; four grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren. Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock at Monroe Masonic Temple, Monroe Lodge No. 160, F & AM, of which he was a member, in charge of the services. Burial will be in Monroe Memorial Park. The casket is open to friends at the funeral home of Purdy and Walters.

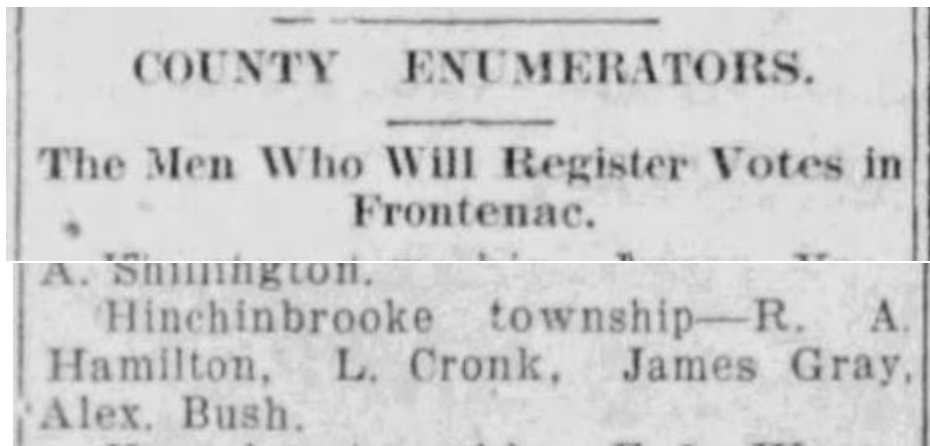

 Monroe, Snohomish WA, had numerous owners before Annie Healy. This was one of the
 first hotels in Monroe, built by Hiram Ellsworth Pearsall (5 Feb 1864 Clinton Co. IA – 17 Mar
 1952 Monroe, Snohomish WA, F: 74663114). Some newspaper references: C.C. Coope
 operated the Pearsall Hotel in Nov 1902, purchased 1 Dec 1904 by R.H. Rock who sold it in
 Feb/Mar 1906 to J.H. Stretch. Apparently purchased by J.B. Michens in Apr 1908, by
 Sheasley in Oct 1911, remodeled in Apr 1912 by S.A. Buck.
 It was then known as the Bush Hotel after her marriage. Its address was listed as 3rd &
 Main.
 On Alexander's 1938 naturalization statement, it appears he and "Anna Healy"
 (proprietress of a hotel) reside at the same address, 2616 First Ave., Seattle WA, although

of 7 Feb 1931. The final divorce decree appears in an Aug 1931 newspaper – was granted 22 Aug 1931 in Snohomish Co. WA.

Notes:

Oak Flats, where the family resided in Ontario, Canada, is described as a hamlet in Hinchinbrooke township, Frontenac County.

When his father died in Dec 1917, Alexander was listed in his obituary as a resident of California.

Wartime:

Lifeboat survivor, who landed on isle of Islay, Scotland on 5 Feb 1918. Reunited with other survivors at Port Ellen, Islay, as of 7 Feb 1918.

“Great Falls (MT) Tribune” 8 Feb 1918 p 2 – among those who arrived on the isle of Islay, Scotland, is Alexander M. [sic] Bush of the 20th Engineers.

Post-war:

Admitted to Orting State Soldiers' Home (Pierce Co. WA) on 10 Nov 1931 & 25 Mar 1933.

On the 5 Nov 1931 statement, his list of ailments is blurry – it appears he had varicose veins, bad teeth and a painful shoulder.

On the 25 Mar 1933 statement as Alex H. Bush, he was age 46, a resident of Pierce Co. WA. Height: 5' 10 ½". Born in Ontario, Canada. Resident of Washington since 1908. A logger, divorced 18 Feb 1931, having married 4 Sep 1923 in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. He had no children. His sister was Mrs. Robert McGregor, Enterprise, Ontario, Canada. He had enlisted once in the US military.

On 5 Nov 1931, Alexander H. Bush appeared in person before H.P. Monk, notary public. Age 45, 5' 10 ½", resident Monroe, Snohomish WA. Born 3 Feb ~~1884~~ 1887 [crossed off 1884]. Ontario, Canada. Lived in WA continuously about 23 years. Logger. Divorced – was married 4 Sep 1923 in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, by a minister & divorced 17 Feb 1931. No children. NOK his sister Mrs. Alma McGregory, Enterprise, Ontario, Canada. Enlisted once, served in World War, 7th Co., 20th Engineers. Discharged 11 Jun 1919 as private 1st class. Mustered out. Desires admission to state soldiers' home – has no personal property or real estate. Physical examination on 7 Nov 1931 – scrawled writing, appears to read that he has varicose veins, bad teeth, something about shoulders, failed eyesight. Son of Alexander Bush (b. Ontario, Canada) & Mary Ann Cameron (b. Ontario, Canada). Admission to home approved 10 Nov 1931.

On 25 Mar 1937, Alex H. Bush appeared in person before H.P. Monk, notary public. Age 46, 5' 10 ½", resident Pierce Co. WA. Born 3 Feb 1887, Ontario, Canada. Lived in WA since 1908. Logger. Divorced – was married 4 Sep 1923 in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, by a minister & divorced 18 Feb 1931. No children. NOK his sister Mrs. Robert McGregor, Enterprise, Ontario, Canada. Enlisted once, served in World War. Enlisted as private on 14 Dec 1917 at Fort George Wright WA, served in 17th Co. 20th Engineers. Discharged 11 Jun 1919, Camp Lewis WA, as part of demobilization. Desires admission to state soldiers'

home – has no personal property or real estate, cannot work due to disability & has no means of support. Has been a member of this home. Physical examination on 27 Mar 1933 – scrawled writing, appears to read that he has bad teeth, something wrong with left leg, rheumatism in shoulders, problem with eyesight. Son of Alexander Bush (b. Canada) & Mary Ann Cameron (b. Canada). Admission to home approved 28 Mar 1933. Attached form was sent to Adjutant General of the Army in Washington DC to confirm service of Alexander H. Bush, serial 250483, member of this soldiers' home, who claims served in Co. E, 6th Battalion, 20th Engineers from 14 Dec 1917 to 11 Jun 1919. Service verified. Honorable discharge. No record subsequent service. Form stamped 16 Nov 1931 [it appears this form was submitted for his first admission]

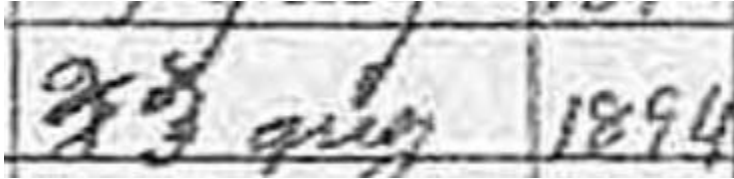
