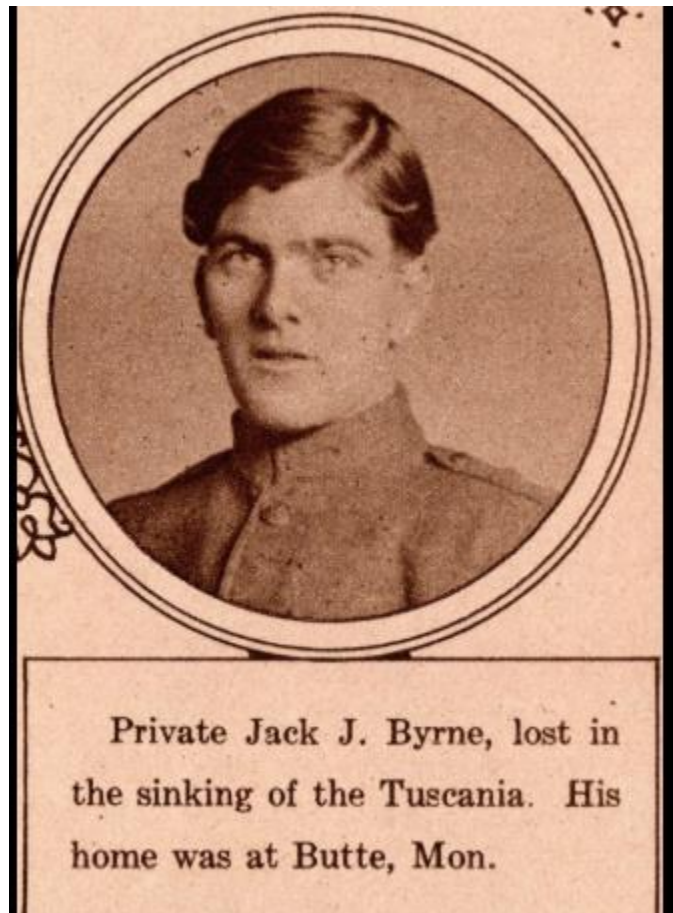

His father was born in Ireland about 20 miles from the spot where the boy is thought to have lost his life.

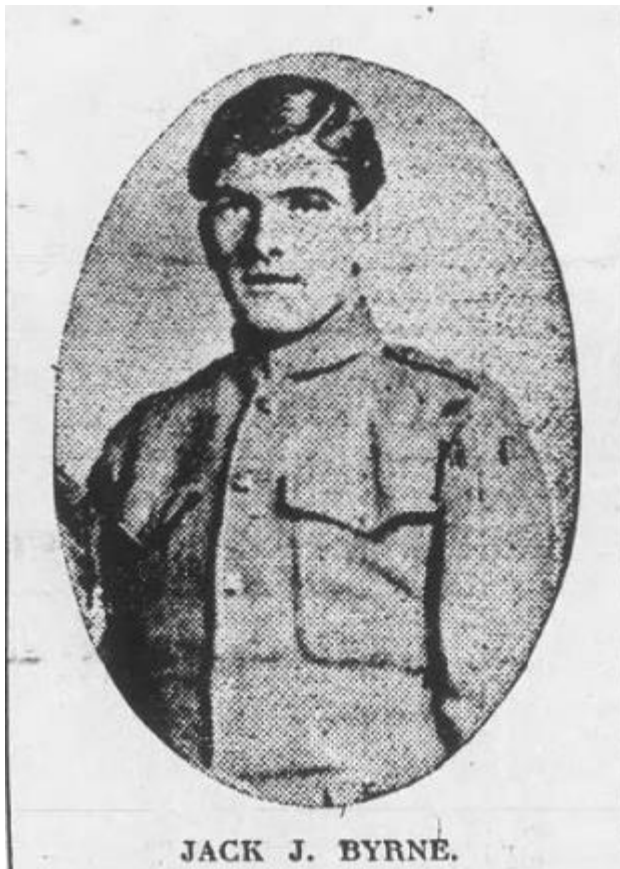
Both the father and mother of the missing lad are dead and for a number of years Byrne has made his home with an aunt, Mrs. A. Byrne. He has a brother, Thomas Byrne, residing in Spokane, and a sister, Katheryn Byrne, living at 416 East Mercury street, Butte.

Byrne left Butte with the fourth contingent on Nov. 6 and was known to have been in Washington, D. C., some time before sailing. He was very popular with the younger men on the east side and at the time of leaving here was employed as a miner at the Pennsylvania. When the East Side Athletic club was flourishing Byrne was one of its most enthusiastic supporters and was a prominent member of the football eleven. He was also an ardent follower of the indoor sports and represented the club in various branches. He passed a high physical examination. His mother died when he was very young and his father passed away a few years ago.

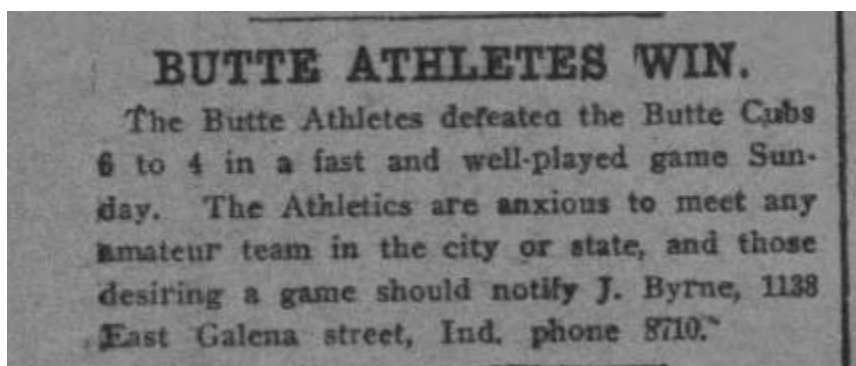

MAJORITY GET PAST DOCTORS

**Physical Examination of Those
Called for Butte's Fourth
Quota Shows Splendid Crowd
of Men in Line.**

The city examining board yesterday started the physical examination of the men needed to make up Butte's full quota on the first call. The new call, the fourth, is for 1,718 men, bringing the total to date to an even 4,500 men who have been asked to respond to the call to the colors. The latest reports from the Butte contingent which left here Sunday, shows a total roll call of 243 men, although some missed the train, others were picked up along the line, it is presumed, and leaving Butte possibly 50 short in the latest quota. All those who were supposed to go and who do not show up at American lake will be classed as deserters.

Yesterday 272 men went through the physical examination which will last for three days more. Out of this number 214 were passed and 48 rejected. This is the biggest percentage in favor of good soldiers that has been recorded in a single day since the selective draft became effective.

It was announced yesterday that all men filing claims for exemption on the ground that they are aliens must furnish at least two affidavits other than that signed by the person signing the original form of affidavit. In other words, the local board will insist on ample and proper proof from all aliens who seek exemption after having passed the physical examination.

Telegrams received at the city hall yesterday by Mayor W. H. Maloney, City Clerk Charles Treacy and others of the exemption board, from E. P. Kelly, one of those in charge of the Butte contingent which left Sunday, reported 423 men on the train, all in fine condition and disappointing to Spokane."

It is reasonable to believe now, the local board states, that Butte will be able to wind up its quota out of the 1,718 called this time. The city board is shy but about 15 per cent. of the men needed to complete the quota, but it is believed this number will be easily made up.

The men examined yesterday were a fine lot and the percentage of those passed tells the story in figures more definitely than words can express.

Nine Montana Men Are Known to Have Been Aboard the Tuscania; Fate In Doubt

JACK BYRNE MAKES FOURTH BUTTE SOLDIER KNOWN TO BE ON SHIP

Casualty List Remains at 113 Troops and 97
Members of Crew; Great Military Funerals
Planned by Great Britain and United States;
London Sees America's Efforts Spurred.

THE number of casualties in the sinking of the British liner Tuscania while serving as an American transport remained at 210 persons, according to the latest advices of the war department today. One hundred and thirteen of these were American soldiers.

The presence of a number of Montana men aboard the vessel has been definitely established. Four were from Butte. So far as is known all were members of the Twentieth Engineers. Their fate is still in doubt.

Casualties will not be officially announced until all the names of the survivors have been received in this country and checked against the passenger list.

At least four Butte men and five from other parts of the state were aboard the ill-fated Tuscania, torpedoed Tuesday evening off the north of Ireland coast.

This morning the name of Jack J. Byrne of 138 East Galena street, Butte, was added to the list of local boys.

Mr. Byrne is a young man of 22, born in Butte and employed until Nov. 1 at the Pennsylvania mine. His father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. James Byrne, are dead and the young man made his home with Mrs. A. Byrne, a relative, at 1138 East Galena street. He left Butte with the drafted contingent on Nov. 6. He belonged to Company 1 of the Twentieth engineers.

The other Butte men practically definitely known to have been on the Tuscania are:

Willard Cotton Hall of 927 West Granite street.

R. C. Richardson, formerly employed with the Slemons & Booth Co.

David Hudtloff of 1028 West Porphyry street, formerly with the Butte Water company as inspector.

Mr. Hall, who lived at 725 West Granite street, is nephew of Mrs. Levi S. Wild and Mrs. Bryan Irvin. Richardson left Butte last August, visited his old home in Hancock, Mich., and there enlisted. Mr. Hudtloff, who served in the Spanish-American war, qualified for second lieutenant at the officers' camp at Presidio.

LIST OF MISSING FROM TORPEDOED TRANSPORT CONTAINS NAMES OF MONTANA SOLDIERS

Jack Byrne and John Edwards of Butte and Chauncey J. Davidson of Anaconda Are Among Those Not Included as Survivors of the Tuscania so Far as Records Have Been Compiled. Not All Names Have Been Received and Some of Those Now Missing May Be Among the Saved

BUTTE SOLDIERS AMONG MISSING

Two Who May Have Been Lost
Entered Service in No-
vember.

Jack J. Byrne, 1138 East Galena street, and John Edwards, 1629 South Gaylord street, who were in the draft contingent from Butte that left for Camp Lewis with the last regular contingent in November, were reported among those unaccounted for in the list of missing of the Tuscania disaster sent out by the Associated Press last night.

Byrne was 22 years old and was born in Butte. He lived here all his life, attending the public schools. Several years ago his parents died, and since that time he had lived with his aunt, Mrs. A. Byrne. Thomas Byrne, a brother, and Catherine Byrne, a sister, reside in Butte with their aunt.

HAD HEARD NO WORD, BUT HADN'T GIVEN UP HOPE OF GOOD NEWS

"It's sure that he is gone, is it? I hadn't heard a word, but I hadn't given up hope," said Mrs. A. Byrne, aunt of Jack J. Byrne, when she learned positively through a representative of the Post that her nephew was one of the victims when the Tuscania went down. Byrne's parents are both dead and for a number of years he had been making his home with his aunt at 1138 East Galena street. Byrne has a sister in Butte, Miss Katheryn Byrne, but she could not be located this afternoon.

"It's news that I had to receive and I shall try to make the very best of it," said Mrs. Byrne as she bravely fought the tears back as they started to blur her eyes. "Poor Jack, he was such a good boy and everybody liked him. He was always lighthearted and when he

went away he went with a smile on his face and with the promise that he would always do his very best, no matter what his fate. He was proud to be a soldier and I know that he met death bravely."

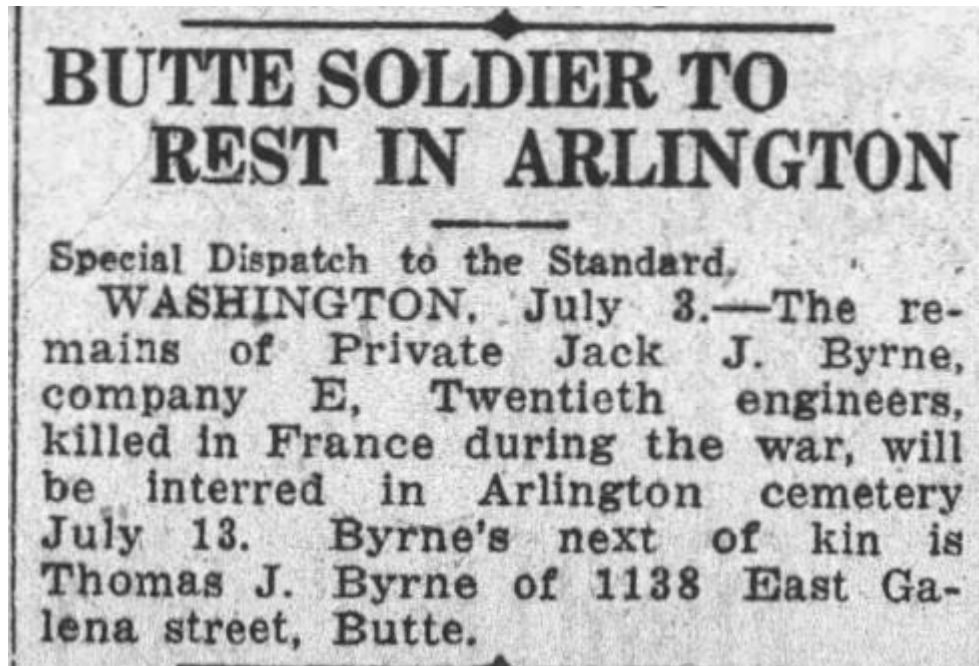
Jack Byrne Will Be Buried With the Nation's Heroes.

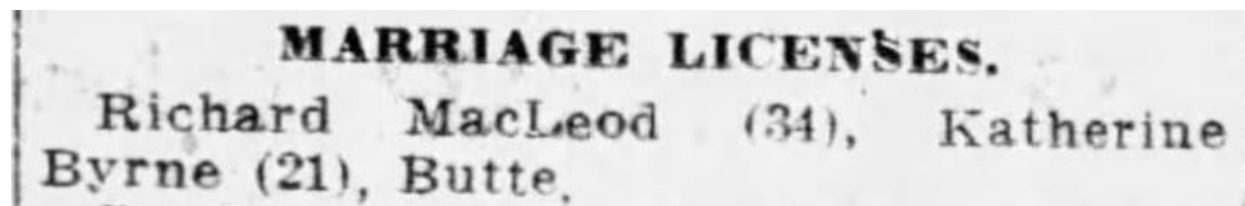

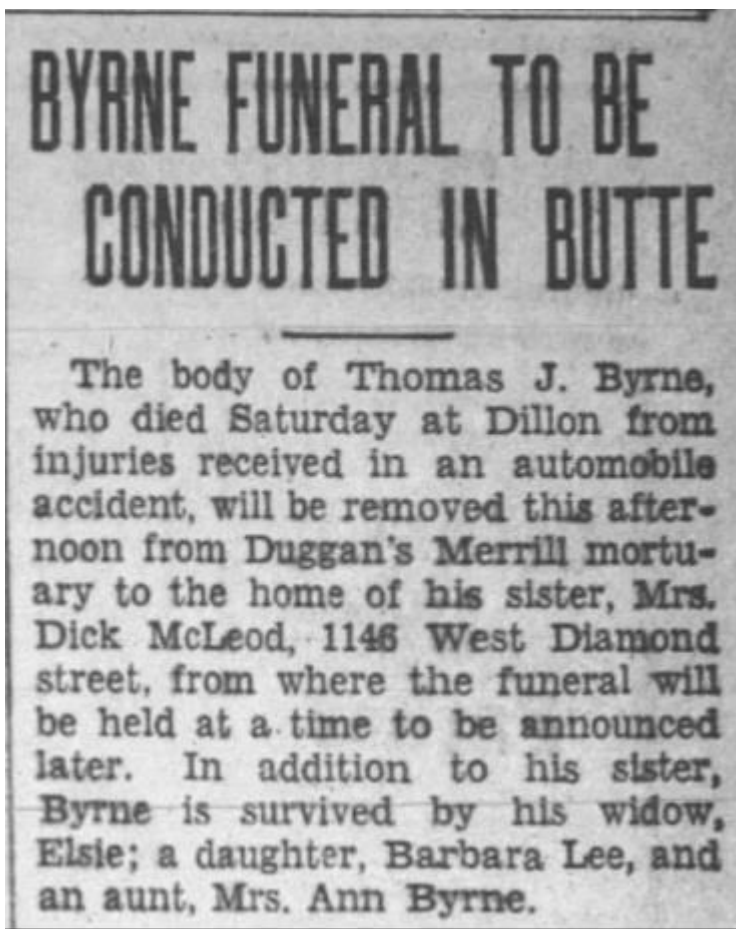

VICTIM OF AUTO CRASH SUCCUMBS

**Thomas Byrne Dies Saturday
Evening of Injuries
Sustained in Wreck.**

Thomas J. Byrne, who was critically injured on Tuesday night of last week when his car plunged from the state highway near Lavon, died at the Barrett hospital late Saturday afternoon, having never fully regained consciousness since the accident.

He was 37 years of age and was well-known in this city where he had made his home for a number of years. His wife, a young daughter, and two sisters survive. Paul Schwab, who was with him at the time, is recovering from injuries received in the crash.

The funeral was held Tuesday morning in Butte, requiem high mass being celebrated at Immaculate Conception Catholic church, and interment being made in St. Patrick's cemetery.

The accident was one of the worst since the highway was constructed, the impact of the car tearing away eight of the guard rail posts before plunging 50 yards down an embankment and partially on the railroad which parallels the road at this point. Schwab managed to crawl to the highway where he attracted the attention of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Hoerning, who were returning from Butte. Byrne had been thrown clear of the wrecked car and it was with some difficulty that he was finally found, lying among some large boulders.

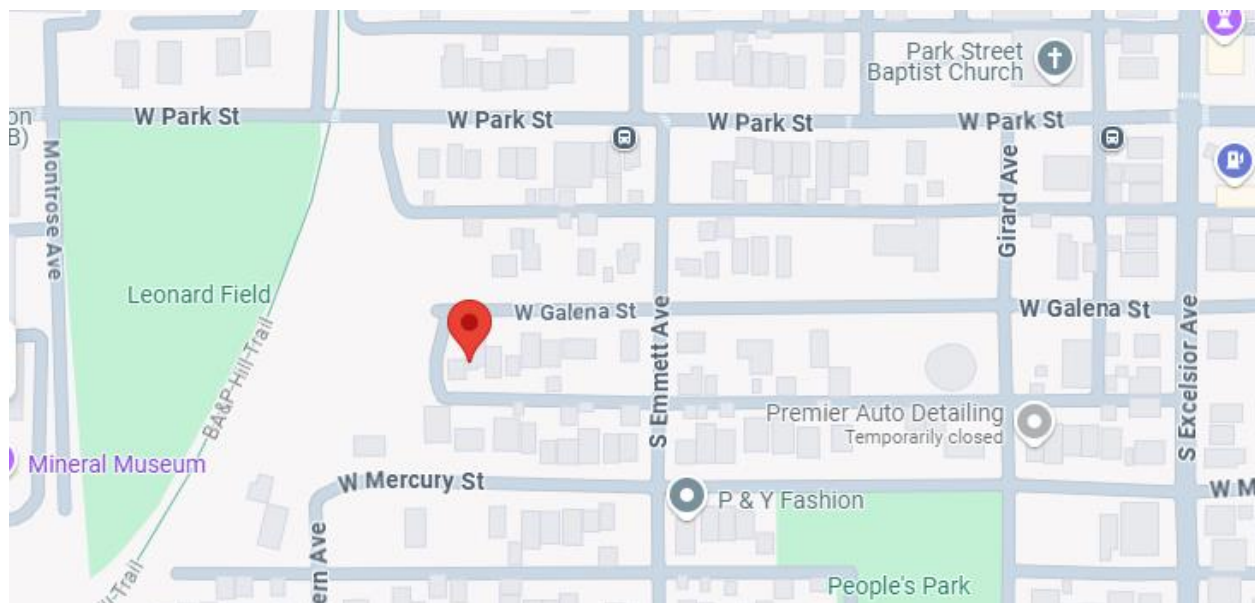

Notes:

There is an abundance of men named James Byrne in Butte MT, complicating the search for Jack's parents. His mother is dead by the 1910 census; his father is dead by the time he goes to war in 1918.

1899 Butte MT city directory lists James Byrne, miner, residing at 322 E. Summit, Dublin Gulch. The 1900 census lists the family at 314 E. Summit.

1910 Butte MT city directory lists a James J. Byrne, miner, residing at 113 W. Boardman. The 1910 census lists the family at 114 W. Boardman. There is an Anna Boardman, renting furnished rooms, at 130 W. Cooper – who may be the aunt “Mrs. A Boardman” mentioned in 1918 newspapers. Dennis “Burne” married Annie Grout.

Newspaper accounts indicate he had been active pre-war in the East Side Athletic Club in Butte MT. His parents, Mr. & Mrs. James Byrne, were dead, with his mother dying first. He lived with relatives at 1138 E. Galena in Butte MT. Jack left Butte on 6 November. His father was born in Ireland about 20 miles from the spot where Jack died.

He & John Edwards are missing in action. Jack was 22, born in Butte, lived here all his life, attending the public schools here. Several years ago his parents died. He has lived with his aunt, Mrs. A. Byrne. His brother Thomas Byrne & sister Catherine Byrne live in Butte with their aunt.

His aunt, Ann Byrne, appears to have the maiden name Hurley. She was born 1863 Ireland & died 22 Sep 1946 Butte, Silver Bow MT. She is buried in St. Patrick’s Cemetery, Butte, Silver Bow MT. F: 157572322. Therefore, it may be that it is her husband, Richard Byrne, who was the paternal uncle of Kate, Jack & Thomas.

“Anaconda Standard” 14 Feb 1918 p 9 – John Byrne of Butte was buried in Scotland, according to an Associated Press cable received 13 Feb 1918

“Butte (MT) Miner” 26 Apr 1918 p 10 – benefit smoker at the Broadway tonight sponsored by members of the Bob Cat, Silver Bow & East Side athletic clubs, featuring boxing bouts. The proceeds will be used to buy “smokes” for those in military service. The profits that go

to the East Side Athletic Club will go to the Byrne & Edwards memorial fund. Both were lost on the Tuscania; both were members of the East Side club.

There are several men named James Byrne in Butte MT. Jack's father James was dead and his brother was not named James. This article (and other copies of it) is in error. "Butte [MT] Miner" 2 Mar 1918 p 8 -Mrs. James Byrne of Butte applied to state draft board to exempt her son James from the draft, as her other son, John J., died on Tuscania.

"Anaconda Standard" 10 Apr 1928 p 3 – The MT State Highway Commission gets the title to land for the new Butte-to-Meaderville road through the condemnation of property. Three defendants were Kate Byrne McLeod, Richard McLeod & Thomas Byrne.

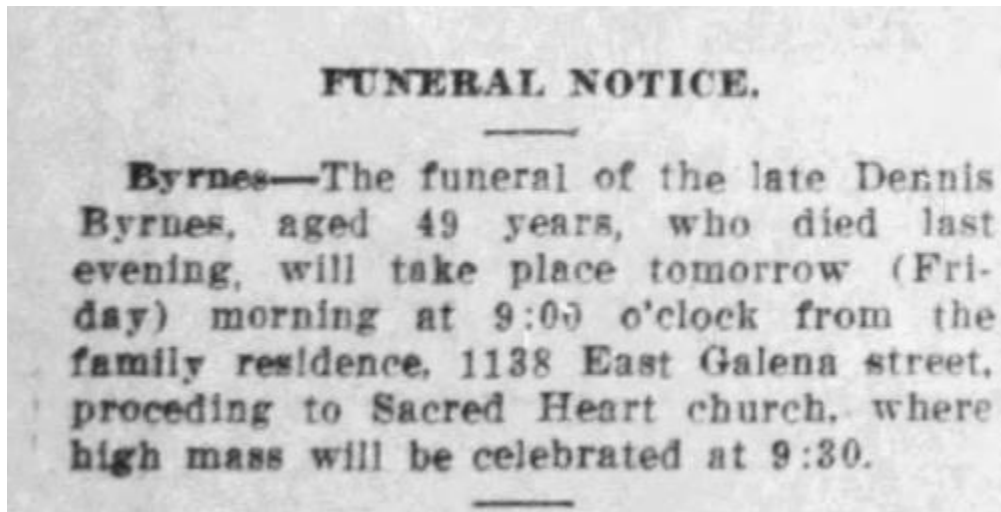

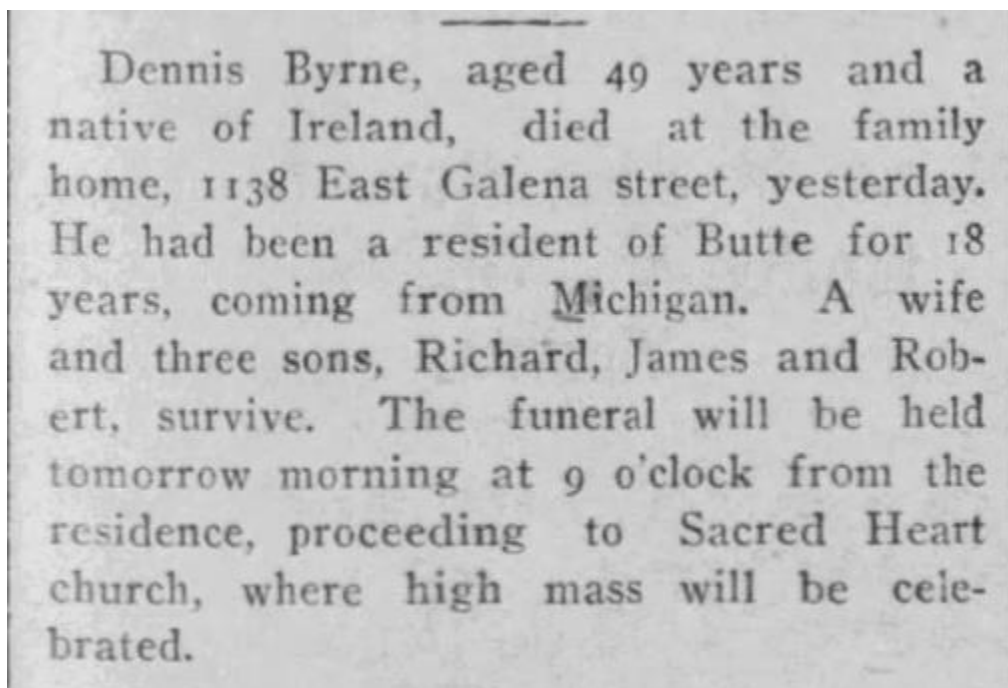
