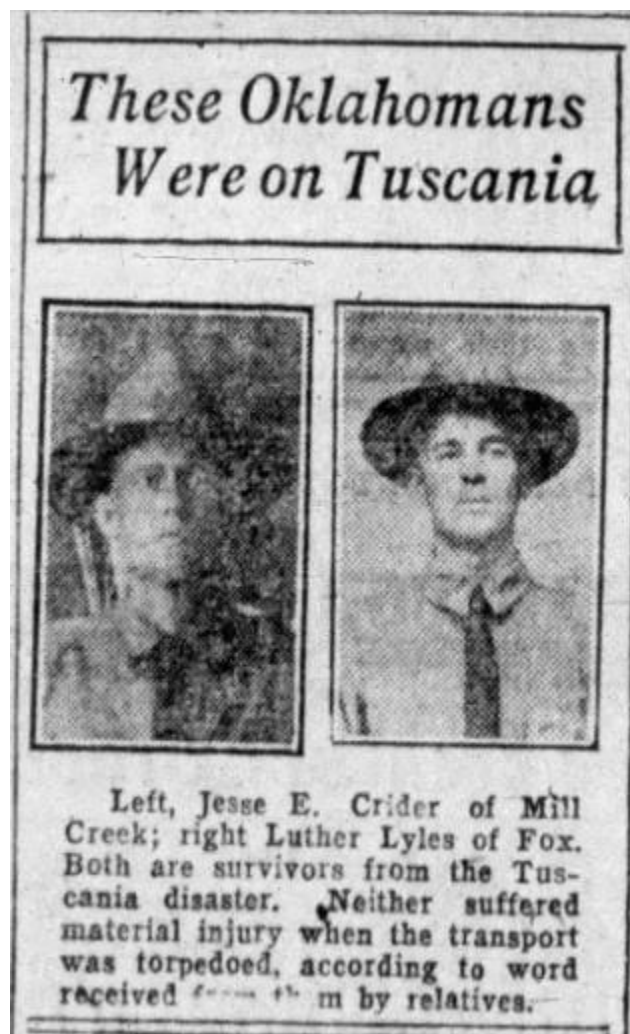

MURRAY COUNTY BOY ON ILL-FATED TUSCANIA.

Mr. Jesse Crider, son of Mr. and Mrs. Crider of Nebo was among the passengers of the ill-fated *Tuscania*, sunk by a German submarine last week off the coast of Ireland. Latest dispatches to this country show Mr. Crider to be among the survivors, and is now ashore in Ireland and well cared for. His parents are greatly relieved now to learn of his safety.

Mill Creek Boy Was in Water Till Midnight

February 12, 1918.

Dear Sir:

I am well and getting along fine.

I suppose before now you have heard about the British transport, the Tuscania, going down and was wondering whether I was on that boat or not. We had almost reached our destination, only had eight hours' drive on the 5th of February, about good dark when the scamps slipped the torpedo to us. I was on the top deck when the explosion occurred. I had just eaten supper and came out. I had on my overcoat and life belt.

There was a lot of excitement, but I kept my head and that is what it takes in a case like that. The ship floated three hours and fifteen minutes before she went down. I was only a few hundred yards away when she sunk down to the top deck and the boilers coming in contact with the cold water blowed up and she quickly went down. I was picked up between 12 and 1 o'clock by a British mine sweeper and I certainly was glad when she bumped the dock a little after day light.

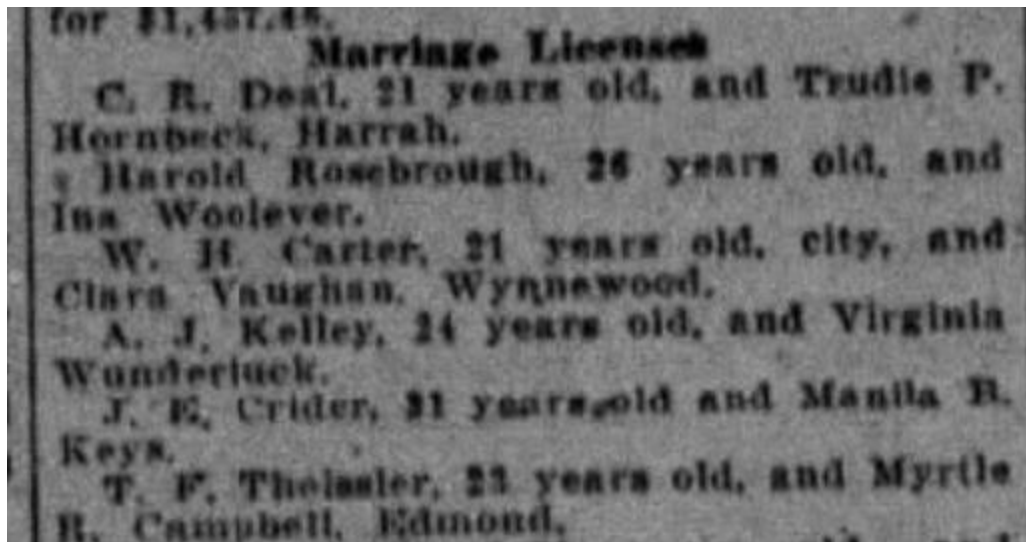

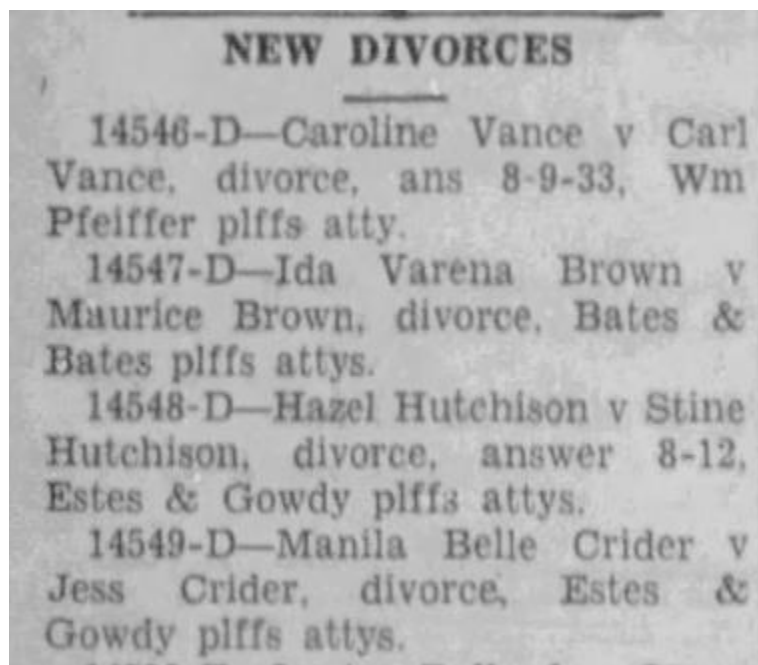

Teacher Is Honored For Work

MORE than 150 Calumet community residents Monday night learned a lot of the past life of Pearl Howe, grade school principal there, and also about first aid and disaster work from Canadian county Red Cross disaster service and Calamity Janes under the direction of Don Eagle, assistant fire chief.

The presentations were at a regular meeting of the Calumet PTA. Howe had been chosen as "teacher of the month," and was honored by the organization with a "This Is Your Life" presentation.

Howe's "This Is Your Life" revealed highlights in his life from pre-school days on the farm southwest of Calumet where he was born through his current assignment as head of the grade school there. It included his attendance at the Rock Dale school, southwest of Calumet, attendance in Calumet highschool where he was a member of the first graduating class in 1918, a class of which he was valedictorian, the receipt of his college degree from Central State college, his masters degree from Oklahoma university, and teaching positions which now are in their 34th year.

APPEARING to narrate on his life were his sister, Mrs. Jess Crider, Oklahoma City, who dwelt on a pre-school happening or two; several members of his highschool graduating class, including Mrs. M. M. Thompson, Calumet, Mrs. George Witcher, El Reno, and Mrs. Charles Gambel, El Reno.

M. M. Thompson recalled Howe's highschool athletic prowess, and Elmer Petree, Edmond, who was Calumet superintendent of schools in 1918, told of his scholastic activities in the school there and on through college.

Howe's first teaching assignment was at Rock Dale, a school which he attended and in which he later taught at the request of patrons.

Events during his teaching there were recalled by James Stults, Calumet, who later appeared with his daughter, Mrs. Fred Tech, a student of Mr. Howe in the Calumet district.

THOSE attending heard of his next teaching assignment which was at the Red Rock school, south of Calumet, from Raymond Arnold, whose daughter, Marilyn, Calumet freshman, later appeared as the "second generation attending school to Mr. Howe." Mrs. Bernie Hopkins, PTA president, also a student at Red Rock, reported on his school lunch efforts there.

Mrs. Hallie Hinger, a Calumet teacher, started her career in the profession under Howe in his next assignment at Mountain View and reported on activities there. He had completed 26 years in the profession before coming to Calumet eight years ago, and it was reported that in all that time his only absence was from a case of mumps.

Mrs. Hopkins ended the presentation with statements that Howe had not been flown to the performance, that they had no film presentation of the evening for him, that there would be no party in the Hollywood Roosevelt hotel immediately following, and that they did not have a 1957 automobile to

present to him. Then she gave him a gaily decorated cake which had been prepared by Mrs. H. C. McCann.

Eagle was narrator for the two Red Cross groups, the disaster service and Calamity Janes, whose demonstration stressed the importance of all persons becoming interested in self-preservation and becoming aware that many lives can be saved through first aid work.

DEMONSTRATIONS given by the group were on artificial respiration and shock care administered by one person to another, by one persons to two others at the same time, the same service as administered to an expectant mother, the "half moon" method for tiny children, the use of leg splints, lower arm fracture splints made of newspapers, two methods of removing persons from smoke-filled rooms, the use of improvised stretchers. The demonstration ended with the auditorium being dark-

ened for a special disaster scene and an explanation of the reasons certain articles are worn by the groups and the use to which wearers put the articles.

Appearing in the groups in addition to Eagle were Stanley Youngheim, Mrs. Frank Hromada, Mr. Herbert Cecil, Mr. and Mrs. C. Leighton, Hubert Choate, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Fuchs, Mrs. Paul Lynn and Mrs. Lloyd Lorenzen, all of Reno; Martin Graham and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Tammen, Yukon.

Mrs. John Bridges led the devotions for the meeting, Susan Thompson led group singing, Mr. Fred Tech presented special music and Mrs. Pete Dillard, treasurer reported a balance of \$307, the money to be used for a new back drop curtain in the school auditorium.

The fifth and sixth grades, taught by Howe, had the largest number of parents in attendance—45 percent—and will receive an award. Third and fourth grade mothers served refreshments.
