The problem of marketing marsh land products will be easily overcome after some uniform product is found that is produced in a large enough quantity to be marketed profitably, according to Theodore Macklin, professor of agricultural economics, who addressed the last meeting of the Wisconsin State Drainage association yesterday afternoon.

L. S. Keely, past president of the association, explained why drainage operations have been slow to develop in this state. Nels Holman problems of the open ditch and discussed the relative merits and large tile methods of drainage.

Pres. F. W. Lucas, Madison, took charge of the business meeting at which the election of officers was held. Heads for the ensuing year are:

A resolution was passed stating that this association is strongly in favor of holding an economic and land survey of the state by counties to determine what type of industry each county is best suited for.

Mr. Macklin said that the greatest need of the Wisconsin marsh lands today is a closer settlement of farmers who are willing to cooperate in putting forth a uniform product that can be marketed on a large and profitable scale.

Edward Kramer Dies at Age 76

Edward Kramer, 76, of 1430 Williamson St., was declared dead on arrival Sunday at a local hospital after being stricken with an apparent heart attack at home. Born in Wisconsin in 1893, he had been a Madison resident about 30 years.
