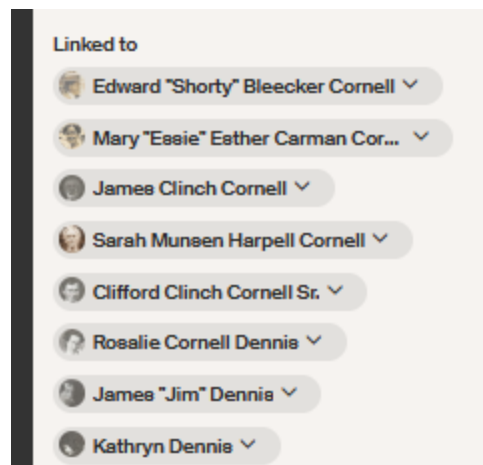

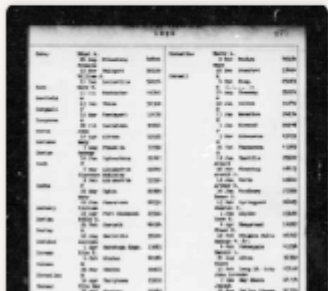

Albert Cornell

Roosevelt—Albert Cornell, 75, virtually a lifelong resident here, died yesterday in Doctors Hospital, Freeport. Cornell lived here on Allers Boulevard and had been under treatment for cancer. He was a retired plumber, working in maintenance at Adelphi University as his last job before retiring. A World War I veteran with the 213th Aero Squadron in France, Cornell was a survivor of the torpedoing of the troop ship Tuscania in February, 1918, in which more than 200 Americans died. Cornell's earliest years were spent in Hempstead. He was married for 52 years to the former Constance (Gussie) Paschette, who survives. Service, 10 AM Saturday in the James J. Seery Funeral Home, Roosevelt.

Several Nassau Youths Write of Their Rescues

Mineola, March 2.—A number of persons in various parts of Nassau County have heard from their sons who were on the ill-fated Tuscania, and all the letters are full of the splendid time the boys are having in Ireland, where a majority of them were taken after they were rescued. The boys all speak of the entertainment that is accorded them, and say that the good people of Ireland are treating them in much the same manner as though they had sunk a fleet of submarines.

Aubrey Mole, of Roosevelt, told his parents that he was safe and told of scenes immediately following the sinking of the ship. Three boats were lowered ahead of his, he said, and were smashed at once and their occupants thrown into the water. His boat was on the water two hours before he was picked up.

Albert Cornell, of Hempstead, was on the water twelve days and finally landed in Edinburgh.

Douglas East, of Mineola, was with a crowd of boys in a hotel in Belfast. He was being well treated, but regretted that he had been separated from his immediate squadron and had not been able to rejoin it.

George Ludlum, of Oyster Bay, was in fine health and in Belfast. He had but a few minutes to write, as the mail boat was leaving. He wanted his parents to know that he was in good health and being well cared for. All the letters had been censored and much of the writing erased. Many lines were entirely cut off.

SEEKS TO RECOVER LAND WORTH \$50,000

Mary Crevorserat's Appeal in
Suit Against Bergen to Be
Heard This Week.

ROOSEVELT, L. I., Jan. 5.—The case of Mary Crevorserat against Cornelius R. Bergen, and others has been noticed for argument in the Court of Appeals for this week. This is to be the final chapter in litigation that has been before the courts since 1908.

Fidel Crevorserat, father of the plaintiff, Mary Crevorserat, purchased a farm at Greenwich Point in 1869, living upon and farming the premises up to the fall of 1900, when he died. In 1902 Cornelius R. Bergen brought an action to foreclose an old mortgage for \$3,200, made in 1869, and instead of making the heirs of Fidel Crevorserat parties, he made one Joseph Koelbel and Henry Crevorserat the defendants, for the reason that there was recorded in 1870 a deed purporting to be made by Crevorserat to Koelbel. Bergen bought the premises in for \$2,500 and later sold the property to Rose Paschette for \$5,500, and in 1906 Paschette sold the same premises to Everett Harrison for \$27,000.

the premises was in Fidel Crevorserat, and at his death passed to his heirs, that by reason of Fidel Crevorserat making the deed in question, Rose Paschette was lead to believe the record correct.

The plaintiff appealed to the Appellate Division from the decision of Justice Marean, and the Court confirmed the judgment of the lower court. The plaintiff then appealed to the Court of Appeals from the judgment of affirmance, which comes before the Court for argument this week.

The property is estimated to be worth at present about \$50,000.

It was about this time that Mary Crevorserat started suit in the Supreme Court of Nassau County, to redeem the mortgaged premises, tendering the amount of the old mortgage, together with interest and costs. The case was tried before Justice Marean, at Mineola in February, 1910, the Court holding that the foreclosure was improper in failing to make the heirs of Fidel Crevorserat parties to the action; that the deed of Koelbel in 1870 was void, in that it had never been delivered. The Court, however, gave judgment for Rose Paschette, invoking the rule of estoppel, that is, holding that although the real title of

TO REDEEM THE FARM.

Heirs of Fidel Crevoirserat Seek to Regain Property at New Hyde Park.

FREEPORT, July 17.—Mary Crevoirserat, of this village, has commenced an action to redeem premises just north of this place, containing thirty-four acres of land, valued at \$40,000, from Rose Paschette, who claims ownership, and has just filed her answer.

It seems that in 1902, Fidel Crevoirserat, father of the plaintiff, died, after having lived on the premises for sixty years and having farmed the premises all that time, paid taxes, and paid interest on a mortgage of \$3,000. A year after his death the property was sold without knowledge of the heirs, by Cornelius R. Bergen, of New Hyde Park, he holding an assignment on the sixty-year-old mortgage.

The heirs did not know of the sale of the property, or that it had been disturbed, until some time after the sale, when they were notified that the property belonged to the present occupant, Rose Paschette. As soon as they learned that the property had been sold they retained Counsellor Elvin N. Edwards, to bring suit to reclaim or redeem the premises.

The property was sold for \$2,500, and it is stated that it was sold a year later for \$10,000 to the people now in possession, and they have refused \$20,000.

Mary Crevoisier, the plaintiff in

this action, is a daughter of Fidel Crevoiserat. There are six other children, Henry, Peter and Joseph Crevoiserat, sons; Elizabeth Raynor, a daughter; Russell Crevoiserat, Nina, John, Norton, William and Mary E. Crevoiserat, Ella Carman, Annie Carman, John Carman, Florence Carman, William Carman, Edwin Koelbel, Chas. Koelbel, Katherine Koelbel, Laura Koelbel, Ella Koelbel, John Koelbel, and Joseph Koelbel, all grandchildren of the deceased.

The suit is brought in the Supreme Court, Nassau County, by Mary Crevoiserat, as plaintiff, against Cornelius R. Bergen, and Mary Alice Bergen, his wife, and Rose Paschette, and the children and grandchildren of Fidel Crevoiserat.

The action will be tried at the December Term of court.

Mrs. Sarah M. Cornell of 25 Graffing place, Freeport, died at her home Wednesday following an illness of three months. She was 85.

Mrs. Cornell was born in White-stone, the daughter of Seth Harpell, who was killed in the Battle of Gettysburg. She lived in Roosevelt prior to moving to Freeport four years ago.

She was a charter member of the D. B. P. Mott Relief corps, a Civil war auxilliary unit, and a member of the auxilliary of the Roosevelt Veterans of Foreign Wars. She was the widow of James C. Cornell, a Civil war veteran, who died in 1915.

WIFE MISSING, ASKS DIVORCE UNDER NEW LAW

First Case Based on Lately- Enacted Domestic Relations Statute Up at Mineola.

Mineola, April 17.—The first case under the new Domestic Relations Law which provides that a divorce can be obtained after five years' absence by either the wife or husband, if no trace of the missing one can be found, has been brought by Arthur Cornell. He has filed a petition in the Supreme Court here asking that his marriage to Luella May Hulse Cornell be dissolved on the ground that he has not heard from her in over five years.

Mrs. Cornell and her daughter disappeared in July, 1915. Arthur Hicks, of Oceanside, also has been absent since that time, leaving without any word to his wife. When Mrs. Cornell and her daughter left it was ostensibly for a visit with relatives in Bay Shore, where Cornell was to join them shortly afterward. When he called he discovered that wife and child had not been there, nor had they been expected. He learned from Mrs. Hicks that her husband had disappeared at the same time Mrs. Cornell left her home.

Nassau Man Granted "Enoch Arden" Decree

(Special to The Standard Union.)

MINEOLA, Aug. 22.—Arthur Cornell, of Roosevelt, has been granted the first "Enoch Arden" dissolution of marriage in Nassau County. The action was brought under the recent State act that permits a dissolution of marriage after diligent efforts have been made to find the missing wife or husband. The order of Justice Frank S. Cannon, just filed here, frees Cornell from the marriage contracted many years ago.

Mrs. Cornell, living then with her husband in Oceanside, disappeared June 28, 1913. John Hulse, father of the missing woman, her sisters and brothers joined the husband in the search, but only one sister, Mrs. William Lamberson, of Oceanside, ever heard from Mrs. Cornell. The last time was more than five years ago, when she wrote Mrs. Lamberson that she had been very ill of influenza.

The wife's family all joined in the evidence to show that Mrs. Cornell had actually passed out of their lives if she is not actually dead.

TAKES ADVANTAGE OF "ENOCH ARDEN" LAW

(Special to The Eagle.)

Mineola, L. I., April 17—Taking advantage of the recently passed "Enoch Arden" law, perhaps the first since the signing of the new domestic relation law, which entitles an aggrieved person to sue for annulment in proof of the absence or death of a husband or wife, Arthur Cornell of 32 Whitehouse ave., Roosevelt, through his counsel, Peter Stephen Beck, of Freeport, is applying to the Supreme Court for the annulment of his marriage to Puella May Hulse Cornell, who he claims left him June 28, 1913.

In his petition for an annulment Cornell says he and his wife lived happily together until she met Arthur Hicks, who "apparently alienated her affections." Hicks was an insurance agent, employed by the Prudential Life Insurance Company at Rockville Centre. He called at the Cornell home to collect premiums. "Thereafter Hicks called socially," says the petitioner. On the occasion Cornell last saw his wife and child, Mrs. Cornell left, ostensibly, to pay a visit to a cousin at Bay Shore.

Cornell called upon Mrs. Hicks, wife of the man who called "socially," and to his "amazement" learned that he, also, had disappeared on the same day as his wife and that he had failed to leave any trace of his whereabouts. He advertised in The Eagle and other papers, but has never heard directly or indirectly of his wife or child since their disappearance.

Cornell could not obtain a divorce in New York State and did not want to leave the State, and did not want to run the risk of marrying again and be faced with the possible situation of having his wife return some day and annulling the marriage, he says, and therefore seeks to take advantage of the recent amendment to the domestic relations law.

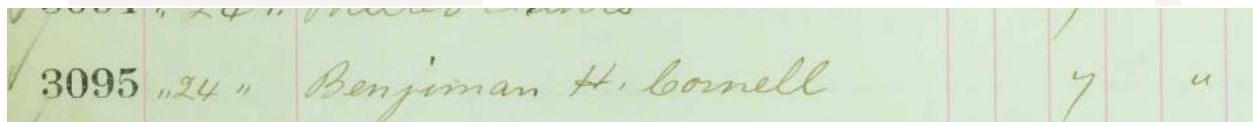

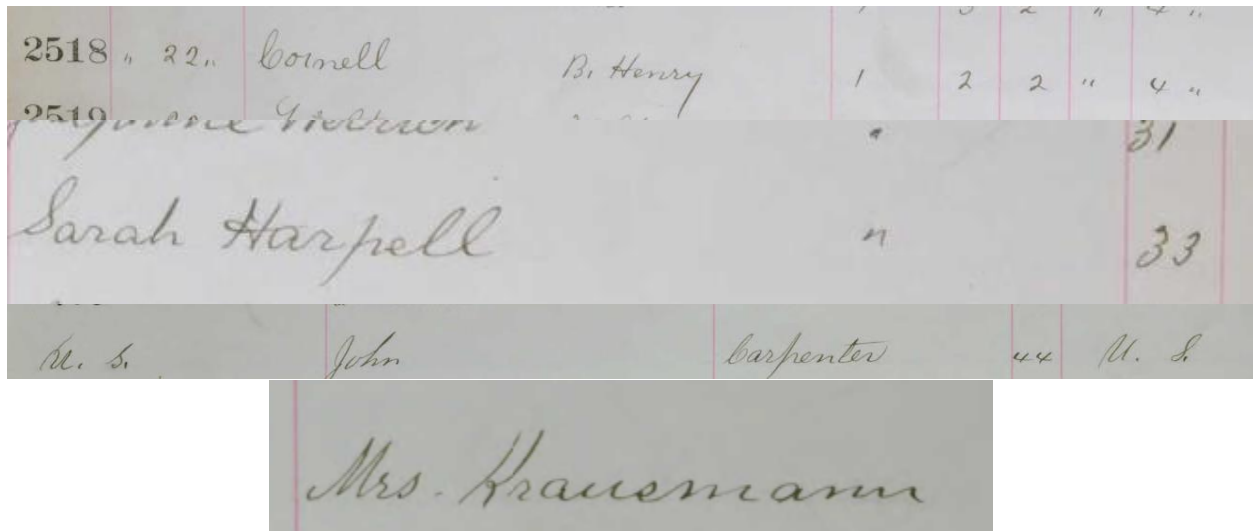

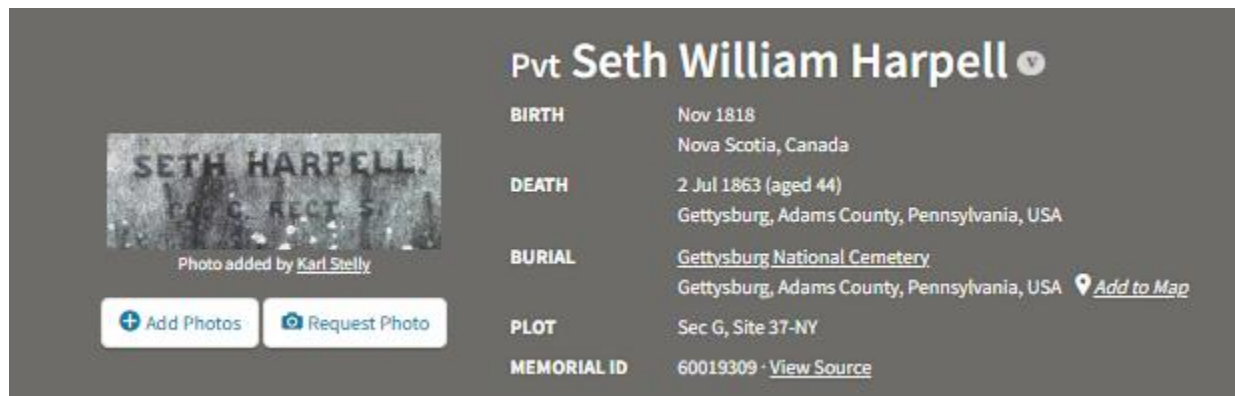

F: 220531921), whom he married 11 Jul 1912 in Hempstead, Nassau NY. Mary Esther was the daughter of George T. Carman & Jane Verity. – Died of cancer. – Buried in Park View Cemetery, Manteca, San Joaquin CA. F: 220529808

- **Benjamin Henry Cornell**, b. & d. Jan 1888 according one report. B. Henry Cornell, with the correct parents of James Cornell & Susan Harpell listed on the birth record, was born 22 Jan 1888 in Queens NY. An infant named Benjamin H. Cornell died 24 Aug 1888 in Queens NY at the age of 7 days (unless the record meant to write “7 months.”)
- **Rosalie Cornell Dennis**, 15 Oct 1889 Whitestone, Queens NY – 2 Sep 1977 Westminster West, Windham VT. Wife of James E. Dennis (b. 1881), whom she married in 1910 in NJ. – Buried in Greenfield Cemetery, Uniondale, Nassau NY. F: 140599879
- **Clifford Clinch Cornell**, 9 Aug 1893 Rockville Centre, Nassau NY – 16 Sep 1958 Palm Beach FL. – Husband of Myrtle Abrams (1892-1918) whom he married 29 Apr 1915 in Hempstead, Nassau NY. She died of pneumonia at their home on Willow Ave., Hempstead, Long Island NY. Her father was John D. Abrams. – Husband of Ella May Willets (1886-1962, F: 133433290). Ella was the daughter of Henry Willets & Lydia (Ella May) Morton. Clifford & Ella married 25 Jan 1921 in Hempstead, Nassau NY. Buried in Greenfield Cemetery, Uniondale, Nassau NY. F: 133433338

Notes:

Albert’s maternal grandfather, Seth William Harpell, died in the Battle of Gettysburg on 2 Jul 1863. Albert’s father James also fought for the Union from NY.



Albert Cornell’s maternal grandfather is buried in Gettysburg National Cemetery, where President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address.
