Mr. Wallis, or "Uncle Ben" as he was known to Indiahoma residents, died at his home in Indiahoma at 1 p. m. Wednesday after suffering a paralytic stroke Monday evening. He was 68 years old.

Mrs. Wallis had lived on his farm 4½ miles northwest of Indiahoma until his retirement a few years ago. He was a member of the Church of Christ and Masonic Lodge No. 391 of Cache. The latter will have charge of the graveside services.

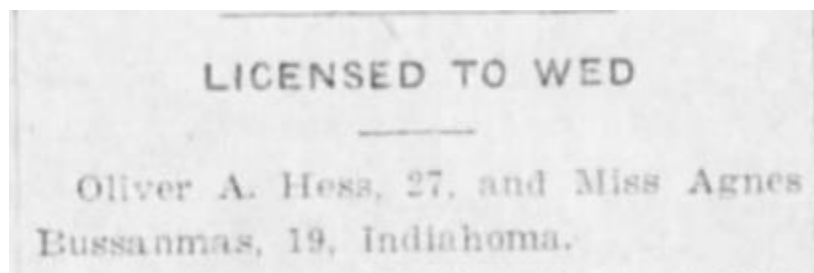

City, Federal Officers Push Probe Of Slaying

By GAYLORD SHAW

An intensive, almost around-the-clock investigation of the robbery-slaying of a Lawton taxi cab driver continued early this morning.

The body of Victor Harold Jones, 61, was found Thursday afternoon in his cab parked near a Fort Sill road. Authorities said the driver received at least two head wounds, apparently inflicted by a sharp instrument, and a belt was knotted around his neck.

City Detectives Kenneth Stradley, Carl Lindgren and Don Cunningham arrested two men Friday night in downtown Lawton but the tight-lipped investigators would not dis-

close if the arrests had any connection with the case.

One of the men, who gave his age as 24 and said he lived in a downtown hotel, was questioned late Friday night by city Detective Capt. Cleo Stout and a Federal Bureau of Investigation agent before being returned to city jail where he was held for investigation.

Taken To Fort Sill

The other, a 19-year-old Fort Sill soldier, was booked at city jail for investigation but later was turned to Fort Sill CID agents and transferred by military police to Fort Sill.

City officers and federal authorities said they were not at liberty to disclose what, if any, connection the two men had with the mysterious murder of the cab driver.

The FBI joined Friday with local and military officers in the investigation and unconfirmed but reliable sources said the probers had questioned several persons and that high-ranking Fort Sill authorities were lending full support to the investigation.

In 2700 Area

Jones was found slumped in the front seat of his privately-owned 1961 Plymouth taxi about 2 p.m. Thursday by a fellow cab driver, Leo Rogers.

Sill authorities said the victim's empty wallet was found on the

taxi floor and that his pockets had been turned inside out. The taxi was parked alongside Pittman street south of Packard in the post's 2700 area. Bachelor officer quarters surround the scene.

Officers said an autopsy is being held to determine exact cause of death.

Well known among local sportsmen, Jones worked for Ralph Hennessee at the Lake Lawtonka Schoolhouse Slough for many years. He had operated a cab since June, 1961.

Born at Toronto, Kan., July 13, 1900, Jones moved to Indianahoma with his parents in 1901 and the family established a homestead two miles west of Indianahoma.

Lived At Indianhoma

Jones worked as a barber in Indianhoma, and was high school band instructor there for six years before moving to Lawton in 1944.

He was married to Marie Busmanmas April 23, 1923, at Hobart, and lived at Fort Sill Indian school where his wife is a matron.

Surviving besides the wife are a daughter, Mrs. Raymond Sleeker, Duncan; a foster son, Victor McCarthy, of the home; the father, F. C. Jones, Oklahoma City; two brothers, Leo Jones, Santa Rosa, Tex., and Bill Jones, Indianhoma; four sisters, Mrs. E. L. Delaney, Oklahoma City; Mrs. Juanita Hansen, Oklahoma City; Mrs. H. E. Young, Westport, Conn., and Mrs. Maurice Hudson, La Feria, Tex.; seven grandchildren and one great-grandson.

Anna Bussanmass was born in Marcus, Iowa, Dec. 28, 1884, and was married to Henry Burdick at Newkirk, Okla., Oct. 2, 1900. To this union were born three children, Henry, Arthur and Rena, who with the husband survive her.

The deceased had come to Oklahoma at the opening of the strip and settled near Newkirk where she was married to Mr. Burdick. After four years there they moved to Ponca City and six years later came to the farm eight miles northwest of Wayonka where her death occurred last Sunday.

Deceased was identified with the Catholic church, and that "she was a good woman" is the tribute to her life as given by those who knew her best.
