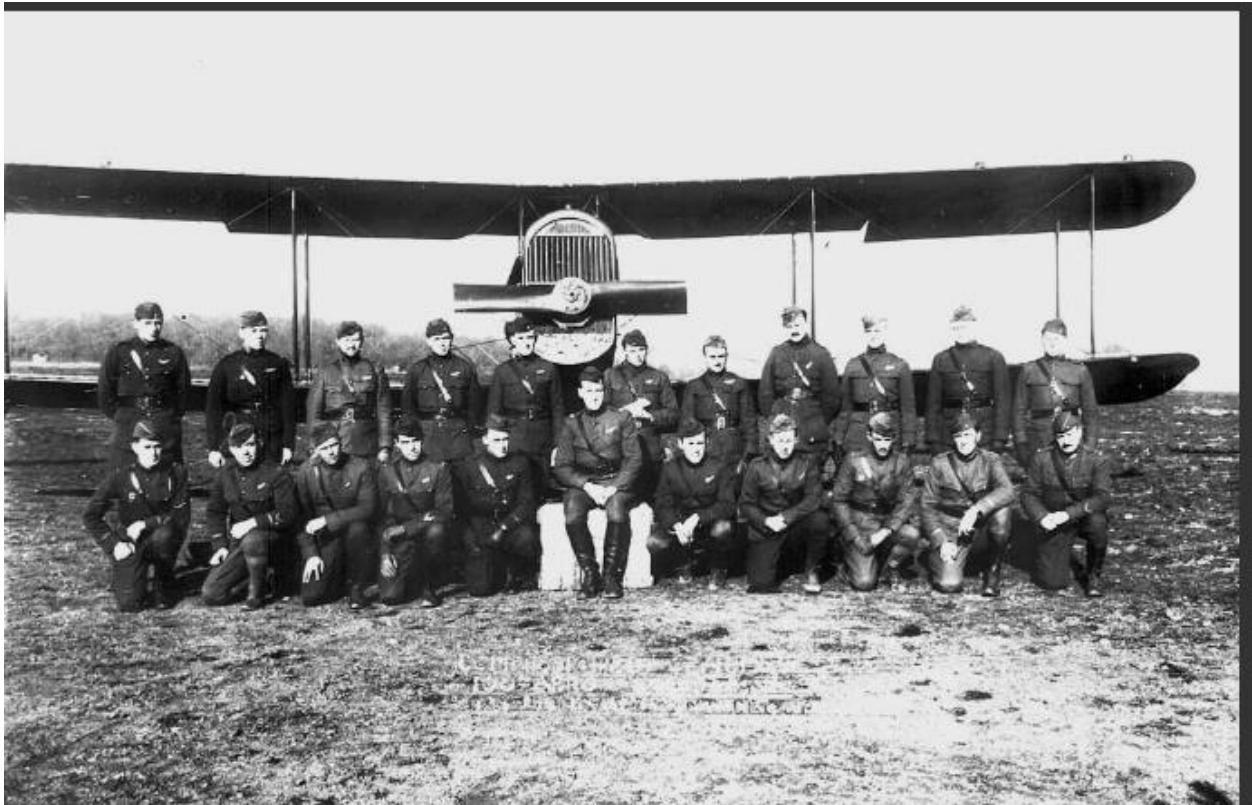

HISTORY OF CASE (supposed facts to be proven at inquest):

Deceased aged 63 lived with his wife at 2026 - 23rd Avenue and has been under treatment by Dr. Frank Shea for an asthmatic condition, but Dr. Shea has not seen deceased for over six months. On 4-20-52 deceased arose about 10:00 AM complaining of nausea but improved during the day. About 7:00 PM same day, deceased went to bathroom and was heard to collapse by his wife Alyce who went to the deceased's aid and found him in a sitting position on the floor. After making deceased as comfortable as possible, the deceased's wife called Dr. John Kistler, who responded and pronounced death at 7:15 PM, 4-20-52.

There is no history of recent medical attention and none for any cardiac condition. On being contacted by the family, Dr. Frank Shea was unable to give a diagnosis as to the cause of death and referred case to this office.

Examination of the deceased showed no external trauma. Nothing about the premises to indicate other than a natural death.

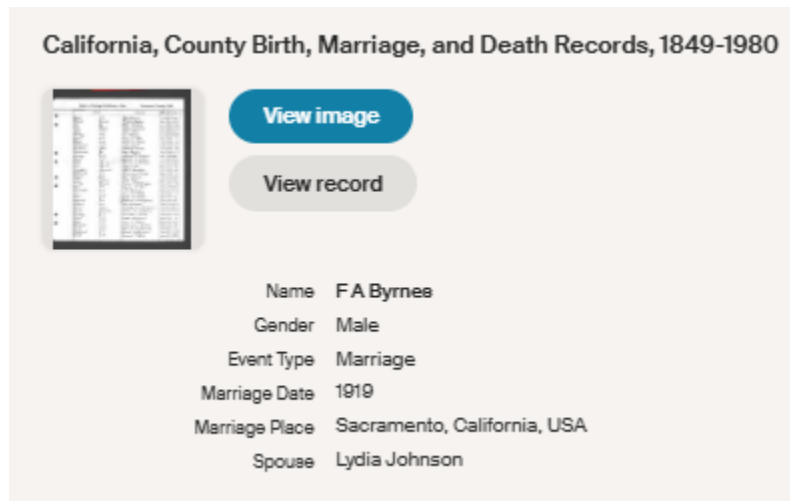

She made the statement after read-

ing a report from Chicago, where the American Association of Cosmeticians and Hair Artists has been in progress.

"No curls, no bangs and no wind-blown bobs may not be in style, but all three will be seen in Sacramento as long as they are becoming to individuals," Miss Hutson said.

HONOLULU SAFE PLACE FOR AMERICAN WOMEN

American women are as safe in Honolulu as they are in Sacramento as long as they behave themselves, according to Miss Lorraine Gideon, who returned yesterday morning with Miss Alyse Hutson following almost six months spent in the Hawaiian Islands.

The two Sacramento girls left for the island territory last April, obtained employment there as beauty operators, and established themselves in a Honolulu apartment for their five and one-half months' stay.

Feeling Ran High

They arrived during the excitement of the Massie case, and although they, as newly arrived American women, were asked for opinions, did not dare express themselves because of the feeling which ran high at the time, according to Miss Gideon.

The Sacramento girl decried accounts circulated that white women were not even able to venture into the streets alone without protection. She said: "Many of the stories received here were greatly exaggerated. We had no fear of going about alone

in Honolulu at the time. Of course, we did not venture far at night unescorted, just as we wouldn't in Sacramento."

In regard to the case involving Mrs. Massie and Mrs. Fortescue, she said: "When Mrs. Massie wandered from the Ala Wai tearoom at midnight, she walked down a road that was neither lighted nor paved and was hedged by abundant shrubbery. It was a road on which I would be afraid to walk in the day time."

Hawaiian Beach Boys

In answer to a query concerning the Hawaiian beach boys, Miss Gideon said: "The beach boys are courteous just as any of the other natives. It's the fashionable thing for wealthy and idle women visitors to spend their time with them. But if the women get into trouble, it's their own fault, in my opinion."

Miss Gideon was of the opinion that tourist trade and commerce has not been harmed by the sensational case as much as is believed. The decline in vacationists she attributes to the business depression to a great extent.

Andrew Byrnes, a Commission Man, Commits Suicide.

Andrew Byrnes, an old commission man, committed suicide Monday night by hanging himself to the rafters of a woodshed at the rear of his home, 532 Logan avenue N. The body was found yesterday morning.

Byrnes had several times threatened to commit suicide, but it was not believed that he would do so. An investigation showed that Byrnes had great difficulty in accomplishing his design. He had drawn his feet up from the floor and allowed himself to be choked to death. A stump of a cigar was found between his teeth. Byrnes was a candidate for the nomination of alderman for the fourth ward four years ago, and took his defeat greatly to heart. He was a member of the Royal Arcanum, and his wife will receive \$3,000 insurance. The funeral will be held at 10 o'clock to-morrow morning from the residence.

HIS THREAT**

Andrew J. Byrnes Commits Suicide Rather Than Battle With the World.

**Tried to Break Into Politics,
Took to Drink, Then Hang-
ed Himself.**

Andrew Byrnes, an old commission man, made good Monday night a standing threat that he would commit suicide, and was found hanging in a woodshed back of his poor home, 532 Logan avenue north, at 5 o'clock yesterday morning.

Byrnes was 40 years old, was married, and had four children, ranging in ages from four to ten years. He began drinking heavily a year ago, and since then has been out of work much of the time and despondent, especially when in liquor.

HAD MADE THREATS.

Several times he has made threats of suicide. Yesterday an old woman living in the rooms over those in the basement occupied by the Byrnes family found the remains of Byrnes hanging to a rafter in the woodshed. He had made a failure of a slip noose and the rope had let him down so far that in order to accomplish his purpose he had been compelled to draw his feet up from the floor.

He had stuck grimly to his work, however, and was found choked to death, with the stump of a cigar between his teeth.

An attempt to become a politician seems to have been the primal cause which led to Byrnes' death. He was a candidate for alderman on the Fourth ward democratic ticket against Alderman Merrill four years ago, and was defeated. He took the defeat very much to heart, and immediately afterward began to drink to excess. He was conducting a commission business at 212 North Sixth street, but in three months after election he found it necessary to make an assignment for the benefit of his creditors. All he saved out of the wreck was his home where he ended his life.

Byrnes was a member of Cataract Council Royal Arcanum, and his wife will consequently receive \$3,996 from that organization.

The funeral will take place Thursday morning at 10 o'clock, from the residence, under the auspices of Cataract Council. All members are requested to attend.

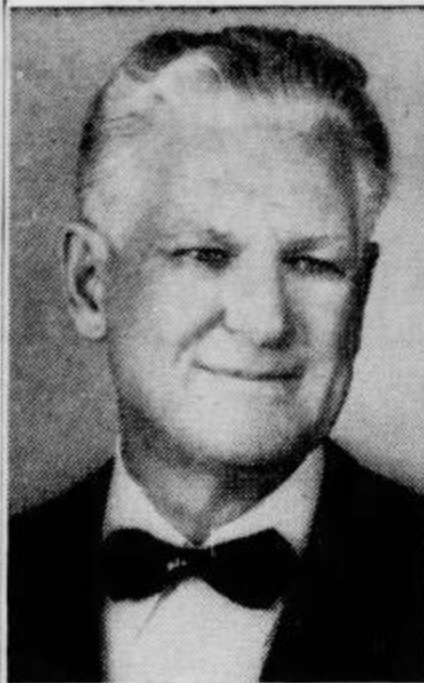

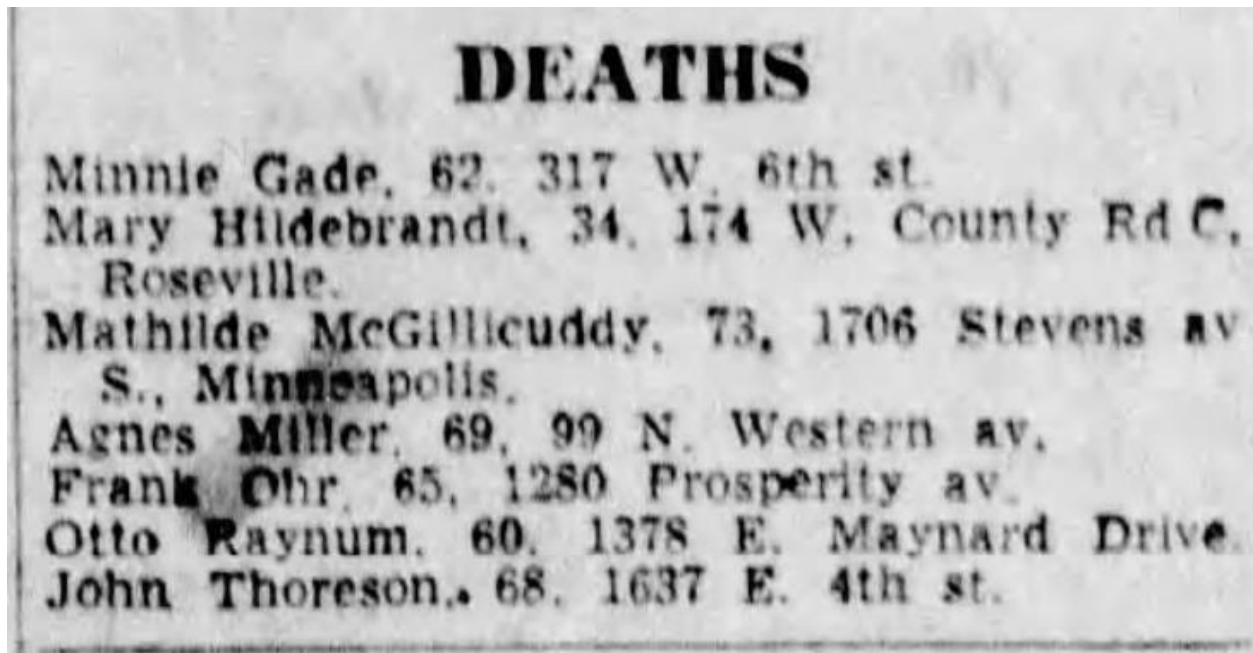

“Minneapolis Star-Tribune” 8 May 1901 p 7 – “Carried Out His Threat” – “Tried to Break Into Politics, Took to Drink, Then Hanged Himself” - Andrew committed suicide rather than battle with the world. He was an “old commission man” who “made good Monday night [6 May] a standing threat that he would commit suicide, and was founding hanging in a woodshed back of his poor home, 532 Logan avenue north, at 5 o’clock yesterday. He was 40 years old, married, with 4 children ages 4 to 10. He began drinking heavily a year ago & since then was out of work much of the time “and despondent, especially when in liquor.” He has issued the suicide threat several times & yesterday an old woman who is living in the rooms above the basement occupied by the Byrnes family found Andrew hanging from the rafters in the woodshed. He had failed to make a slip noose well, and so the rope let him down too far. He had to draw his feet up from the floor in order to die. A stump of a cigar was between his teeth.

Andrew had been a candidate for alderman in the 4th Ward of Minneapolis on the Democratic ticket 4 years ago but was defeated. He was conducting a commission business at 212 N. 6th St. but in the 3 months after the election he found it necessary to make assignment for his creditors. “All he saved out of the wreck was his home where he ended his life.” He was a member of Cataract Council Royal Arcanum [a long-standing insurance company] so his wife will receive \$3,000. The funeral on 9 May from his residence, under the auspices of the Cataract Council.

“Irish Standard” (Minneapolis MN) Sat., 11 May 1901, p 5 – tragic suicide of Andrew Byrnes at his home, 532 Logan Ave. N., last Monday night was a shock to his hundreds of friends. He was at one time a leading commission man in the city. His death must have been due to temporary insanity. He leaves a widow & several children. The funeral from the family home was “largely attended.” Interment in St. Mary’s cemetery. He carried \$3,000 insurance in Royal Arcanum.
