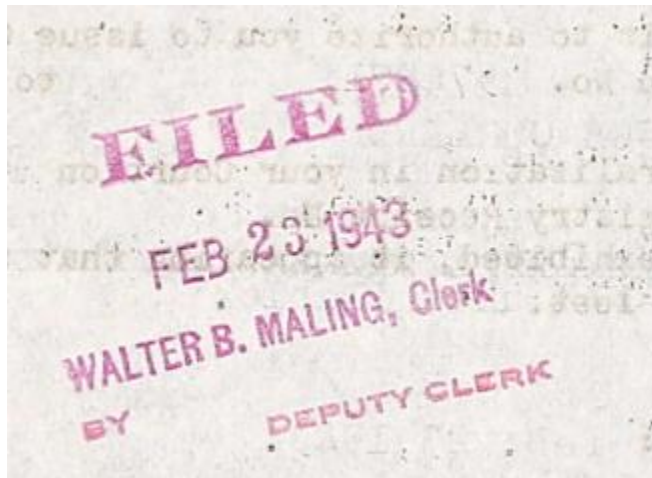

The Curland family, which came to this country only recently from Russia, locating at Dayton, moved to this city late Tuesday, taking rooms on West Sixth street. Wednesday Max and Joseph started out with a capital of five cents each. They purchased newspapers, and, after disposing of them, reinvested their funds. At the close of the day Max had 45 cents and his youthful brother, aged five years, had 18 cents, the net profits of the day being 53 cents.

Dreamy Joseph Curland, a 12-year-old youth living at 1114 Chestnut street, dreamed not of roundups and bandit raids as he lay in a cell at police station Monday night.

Joe has been in the habit of spending most of his time in atmospheric realms where "the drop" and the ready trigger are law. He meandered up a Baptistown street late Monday, lightly twirling a revolver on his right forefinger.

He stubbed his toe against a cactus plant, in the Baptisttown vernacular an alley apple, and fell into the arms of a policeman.

When Joe's father was notified he reasoned that a night in an iron-barred camp would do the lad good and the "ayes" had it, as Joe was not called in to vote on the question before the house.

Joe Curland, Formerly of 717 Upper Ninth Street, on Torpedoed Ship—Fate Unknown

A former Evansville lad was on board the ill-fated Tuscania. His fate is unknown.

He was Joe Curland, 18 years old, who formerly made his home with his mother, Esther Curland, 717 Upper Ninth street. Young Curland enlisted last August at the regular army station and was assigned to the infantry.

When he went to the army his mother broke up housekeeping and went first to French Lick, thence to Indianapolis, according to stories told by her former neighbors. Her address in Indianapolis is unknown.

The family came here from Russia when Curland was very young. His father died some years ago. Curland was a laborer before he entered the service.

Edward McKenzie of Upton, Posey county, was also on the Tuscania, according to the belief of relatives.

**EIGHTEEN-YEAR-OLD JOSEPH CURLAND ESCAPES WHEN
HUNS SINK TRANSPORT AND STANDS READY TO
MARCH ON KAISER'S FORCES**

RAN AWAY FROM HOME TO AID U. S.

Eighteen years old and a fightin' son-of-a-gun, that's Joseph Curland, of Evansville, one of the lads being transported across the Atlantic on the Tuscania when that ship was struck and sunk by a Hun torpedo. How Curland escaped is not known here, but he is in Europe and more anxious than ever to get a "crack" at the Kaiser.

The boy was born and raised in the city and formerly lived with his parents at 1114 Chestnut street. A year ago his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Curland, moved to Cleveland, O., and the lad remained here, living with his brother, David Curland, 58 Gordon street. Shortly after Uncle Sam declared war on Germany young Curland became restless. One day he disappeared and three months later his folks received this word:

"I am going across and help the United States whip Germany."

Although but 17 years old at that time, he had enlisted in the infantry and was making good as a soldier. He has continued to make good.

The boy's parents now live at 5815 Griswald avenue, Cleveland, O.

The missive is written on Y. M. C. A. stationery of the English army and is interesting in itself, with its two triangles in either corner and two light pieces of artillery being the other decorative effects with this wording.

"For God, For King and For Country. Y. M. C. A., H. M. Forces on Active Service. Patron Y. M. C. A., H. M. The King. Patron Military Camp Department, H. R. H. Duke of Connaught."

The letter was dated Feb. 16. It was received just recently.

Joe Curland is a lad hardly 16. He has been in the service since last summer and in former letters wrote that he liked the life fine.

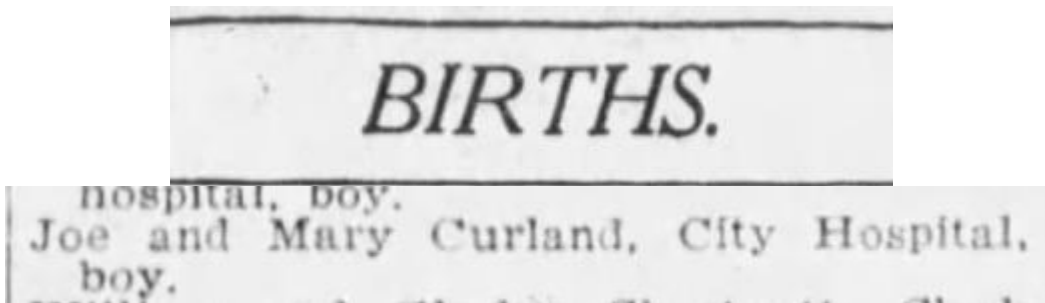

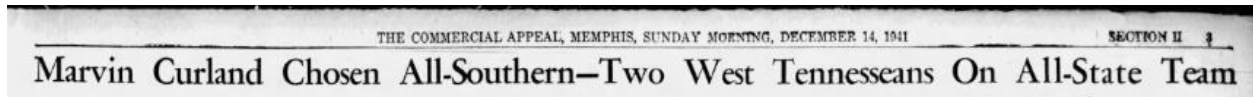

Alvin Ray stood and visited in the back of the room. The 1951 graduate was at the first class dinner.

"We all come from South Memphis," he said. "Everybody knew just about everybody."

Hungary, no occupation) lived with wife Sophie (43 NY, bookkeeper, retail laundry) & a lodger [actually her sister] Edith [Paul] Konowitz, 38 NY. - **Leon Kurland.** Not listed with the rest of the children in the 1910 census so apparently born thereafter. Resident of Argentina in 1964 (according to a newspaper account copied above) & 1973 (in Buenos Aires, Argentina, according to his sister Sadie's obituary).

Notes:

The birthplace of the Curland children was Bialystok (Bialystock, Bialystoff, etc.) which at the time was in the nation of Russia. It is now (2025) in the nation of Poland, lying east of Warsaw. The Russian census of 1897 showed that the population of Bialystok was 63% Jewish. In June 1906, a pogrom (violence against Jews) was conducted in Bialystok in response to Jewish anarchistic actions. There were 81 to 88 Jews killed & 80 wounded. The Czarist government placed Bialystok under martial law from September 1905 & Mar 1906. On 11 Jun 1906, the town's police chief, sympathetic toward the Jews, was murdered. Joe's brother Michel arrived in the US in 1905; his father Isaac also stated he arrived in 1905.

Varying reports indicate he immigrated in 1904, 1907 or 1908. According to his naturalization request in San Francisco CA in Feb 1943, Joe had entered the US aboard the "Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm" in NYC on 2 Nov 1908. He had served in the US Army as of 22 Nov 1942, with serial number 34480240. Joe was a subject of Russia & a resident of Sunflower, Sunflower Co. MS, age 41, father of 2 children but not married. He had been born in Bialystock, Russia,, was 5'9" and 175 pounds with a scar under his left ear.

Was one of the youngest soldiers on board the Tuscania.

A newspaper article claims Joe was one of 18 "Hebrews" aboard the ship.

"Evansville (IN) Press" 9 Feb 1918 p 4 – Joe Curland, age 18, formerly of 717 S. 9th St., Evansville IN, reported on board. Enlisted in the regular Army when his mother Mrs. Esther Curland moved to Indianapolis IN.

"Evansville (IN) Press" 11 Feb 1918 p 7 – Among those not accounted for: Joe Curland, formerly of 717 S. 9th St., Evansville. He is listed on records as aboard Tuscania.

"Portage (WI) Daily Register" 11 Feb 1918 p 1 – [to add to the misidentification of his home state of IN as MD, now he's from WI!] Among the WI men missing on the Tuscania: Joe Curland.

"Indianapolis (IN) Star" 17 Feb 1918 p 1 – On 16 Feb 1918 in Washington DC, 11 survivors who were previously unreported were announced as survivors. Pvt. Joe Curland of Evansville IN was not listed previously as 1 of the IN men on board.

"Greenwood (MS) Commonwealth" 27 Feb 1918 p 9 – "Young Hebrew Among Last to be Reported Saved" - Joe Curland, 817 Apple St., Evansville IN, the brother of Mrs. S. Seigel of Greenwood MS was reported rescued on the last list of survivors issued Monday, 25 Feb 1918. "Curland was among the 18 Hebrews who were saved." He enlisted last summer at age 16 years "with some difficulty." He is the brother-in-law of S. Seigel, associated with the Smith Bros. Grocery Store.

"Delta Democrat-Times" (Greenville MS) 12 Nov 1959 p 13 – Army Specialist 4 Matthew D. Curland, 24, is involved in a 5-week large-scale field training exercise with the 3rd Armored Division in Wildflecken, Germany, which will end 20 Nov. Matthew is a 1954 graduate of

Southside High School in Memphis TN. He attended Memphis State University. His father Joseph Curland lives in Sunflower MS.
