Former Tulsa Deputy Dead

R. L. Carter Funeral Will Be at Sperry

Raymond L. Carter, former Tulsa County deputy sheriff, died of cancer Sunday night at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Angelita Ann Andrews, Sperry, after an illness of four months.

Mr. Carter, 69, served as a deputy under former Sheriffs George Blaine and Bill Field. Earlier, he was a guard at the Mid-Continent Petroleum Corp. refinery and Spartan Aircraft Co.

A native of Fredonia, Kan., he lived in the Sperry area 40 years, received the Purple Heart for wounds suffered in action in France during World War I and was a member of the Galentine-Price American Legion Post, Skiatook.

Also surviving are another daughter, Mrs. Rita Hisaw, 9126 E. Seventh St.; two brothers, Earl, 1645 E. Marshall St., and Corla, Duncan, and three sisters.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Wednesday in the First Christian Church, Sperry. Burial will be in Rest Haven Cemetery there under direction of the Rogers Funeral Home, Skiatook.

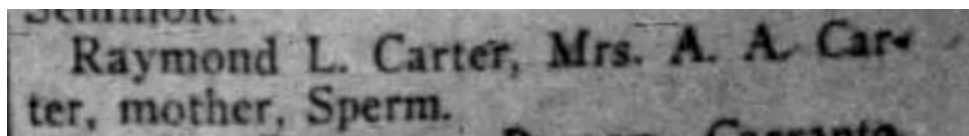

August 12, 1918.

Mr. Joe Harshbarger,
Sperry, Okla.

Dear Friend:—I received your third letter and was glad to hear from you. Say you mentioned about the old 9th having such a good history and record. They have made some record over here too, and "I Co.," the one I am in, was the first company in the A. E. F. if not the only one to be decorated with the Gold Leaf.

We were there when they started the big drive. We went over the top at daybreak and we chased them back seven or eight miles before we halted. I had an automatic rifle and maybe you think I didn't get it hot. I fired 252 rounds before 9 o'clock. You had ought to have seen them stick up their hands and yell kame-rad, those who were not lying on the ground dead. I suppose you have been reading lots about it. It was in the Chateau-Thierry and Soissons district.

You ask me if I had a French sweetheart yet or if I could talk French. No, I haven't a sweetheart nor I can't talk French. I have been too busy at the front. I was through Paris a few weeks ago. There was sure lost of them there and it is sure some city.

Joe tell all of the boys that we can get all the beer and wines that we want over here. The cafes are all open to us boys when we come to town.

Mother told me that my old boss had died. I don't know what I will do when I get back home.

You asked me if we celebrated the Fourth of July. Yes, we threw over a barrage but they returned it with a gas barrage and I sat in my dugout for two hours with my gas mask on, but it wasn't any joke or celebration.

On the 18th of July it was all business. I can tell you my experiences on the Tuscania and a lot more about this fight when I see you. I have sure had my part of it since I have been over here. I got hit on the shoulder with a piece of shrapnel and two machine gun bullets through my leggings, so you see I was lucky.

Well I will close for this time and hope to hear from you soon with all the news.

July 27, 1918.

Dear Mother and All:

I will now answer your letter. I was at the front when I received your three letters, the first I had from home since the 23rd of Dec. Was glad to hear from you once more. I got a letter from Sleta last week but have not heard from anyone else.

I was in that big drive that started July 18th. I suppose you have read lots about it. Believe me, it was some drive too. The Boche drove like a bunch of wild cattle but we captured several thousand of them at that, besides the ones that we left lying on the battle field. Believe me, it was a sight worth crossing the ocean to see. I was lucky; only got one small bump

on the arm and did not have to go to the hospital. We completely surprised the Boche. We went clear back to their kitchens before a halt. Their breakfast was all ready when we got there but we just went on and on capturing guns and ammunition of all kinds. You ought to have heard the barrage they put over the morning we went over the top. It seemed like a cannon was stationed at every tree but the airplanes did good work. They stayed over us all the time and gave signals all the while. Believe me, it was some big job but we made a good job of it. Write and tell me if you saw anything about it in the papers.

Well, write to me again for I do love to get letters from someone at home. I am going to write to brother Earl tomorrow. I don't know what part of France he is in. I may never get to see him over here. I wish he was in the artillery instead of the trench mortar for the American artillery is sure good. Tell Mr. McNeel to write to me. I have just received a letter from Mr. Lee and one from the I. O.

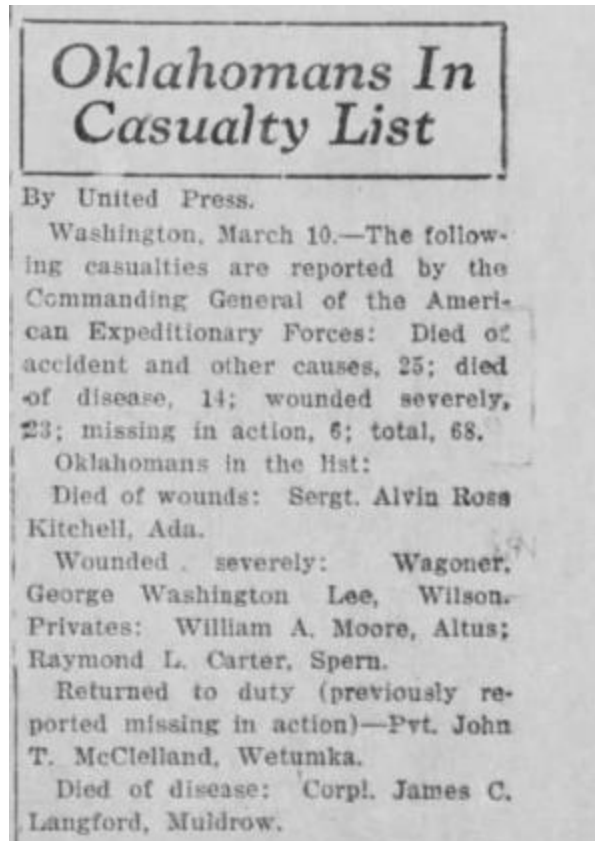

body to write and don't wait for me to write for there is lots of the time I am so busy I can't write, so good by, as ever,

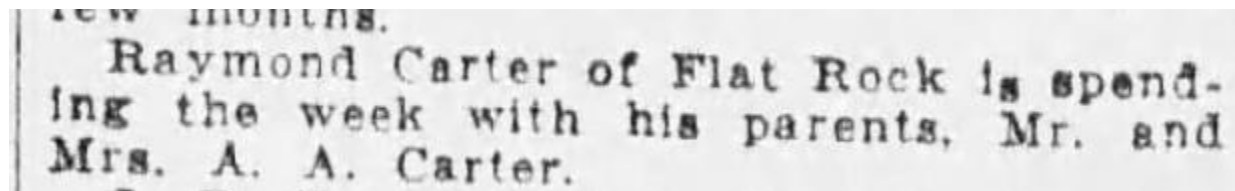

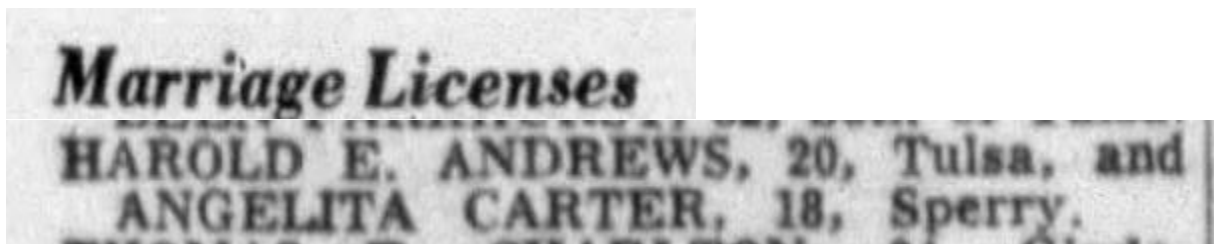
Each girl has a 3.7 average which makes her eligible for this honor.

Father of Local Woman Passes Away at Sperry

A.A. Carter, father of Mrs. J. D. Robinson, died early this morning at the home of his son Raymond Carter in Sperry, Okla., following an illness of only two days with a cold. He was 85 years old.

Surviving children, besides Mrs. Robinson and the son Raymond are two other daughters, Mrs. J. L. Henson of Shidler and Mrs. C. E. Nicholson of Tulsa, also three other sons, Ellis of Barnsdall, Earl of Skiatook and Corla of Carter Nine.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2:30 in Sperry at the Baptist church. Interment will be in the Sperry cemetery beside his wife who preceded him in death five years ago lacking two weeks.

Sperry Pioneer Dies, Rites to Be Wednesday

Funeral rites for Alexander A. Carter, 85, pioneer Oklahoma settler, who died Monday at his home in Sperry, will be conducted at 2:30 p. m. Wednesday at the Church of God in Sperry. Burial will also be in Sperry.

Carter's death was caused by infirmities of age complicated by pneumonia. Born in Greenville, Tenn., he came west in a covered wagon more than 50 years ago. He lived for several years in Kansas, and in 1893 made the run into the Cherokee strip. Later he moved his family to Osage county, where he engaged in farming, and in 1914 he went to Sperry.

Survivors include three daughters, Mrs. C. E. Nicholson of 1221 E. Fifth st., Mrs. J. D. Robinson of Pawhuska, and Mrs. Joe Henson of Shidler, and four sons, Corla Carter of Shidler, Ellis Carter of Barnsdall, Raymond Carter of Sperry, and Earl Carter of Skiatook.

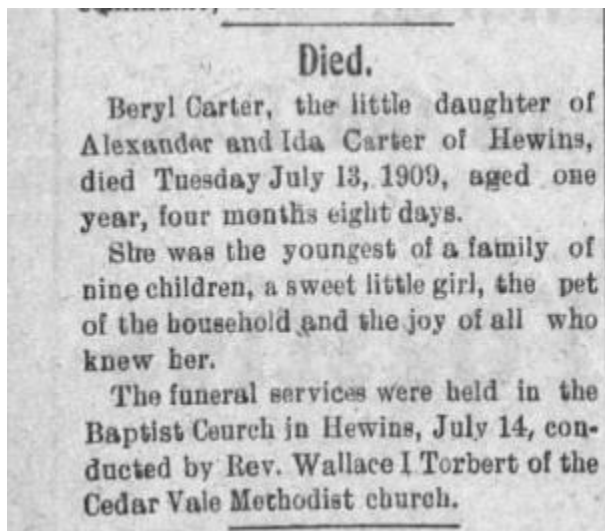

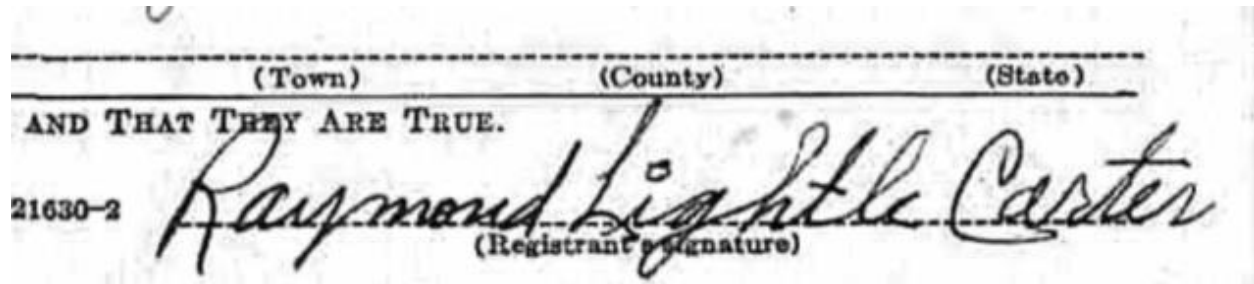
Next-of-kin on “Tuscania”: mother Mrs. A.A. Carter, Sperrn (sic/Sperry) OK

Returned from war on: "Von Steuben" Apr 1919, "cases requiring no dressing"

Sailed on return ship as: Raymond Carter

Next-of-kin on return ship & rank: mother Mrs. R. Carter, Sperry OK (pvt, Inf)

World War I draft registration (1917): as Raymond L. Carter - b. 17 Mar 1887 Hadyma (spelling?) Co. (believe this is Hodgeman Co.) KS; res: Sperry OK. Single. Oil laborer, Sperry Oil Gas Co. / Tulsa Co. Claims exemption from draft due to dependent mother & father. The registrar's note: "Two other brothers over 21 at home and mother keeps roomers. Thinks he furnished part of most of support."

World War II draft registration (1942): as Raymond Lytle [but smudged writing] Carter on top line but signed Raymond Lightle Carter - b. 17 Mar 1887 Jetmore (which is in Hodgeman Co.) KS; res: Sperry OK. NOK Hope Carter, Sperry, Tulsa OK. Unemployed. Height: 6'1", 158 lbs.

Mother: Ida May Charter Carter, 27 Jan 1862 McDougal Co. IL – 6 Feb 1932 Sperry, Tulsa OK. Daughter of Nathan Jackson Charter & Sarah R. Hardesty.

Parents' marriage: 29 Dec 1881 Mayville, Nodaway MO

Spouse: Hope Ann Andrew Carter, 17 Dec 1895 San Sebastian, Biscay, Spain (also found as Cuba; she was a Cuban national when she entered the US) – 27 Mar 1963 Claremore, Rogers OK (at the home of her daughter, Ruth Carter Hisaw).

“Hope Ann” is the Anglicized version of her birth name: Esperanza Andreau e Yturrizo.

Daughter of Jose & Sopha E. Andreau.

Esperanza Andreu arrived in US in 1918 aboard SS “Miami” which left Havana, Cuba, on 24 Jul 1918. Her nationality was Cuban; she listed her birthplace as Nermani, Spain. The ship arrived in Key West FL on 26 Jul 1918. She had been a resident of Carnaguey, Cuba & was headed to Cleveland OH.

Esperanza Andreu, age 30, also arrived in Key West FL on the same ship – SS “Miami” on 28 Jun 1926 Key West FL, “name now Carter, Hope Ann” – record of lawful entry for permanent residence 18 Feb 1946. [This arrival date in the US is 3 days before her marriage.]

Buried in Sperry Rest Haven Cemetery, Black Dog township, Osage OK.

Spouse Find A Grave: 15942643

Marriage: 1 Jul 1926 Rogers Co. OK – Raymond Carter, age 38, b. KS, resident Burbank, Osage OK & Hope Andrew, age 30, b. Cuba, resident Tulsa, Tulsa OK. Married by a justice of the peace in Claremore, Rogers OK. One of the witnesses was Sophia E. Ofandrews [sic] of Havana, Cuba. [appears to be her mother]

- Rita M. Carter Hisaw, 24 Apr 1927 Sperry, Tulsa OK - 12 Apr 2018 Honolulu, Honolulu Co. HI. – Listed as age 2 years 1 month in 1930 census (2 Apr 1930) - Married Jack Edward Hisaw (4 Aug 1926 Skiatook, Osage OK – 26 Feb 2018 Honolulu, Honolulu HI, F: 240140312) on 21 Dec 1946 in Tulsa Co. OK. Jack died less than 2 months before Rita did. Obituary: “Honolulu Star-Advertiser” 20 Apr 2018 p B7 – Rita M. Hisaw, age 92, of Honolulu, d. 12 Apr 2018 in Honolulu. Survived by son Kevin Hisaw. They both were apparently buried at sea. F” 240140195
- Ida S. Carter, ca. Mar 1930 OK – Age 1 month in 1930 census (2 Apr 1930) but not listed in 1940 census. The 1930 age “may” be written over with a capital D – for dead? Deceased?
- Angelita Ana Carter Andrews, 7 Apr 1937 OK (age 3 years in 1940 census) – She was 1 of 3 tied for salutatorian in the 1955 class of Sperry (OK) High School. In Jul 1955, Angelita Carter, age 18, of Sperry OK, applied for a marriage license with Harold Edward Andrews, age 20, of Tulsa OK. Harold was born 28 Jun 1935 OK. Both appear to be residents of Tulsa OK as of Jun 2024.

Siblings:

- Ellis Jackson Carter, 13 Dec 1882 KS – 17 Jan 1948 south of Talala, Rogers OK. Married 20 May 1922 in Tulsa, Tulsa OK to Bessie Mae Williams (1906 MO, 1989 OK, F: 10259145), daughter of Roy & Ina Williams. Bessie later married John W. (Bill) Christian (1906-1993). - Buried in Sperry Rest Haven Cemetery, Black Dog township, Osage OK. F: 16124922

- George W. Carter, 28 Feb 1884 Republic Co. KS [according to his obituary] – 18 Dec 1914. Tombstone reads: son of A.A. & I.M. Carter. Obituary said died accidentally in OK. Buried in DeBusk Cemetery, Chautauqua Co. KS [as is sister Beryl]. F: 19518511
- Lois Bell Carter Henson, 15 Jul 1889 KS (Find A Grave erroneously lists IL) – 26 Jul 1957 Tucson, Pima AZ. Wife of Joseph Louis (Joe) Henson (1891-1958, F: 6137379). Obituary: “Arizona Daily Sun” (Tucson AZ) 27 Jul 1958 p 8 – Lois B. Henson, age 68, a Tucson resident for 9 years, moving here from KS, d. 26 Jul 1957 in a local hospital. Survived by her husband Joseph, a daughter & 2 brothers: Earl Carter (Tulsa OK) & Corla Carter (Duncan OK) & 2 sisters: Mrs. Sleta Nichelson (Oakland CA) & Mrs. Grace Robinson (Santa Rosa CA). Body will be taken to Skiatook OK for burial. – Buried in Sperry Rest Haven Cemetery, Black Dog township, Osage OK. F: 16137386
- Lola Grace Carter Robinson, 16 Feb 1891 Elgin, Chautauqua KS – 31 Mar 1987 Bellingham, Whatcom WA. SSN 536-16-9420. Wife of Jenner Dickenson Robison (1893-1972, F: 7823759) whom she married 1 Jul 1915 in Tulsa Co. OK. Buried in Bayview Cemetery, Bellingham, Whatcom WA. F: 128794161
- Earl Peter Carter, 24 Feb 1895 Elgin, Chautauqua KS – 20 May 1985 Skiatook, Osage OK. Husband of Nola Mae Tilley (1902-1978, F: 16124944) whom he married 3 Apr 1920 in Tulsa Co. OK. Buried in Sperry Rest Haven Cemetery, Black Dog township, Osage OK. F: 16124905
- Sleta Mae Carter Smith Nichelson Kellander, 30 May 1897 KS (also found as MO) – 6 May 1975 Martin Co. MN. - SSN 440-16-8729. - Married Henry Vernon Smith (1883-1956, F: 128039716) on 2 Dec 1917 in Sebastian Co. AR. - Married to Clarence Edward Nichelson (1895-1966, F: 133435752) on 4 Nov 1925 in Tulsa OK. Divorce action to be heard 27 Jul 1940 in Tulsa, Tulsa OK. - She was divorced as of the 1940 census & living in Tulsa OK. Lived in CA (in San Leandro CA in 1955 in its city directory & in Oakland CA in Jul 1956 when sister Lois died). - Married Knute Seth Kellander (1893-1975, F: 184055283) in Martin Co. MN on 12 Mar 1969. MN death record lists mother’s maiden name as Charter. Buried in East Chain Evangelical Free Cemetery, East Chain, Martin MN. F: 184055181
- Corla Paige (“Slim”) Carter, 23 Sep 1899 Elgin, Chautauqua KS – 19 Sep 1987 Duncan, Stephens OK (or at Skiatook OK). – When he registered for the WWII draft on 16 Feb 1942, Corla lived in St. Elmo, Fayette IL & worked for the Pipeline Service Co. - His record on Find A Grave says he was the youngest of 8 children [which skipped his younger sister Beryl] & was preceded in death by 4 brothers (Ellis, George, Raymond, Earl Carter) & 3 sisters: Grace, Lois, Sleta. - Married Ada Hughes (1899-1982, F: 145893845) at Chandler OK on 10 Jun 1927. – Buried in Duncan Memorial Cemetery, Duncan, Stephens OK. F: 96320538
- Beryl Carter, 5 Mar 1908 KS – 13 Jul 1909 KS. Female; identified as “daughter” in her obituary. Buried in DeBusk Cemetery, Chautauqua Co. KS [as is brother George]. F: 19518509
