Midst of the Excitement.

Jack Campbell, an attendant at the Wood county asylum, is in receipt of the following interesting letter from his brother, Sergeant Earl Campbell, Company C, 107th Supply train, 32nd division, A. E. F.:

"Somewhere in England,"

Feb. 22, 1918.

Brother Jack:

I told you I would write and tell you of the trip, so here goes as much as I am allowed to write.

We left Waco, Texas, January 11 and were on the go until February 9. What do you think of a ride like that?

When we got to the big pond we went on board the S. S. Tuscania. She was a British ship, and there was a jolly bunch on her.

Everything went along fine until the evening of February 5. I had my supper, and as I was one of the first sitting, was one of the first out, I took my fork, knife and spoon to my bunk, put on my overcoat, took my life belt and went on deck to see what was going on, sat down in a good place to smoke and then got company in the person of George Gunderson.

We began to talk that we would be in a port when we got up. Just about that time, it struck, about eight or ten feet from where I was sitting. I told Gunderson to get to his station as quick as he could. You see, we had boat drill every day at 2 o'clock, so each company had its place and every man was assigned to a certain boat.

It happened that the torpedo struck the ship right below where our boats were. We had one all ready in the davits, but it was blown all to pieces,

so we looked for the other two and found that the explosion had made good sieves out of them. There we were—all the rest going down to safety in boats while we were left to drown like rats in a jug, unless we got help from destroyers and that looked doubtful as they were searching for the subs and dropping depth bombs.

At last the sub came to the surface. The destroyers spied it and, running at great speed, cut it into and took some prisoners. Finally, one destroyer pulled up along side us and we got on it, that is about 350 of us and the rest got onto another destroyer.

We struck Ireland at 1:30 and will say I was glad when I stepped on land again. They had a good, warm meal for us and otherwise used us fine.

We stayed only a day there. We saw most of Ireland and Wales and at last landed in England and here we are to stay until we get some more equipment and then hurrah for the big show and some fighting.

Well, I guess I will close for this time. Tell them all hello for me and that your brother was on the first ship loaded with American soldiers that was torpedoed.

SERVICE MEN OF PLAINFIELD HAVE SURVIVORS' CLUB

ALL THOSE ABOARD TUSCANIA,
ILL-FATED SHIP TORPEDOED
DURING WAR, MEET TO OR-
GANIZE

(Special to The Tribune)

Plainfield, Wis. — Twenty-seven Waushara county ex-service men who were aboard the Tuscania at the time that ill-fated ship was torpedoed during the World war, met recently at Wautoma and at that time organized the "Tuscania Survivors." Steps will be taken to obtain recognition from the war department, as the survivors of the Maine did years ago.

Three Lost Lives

Seventy men from this county were aboard the ship when it was sunk, and three of them lost their lives. It was exactly nine years previous to the recent meeting that a German submarine fired upon the Tuscania, and at that same hour, 5:45 p. m., the ex-soldiers met for their reunion and banquet. Supper was served, and during the meal the men arose and stood silent for a moment, with heads bowed in respect to Russell Bennett, Alcide Carolla and Frank Sharpe, who lost their lives at the time of the catastrophe in mid-ocean. Bennett was from Plainfield and was a nephew of F. J. Luce, former merchant here.

**SURVIVORS OF TUSCANIA
DISASTER TO ASSEMBLE
AT BERLIN FOR BANQUET**

Besides Mr. Eagan, officers of this group are Earl Campbell, first vice president; W. L. Cotton, second vice president; Miles Colligan, secretary, and J. Swendzenski, treasurer. A similar meeting of the Tuscania survivors, national in scope, is to be held at Milwaukee.

50 YEARS AGO TODAY

Two letters from "Somewhere in England," sent to local relatives by A.E.F. members who had been on the Tuscania, have been made available for publication in today's News. Corp. Ray Anderson, in his second letter from overseas and dated Feb. 13, said in part: "You most likely have heard about the Tuscania going down. I was on that ship. The Y.M.C.A. men have said we could write about it. It wasn't as bad as the papers say it was and that is due to the way the fellows acted. Believe me, I was sure proud to be an American that night." The other letter, dated Feb. 22, was sent to Jack Campbell, an attendant at the Wood County asylum, by his brother, Sgt. Earl Campbell, who was on deck with George Gunderson and gave this account of what happened to them: "The torpedo struck right below where our boats were. We had one all ready in the davits, but it was blown to pieces, so we looked for the other two and found that the explosion had made sieves of them. There we were—all the rest going down to safety in boats while we were left to drown unless we got help from the destroyers, and that looked doubtful, as they were looking for the sub and dropping depth bombs. At last the sub came to the surface. The destroyers cut it in two and took some prisoners. Finally one destroyer drew up along side of us and about 350 of us got on it, the rest getting on another destroyer."—(Marshfield News, March 14, 1918)

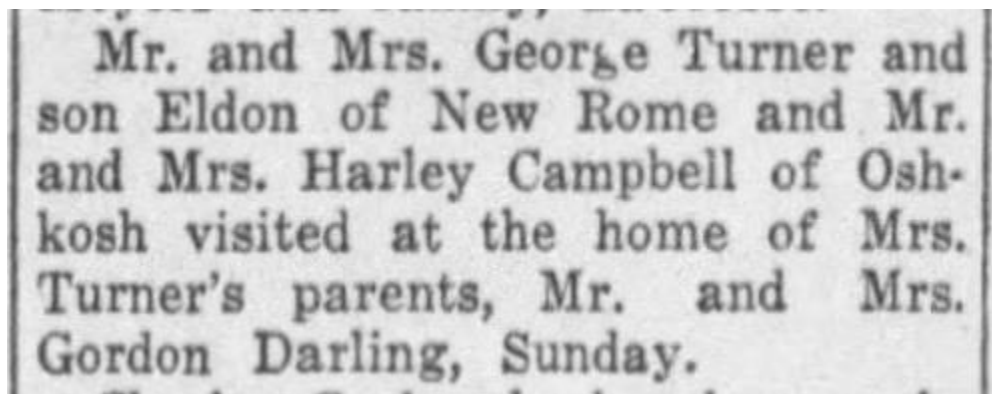

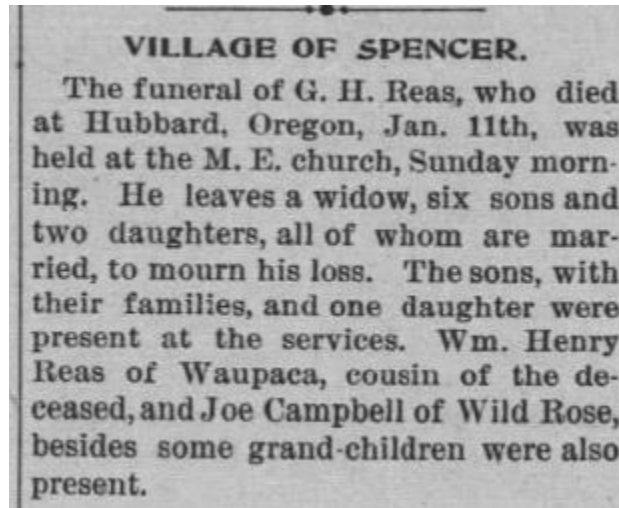
