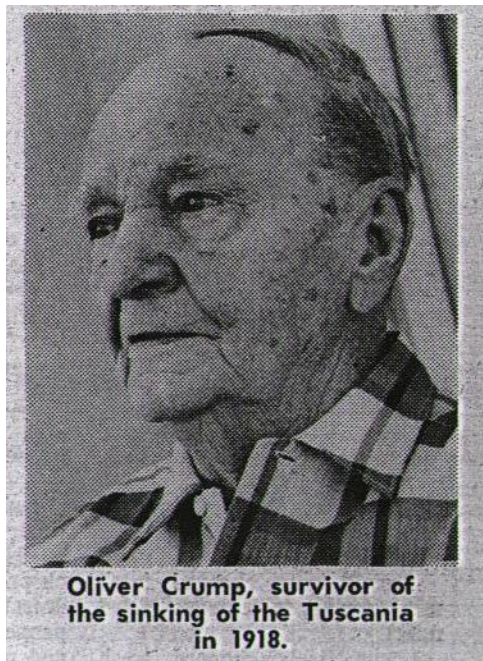

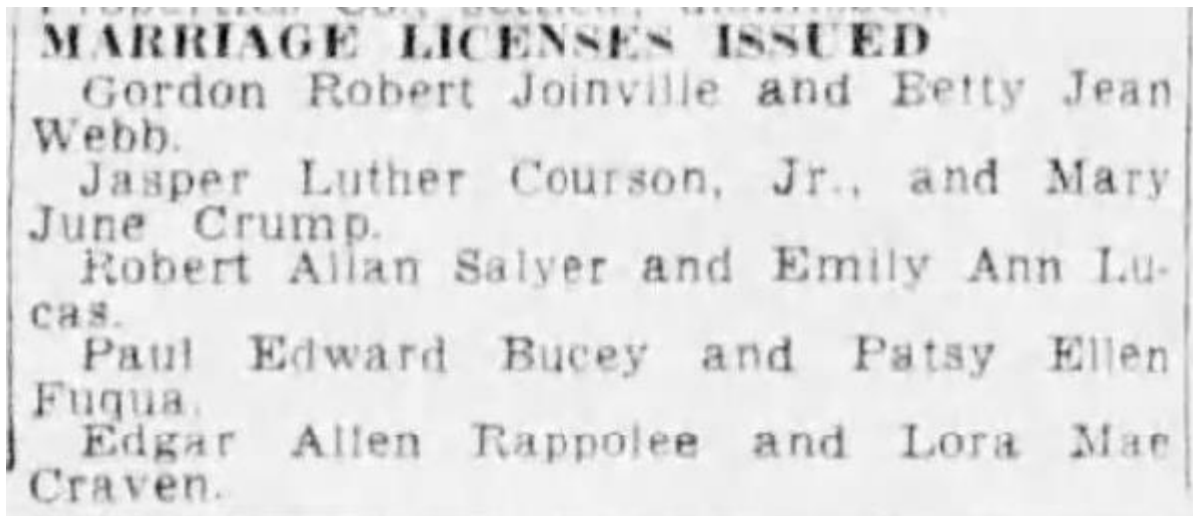

Wartime:

“Fort Worth (TX) Star-Telegram” 11 Feb 1918 p 7 – announced today as a survivor: Oliver F. Crump, Stamford TX.

Post-war:

“Abilene (TX) Reporter-News” 10 Aug 1933 p 2 – Vernon D. Hart Post 100, American Legion of Stamford, installed its new officers. One of the delegates to the state convention in Wichita Falls TX is O.F. Crump.

“Daily Camera” (Boulder CO) 4 Feb 1968 p. 8 – although 50 years later, Oliver Crump can still hear the sounds & recall the sights of the “terrible night” when he stood on the deck of a British destroyer & watched the ship he had been on, the “Tuscania” sink slowly into the Atlantic Ocean. “I can still hear that whistle blowing and the bell ringing.” As the ship sunk, the whistle & bell, which had sounded constantly since the ship was hit by a German torpedo 4 hours earlier, were silenced. Fire, which had been leaping from the two smokestacks, went out. A heavy silence descended. Almost 300 were dead [i.e. 215] & the 2,000 survivors could not forget the panic & disaster. “I dreamed about it the other night,”

said 76-year-old Crump, a retired restaurant operator. He came to Boulder CO 5 years ago from TX to live with his daughter, Mrs. Howard Cox, 440 Japonica Way, and her family. After suffering a stroke 4 years ago, he moved into Mesa Vista Sanatorium, where he currently lives.

Crump went through the rest of WWI, was part of the force occupying Germany & lived 50 years after the sinking without having another experience to equal that of 5 Feb 1918. The *Tuscania* sailed 20 Jan 1918 [i.e. 24 Jan 1918] with 2,156 Americans [i.e. 2179]. It also carried war supplies. "I counted the trains they unloaded. There were 14 complete trains; one whole train of nothing but bacon, and another of just airplane parts." It also had supply wagons & 30 mules. It joined a convoy of 14 vessels at Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. Seventeen days later the passengers sighted the northern coast of Ireland & turned south toward Liverpool, England. They expected to dock the next morning. They had been in the torpedo zone for some time & all the men were edgy, thinking every time a hard wave hit the ship that this was it. "Those submarines were as thick as hops."

But two hours later in the gathering dusk, the torpedo hit the ship's engine room "and set the four hour nightmare in motion."

"I was laying on my bunk when we were hit. All I could do was to begin trying to think how I was going to get out of this. I had no hope of getting out of it alive. So many of the men jumped overboard, but I was afraid to jump because I couldn't swim. Some of the corporals were taking whole squads overboard. The captain was trying to keep them from it, but they jumped anyway. As it turned out, the worst thing you could do was jump. You didn't have a chance then. The men who jumped overboard were drowned." When the ship was hit, men were told it would sink in about 10 minutes. "They just went wild. You couldn't control them."

Lifeboats were pushing off without being full, and many men were left aboard. Although the British destroyer pulled alongside & got some of them off, "a great number of men went down with the ship." [not quite accurate] "The lifeboat I was in carried 24 men, but we only had about 10." It was already dark when they got in the water in the boat but they could hear men screaming & hollering for help. They picked up the few they could find, including a lieutenant with a broken leg.

When he got on the destroyer, "They gave us all a drink of Scotch when we got onboard." The men were taken to Londonderry, Ireland. Some of the lifeboats made it to the Scottish coast where they were broken against the cliffs. One boat, with 50 survivors, was picked up by another British ship 18 miles west of where the *Tuscania* sank. [Tide & wind actually carried lifeboats to the east] About 50 bodies were buried in Scotland [higher amount]. The *Tuscania* survivors were celebrated up & down England, with the biggest celebration the "Gala Matinee" sponsored by the Palace Patrons Wounded Entertainment Fund, at the Southampton Palace. The Prince of Wales [now the Duke of Windsor since his abdication] was on hand to greet survivors. For many years after the war, the *Tuscania* survivors held first annual, and then occasional, reunions. Captain Wilhelm Meyer of the German U-boat

attended the reunion in 1933. [he did not attend then & never did] "He was a very friendly fellow," said Crump.

Obituary:

"Corpus Christi [TX] Caller-Times" 10 Mar 1969 p 12 - age 79, former resident of Corpus Christi until moving to Boulder CO 1961. Came to Corpus Christi in the 1940s, civilian employee at Naval Air Station before moving to Boulder. Survived by daughter June (Mrs. Howard) Cox of Boulder. Funeral 12 Mar Boulder CO.
