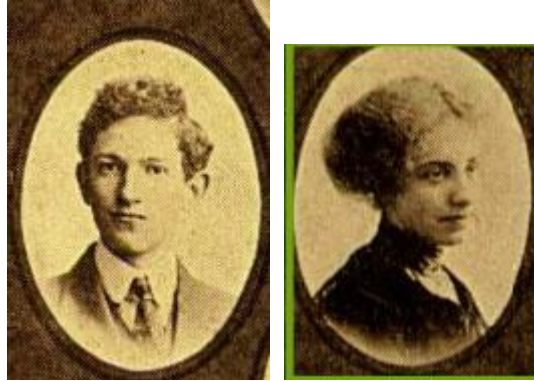

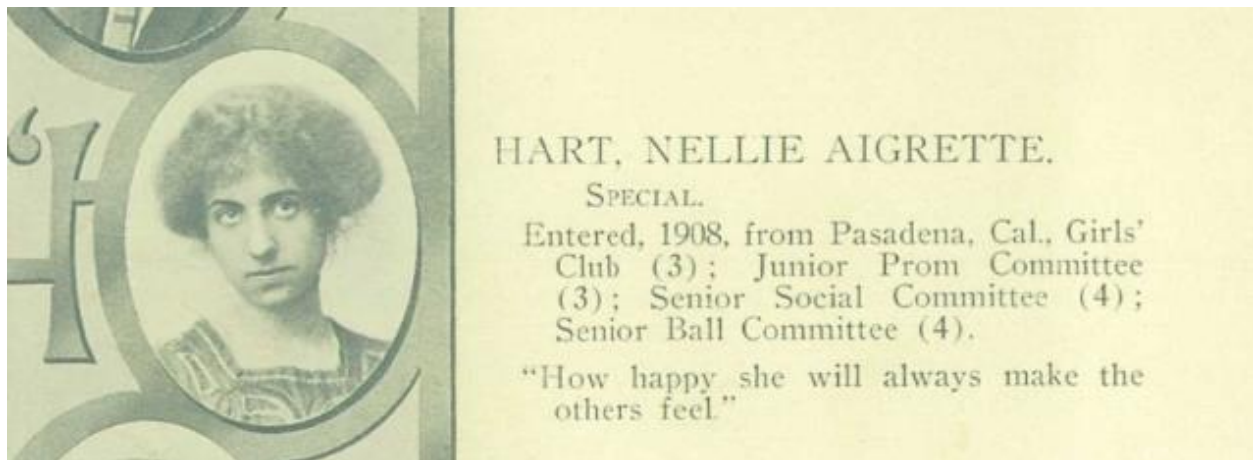

Funeral services for Richard (Dick) H. Conner, 81, of Kirkland, a land developer, will be at 10 a. m. tomorrow at St. Louise's Catholic Church, Bellevue. Burial, directed by Green's Funeral Home, will be at Sunset Hills. He died Saturday.

Born in Michigan, Mr. Conner graduated from the University of Illinois, where he was a member of Phi Delta Theta fraternity.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—No further advices had reached officials here today indicating any change in the total loss of American life when the transport Tuscania was sunk by a German submarine. The list of lost, missing, and surviving, so far cabled from overseas, does not yet permit exact determination of the identities of those who perished. The number, officially, remains at 113. The appended list of names of missing, obtained through process of elimination, is compiled by the Associated Press from the reports received, and while it shows approximately 300 names, it must be remembered that about two-thirds of these will later appear among the survivors if the official estimate of 113 lost is accurate:

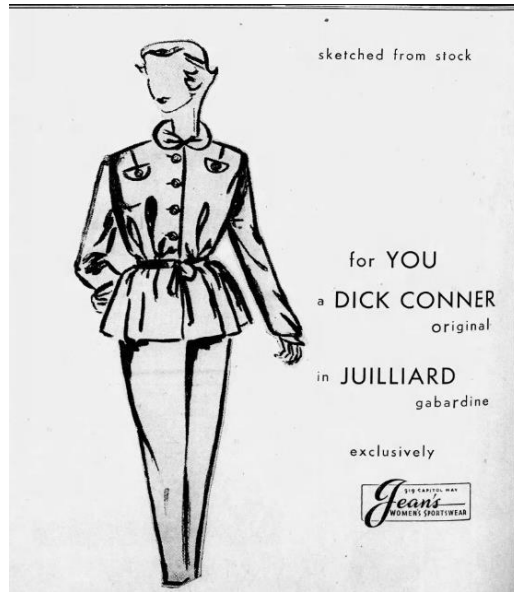

Death Reveals Secret Of Little Miss Emma

BY STUART WHITEHOUSE

There are thousands of Seattleites Friday who mourn the death of Miss Emma C. Hart, who taught in Seattle schools for almost a half-century, and who was principal of Whitworth school for 30 years. The whole scale of Seattle life knows her—from youngsters still in grade school on up to gray-haired grandfathers.

But of those thousands, only a handful of her intimates know the REAL story of her life.

Only those few know the full measure of devotion she gave to children—a devotion that went out beyond her life in school.

But now the last word has been written, and the hidden page she modestly did not reveal can be shown, so that those who read may know that there is love and joy and utterly unselfish devotion

in the quiet lives that no one knows. Consider:

1892. Seattle was a roaring boom town, rising toward its future out of the ashes of its great fire.

A pert and pretty little lady from Georgia arrived. Her hair, old folk remember, was silken and shone like her laughing eyes. Her skin was as soft and fascinating as her southern accent. It was young

Miss Emma then, the new school-ma'am, the belle of the town.

She taught in rapid succession at schools which turned out men and women who lead Seattle today—Pacific, Central, Main Street, Latona, Warren Avenue.

Seattle built a new school—Whitworth. And the still young and pretty school teacher became its principal.

* * *

Then came the part that so few know:

Her brother and his wife died, and three little children were orphaned.

So Miss Hart took them in her home and raised them.

All day long she taught in school, then hurried home to take care of her own brood. There was time for nothing else: Miss Hart saw duty and rose above it. Her reward was in raising three fine children, and educating thousands of others.

The three children she raised are Mrs. Lillian Morse, 466 39th avenue; Mrs. R. H. Conner, 723 McGilvra boulevard, and S. S. Hart of Los Angeles. During later years, when the family was raised, she tenderly cared for an invalid sister, Miss Alice J. Hart, at the family home, 1205 Spring street.

"She gave her life for her family," says Mrs. Morse.

1938. Pioneer days were over. Little Miss Hart had taught in Seattle for 46 years. Her family was raised. Her work, she knew, was over. So she retired.

But she was not forgotten. Each November 16, her birthday, scores of friends and fellow teachers feted her.

Years passed. War came to a world in which Miss Hart had done her part to bring peace and friendship and understanding.

Miss Hart was tired. She had lived a quiet, unostentatious life of sacrifice. She had seen three-quarters of a century. Quietly, with no one but her family knowing she was ill, she died. Saturday, at 1 o'clock, last rites will be held at Bonney-Watson chapel.

It isn't a story of thrills. It is just the story of a woman who kept a secret of shining gold in a heart that could never hold too much love. "Her life was a tribute to the teaching profession," says Acting School Superintendent Samuel Fleming.

It was more than that:

Miss Emma Hart never was a mother—but the real spirit of motherhood and love filled her life with a flow of abundant radiance that the happiest person on earth will envy. When her tiny feet touched the earth, a queen walked by . . .

LEAVES \$60,000 ESTATE.

Mrs. I. Stadden Bequeaths Her Property in Three Equal Parts—One-Third Held in Trust.

(From Tuesdays Daily.)

The last will and testament of the late Mrs. Nellie Stadden, who died recently, was admitted to probate yesterday. The large estate, which is valued at \$60,000, was bequeathed in three equal parts—one-third to her daughter, Mrs. Lillian Prager, one-third to her son, Leo I. Stadden and one-third to her three minor grand children, who are children of her late daughter, Mrs. Nellie Stadden-Hart, who died last January. The will was executed last April and contains only two typewritten pages, being short and concise. Leo Stadden is made trustee in the estate and by the terms of the document he is given discretionary powers. The one-third interest in the estate bequeathed to the deceased's grand children is to be held in trust until each arrives at the age of twenty-five years. The trustee is to have exclusive control of the estate and shall direct all the affairs pertaining to it. One of the small provisions of the will is that \$2,500 each shall be invested by the trustee for her brother, Mr. Newcomb and her late husband's brother, Thomas Stadden, and that they are each to receive the interest annually on the amount invested. The will also states that should any of the heirs contest the will they shall forfeit all right and title to their share of the estate. The bulk of the estate is in stock in the I. Stadden Grocery company.

ASK JUDGMENT FOR \$6,579.30.

Children of Nellie Stadden Hart Sue the Citizens National Bank On Stock Shares.

Through their attorneys, Shepherd, Shepherd and Shepherd, S. S. Hart, Nellie Aiyrette Hart and Lillian Hart filed suit in district court yesterday evening against the Citizens National bank of this city in which they seek to recover \$6,579.30, being earnings, interest and dividends on twenty shares of stock left to them by their grandmother, Nellie D. Stadden, and which they alleged were used by the late Leo Stadden in paying indebtedness owed the bank by the Isaac Stadden Grocery company.

S. S. Hart is 23 years of age, Nellie Aiyrette Hart is 22, and Lillian Hart is 18, and are now residents of Seattle, Washington. They allege that they are the only children left by their parents, Lee B. Hart, who died in November, 1908, and his wife, Nellie Stadden Hart, who died in January, 1900, and are the grand-children of Nellie D. Stadden, who died on December 2, 1900, in this city.

The plaintiffs further allege that the said Nellie D. Stadden left a last will and testament duly probated in Bourbon county, Kansas, on December 10, 1900. That with the exception of certain promises made for the benefit of one James Newcomb and one Thomas B. Stadden, all the rest and residue of the property left by Nellie D. Stadden went to the two living children and to the children of the deceased daughter, one-third to each.

It is further claimed by the plaintiffs that the portion left to them was devised to a son, Leo, in trust and should be delivered to them when they reached the age of twenty-five. Among the property left to the children was twenty shares of capital stock in the Citizens National bank. They allege that in February, 1902, said stock was of reasonable value of \$112 per share and that the twenty shares were worth \$2,240.

The plaintiffs further allege that during the years 1901 and 1902, the Isaac Stadden Grocery company, of which Leo Stadden was the manager, carried on its banking business with the Citizens National bank. That on or about February 2, 1902, the bank persuaded Leo Stadden to surrender the twenty shares of stock he held in trust to the bank in payment of cer-

Funeral services for Lee B. Hart, who died at Tucson, Arizona, November 25, were held at the residence of his father, B. F. Hart, 1832 Thirteenth avenue corner of Denny Way and Thirteenth avenue, Wednesday, Dec. 2, 1908, at 2 p. m. Interment was in Lake View cemetery.

Mr. Hart was born in Greencastle, Ind., July 2, 1865. His early childhood was spent in Kentucky and Missouri. He was a graduate of the State University of Missouri and was graduated from the law class in 1888.

Mr. Hart practiced the profession of law at Fort Scott, Kans., and at Seattle, Wash. In January, 1891, he wedded Miss Nellie M. Staddin, daughter of Col. I. Staddin, at Fort Scott, Kan. In the fall of that year they moved to Seattle. After a brief, happy union his wife died nine years ago, leaving their three children Staddin S., Aigretta and Lillian, to whose rearing the father was unusually devoted.

For twelve years Mr. Hart was a sufferer. He sought health in different climates and made a long fight. He seemed cheerful and hopeful to the very last. He was a generous, warm-hearted friend, always ready to help one in need—a kind son, a loving brother and a devoted husband and father.

Mr. Hart was a son of Dr. B. F. Hart, a retired physician of this city. In addition to his children, his father and his sisters, Alice J., Emma C., and Mrs. R. W. Prigmore, and his brother, John B. Hart, all residents of Seattle, survive him.

His nature was such that he attracted a large circle of friends both at Seattle and in California and other places where he resided. No man in Seattle numbered a larger list of personal friends than did Lee Hart while he was a resident of the city. A polished and affable man, he added to these qualities a wholesome warm-heartedness and a genuine love of humanity that endeared him to all acquaintances.

Word was received in Fort Scott today announcing the death of Lee B. Hart, well remembered as a former city editor of the Tribune and later as a practicing attorney of this city. Mr. Hart died in Tuscon, Arizona, last Wednesday and has been buried in Seattle, Wash., whence he moved from Fort Scott a number of years ago. He had been battling for his life with the great white plague for the past several years and recently went to Tuscon for the benefit of his health. Mrs. Hart died of the same affliction a few years ago. They are survived by three children—a boy named Stadden and two daughters, named Lillian and Algretta respectively. The youngest is aged 6 or 8 years.

Lee B. Hart was a man of parts. He came to Fort Scott in the early nineties and took the position of city editor of the Tribune. His parents lived at Sweet Springs, Mo., where his father was a practicing physician and a citizen of distinction. The family was originally from Kentucky, however, and the young Mr. Hart was possessed of that traditional Southern chivalry to a marked degree. He was of recently completed college education, a positive young man, of strong likes and dislikes, which divided his acquaintances to some extent into implacable enemies and devoted friends and admirers. Among those to whom his talents and virtues seemed to overbalance his human faults was the present editor of the Tribune, whose whole future was radically changed through a little incident of his association with Mr. Hart. It was some time after Mr. Hart had quit newspaper work here and engaged with his brother, John Hart, in the practice of law. Mr. Marble had been a printer in the Tribune office during Mr. Hart's connection with the paper and they had become good friends. One day a few lines appeared in the paper announcing that Mr. Marble would leave the next day for Chicago to study journalism with a view to engaging in the work in that city. The next day at noon he was walking down Main street an hour before the time his train was due to leave and was observed by Mr. Hart from his office window across the street and called in.

"George," said he, "I see you are going to school to study journalism. Now, that's a mistake. Go down to the Tribune office and hire to them as a reporter. They have no reporter and you can learn more journalism by active experience in a year than you can learn at school in a life time."

Mr. Marble insisted that it was too late at that time to change his plans, but Mr. Hart insisted and finally prevailed upon him to wait in his law office while he went down to the Tribune office to see what might be done. The result was that Mr. Marble went to work for the Tribune, where he had learned the printer's trade, that afternoon. Mr. Hart outfitted him with Roget's Thesaurus of Words and gave

him some primary instructions in the work, which became the basis of Mr. Marble's actual newspaper experience.

After the Hart Bros. had practiced law here for a few years, and after he was married to Miss Nellie Stadden, one of Fort Scott's most cultured young ladies, they moved to Seattle and engaged in the practice of law. Their success there exceeded in degree what they hoped for. Within a few years, however, the wife and mother was stricken down and left a most interesting and lovable family of children with a poignantly bereaved father. Mr. Hart drifted from the practice of law into the service of the great gas and electric combine of the coast and negotiated some of the heaviest deals ever consummated on the coast for his clients. He lived in California much of the time, entertaining all along some fears of his infection with pulmonary trouble. The last time in Fort Scott he expressed serious concern as to the condition of his health and left some of his friends apprehensive of what has finally come to pass.

Mr. Hart's permanent home has been in Seattle since he left Fort Scott. His brother John is still practicing law there, and is one of the most distinguished men of that profession in the great Northwest city. His father's family has lived there for some years and it is with them that the children have made their home and had all the advantages that a refined taste and an inherent Southern family pride could suggest.

Mrs. Lee B. Hart, wife of the well-known lawyer and politician of this city, died yesterday at San Antonio, Tex. A telegraphic message from Mr. Hart to his brother, John B. Hart, brought the news to her friends and relatives in this city. Death was due to quick consumption.

About the middle of last September, while living here, Mrs. Hart suffered a hemorrhage of the lungs, which was quickly followed by others. Despite the best medical attention and nursing, Mrs. Hart's condition grew rapidly worse, and it soon developed that she was a victim of consumption.

As soon as her condition would permit, Mr. Hart decided to take her to Silver City, N. M., to spend the winter. Ten weeks ago they left for that place accompanied by their three children. When they arrived at San Antonio Mrs. Hart and the children remained there while Mr. Hart went on to Silver City to make things comfortable for the invalid after her arrival.

He had been gone only a few days when he was summoned back to San Antonio by a telegram that she was growing rapidly worse. He returned and was constantly at her bedside during her fatal illness.

As stated, Mrs. Hart had three children.

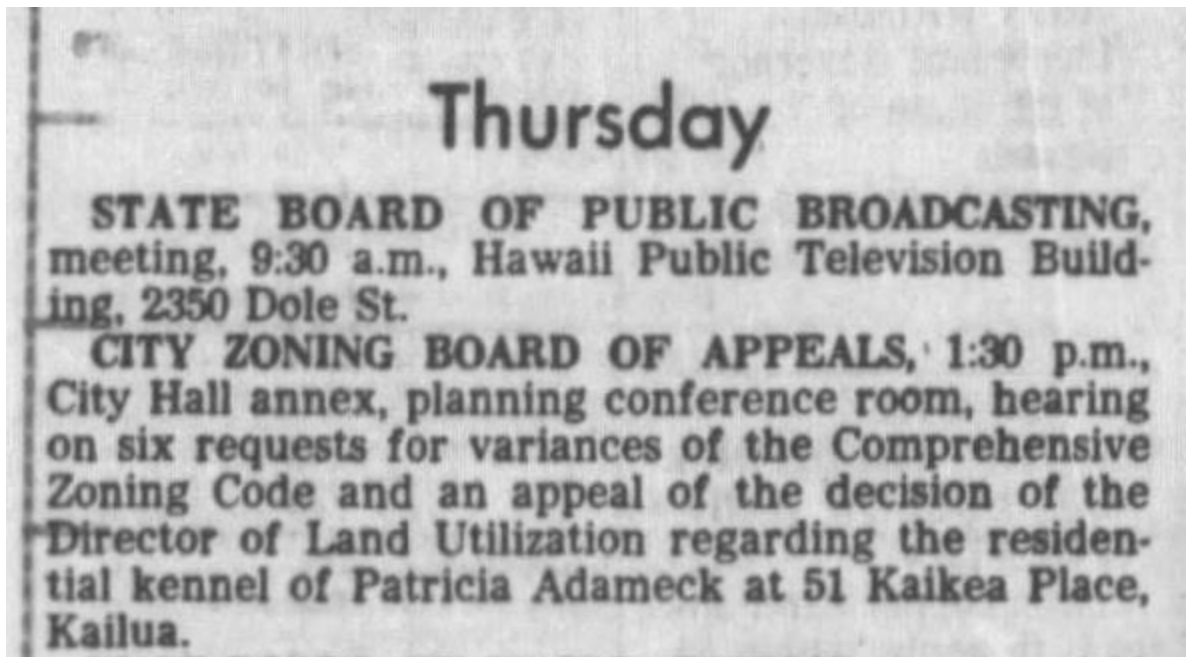

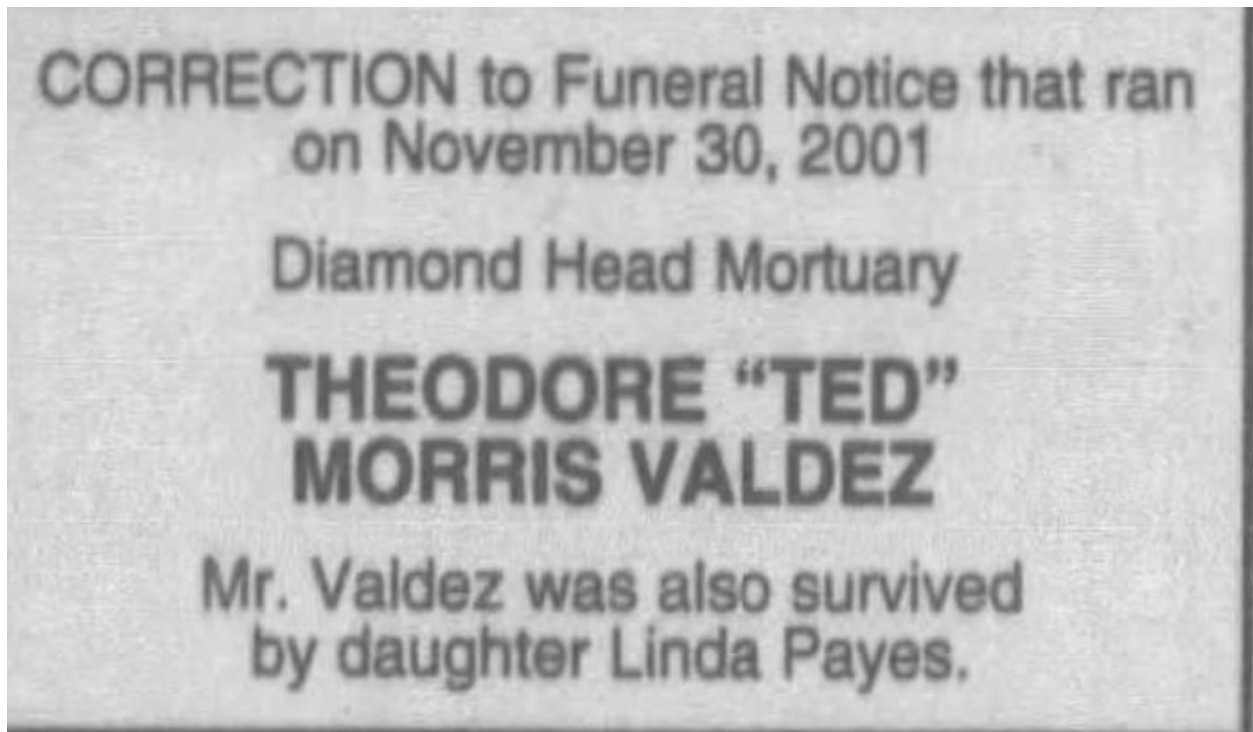

Damage Suit Expected To Go to Jury Today

The damage action of John H. Conner and Shirle L. Conner against T. J. Boeck is expected to go to a district court jury Tuesday.

The Conners seek \$1,213.61 in damages from Boeck for expenses and disbursements they claim resulted from his failure to complete a building contract in a satisfactory manner.

The Conners hired Boeck to build an addition onto their home. They say the addition was "erected in such an unskilled and negligent manner, and of such unsuitable materials that shortly after completion, the roof and lower level walls began to leak. . . ."

They also charge that Boeck installed a fireplace fan so that it would not operate correctly, and failed to construct heat vents, a

cabinet and shelves included in the contract.

Boeck conducted his own defense in the civil trial Monday.

Final arguments and instructions to the jury were scheduled Tuesday at 9:30 in the court of District Judge Charles B. Sande.

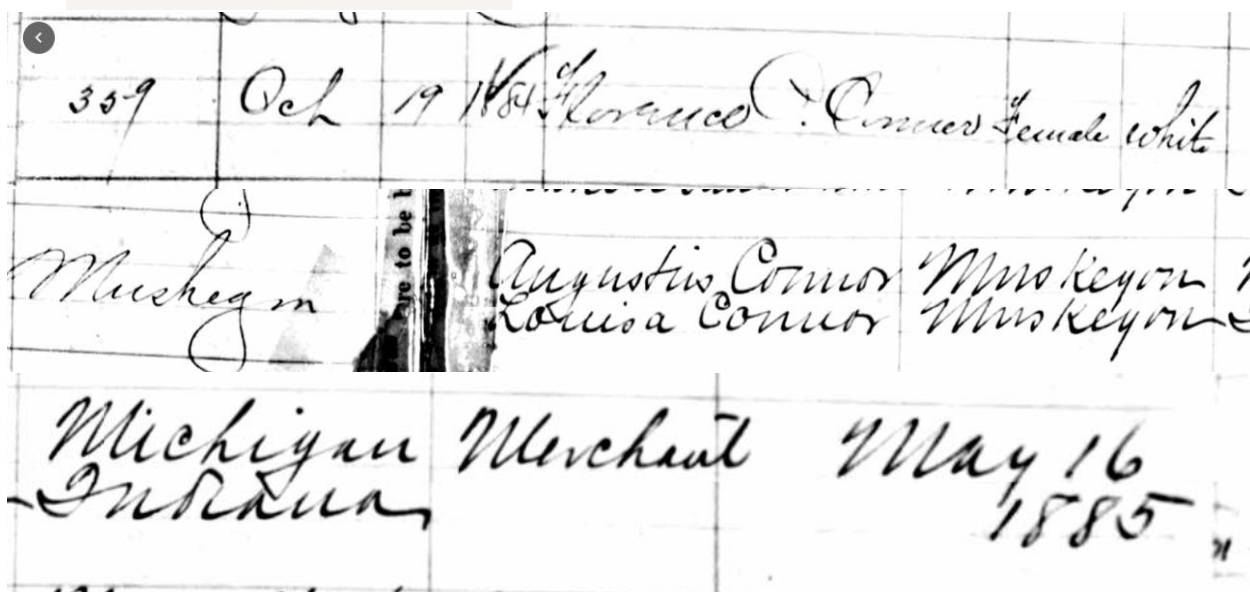

He died of gangrene of the lungs, emphyema [sic] & lobar pneumonia.
