Retired Fireman's Five Sons in the Army Castillo Boys to Fight for Their Country

Here are four of five sons of Leo M. Castillo, retired fireman of the San Francisco Department, who are in the Army of the United States. The fifth son, Bert, left for Camp Lewis, Sunday.



LEO M. CASTILLO, a retired fireman of the San Francisco Fire Department, of 311 Scott street has a service flag with five stars, representing five sons in the United States Army.

Earl, 25 years old, is a member of the 100th Aero Squadron and is in a training camp in England, waiting to go to France. Two of the boys, Melville J., 18 years old, and Milton H., 20 years old, are in the Grizzlies, California's own regiment, and are in training at Camp Kearny. Lester J., 27 years old, is in the 62d Regiment, coast artillery, and is stationed at the Presidio. Bert, who is 30 years old, left on Sunday for Camp Lewis with San Francisco's contingent for the National Army.

All of the boys were born and educated in San Francisco. Earl and Lester were associated in the firm of

Castillo Brothers, butchers, 305 Divisadero street, and gave up their business to enlist last August. Melville and Milton, both graduates of Sacred Heart College, enlisted in the Grizzlies after the close of the college last summer. Bert, who has a ranch near Turlock, which he manages, was called under the selective draft and put in no claim for exemption.

Three sisters, Mrs. Amiel Healand of Seattle, Mrs. R. A. Bush Jr., 659 Noe street, and Miss Gertrude Castillo, who is the only child left at

home, are enthusiastic workers in the Red Cross and war relief work. An older brother, Leo E., is married and lives at 418 Nineteenth avenue.

Mrs. Leo M. Castillo, mother of the boys, died about seven years ago. "How proud she would have been," said Mrs. Bush yesterday, "if she had lived to see her boys fighting for their country!"

**Nine-Lived Aviator
Cheats Death Thrice;
Has Six Yet to Go**



The kaiser will have a hard time getting this lad. Like the proverbial cat, he seems to have nine lives.

Earl Castillo was a young butcher of San Francisco before he enlisted in the 109th Aero Squadron. Even before he went to France he narrowly escaped death three times. He received his training at Fort Sam Houston and received his first thrill, one night when he was picked up tent, kit and all, by a cyclone and carried half a mile. His second experience was a tumble in an aeroplane flight in New York when he crashed into a house without any serious injury with the exception of a sprained ankle. Third he was one of the boys on the Tuscania. He was on the boat four hours after she was torpedoed before taken off.

Earl is one out of five boys in the Castillo family who have enlisted in the service. Two are with the "Grizzlies" one is in the Coast artillery at San Francisco and another at Camp Lewis.

Here's one of our fighting lads who can scoff at Hun bombs, laugh at Boche bayonets, pooh pooh German gas and everything else in the man-killing line.

The Kaiser isn't going to get him because, like the proverbial cat, he seems to have nine lives.

He is Earl Castillo, a young San Francisco butcher, who joined the One Hundredth Aero Squadron and, even before reaching France, has peered three times into the face of grim death and given him the ha-ha.



Castillo received his flying training at Fort Sam Houston. He got his first thrill one night when a tornado hopped into his camp, picked him and tent and kit and lots of other things up and tossed him a quarter of a mile into a flock of Texas cactus and miscellaneous scenery. He got up unhurt, if you don't count a skinned arm or two.

Fate speeded up, moved him to Long Island, New York, where he was given further training with the aeroplane. One day, in a bad wind, his machine became unmanageable and he took a wild header for mother earth. The plane smashed into a house, musing up its architecture but not his anatomy. Casualties: One sprained ankle.

Naturally, then, Castillo had to be one of the boys on the Tuscania. It took the transport four hours to sink after the submarine torpedoed her. Castillo was on her three hours before being taken off. He hardly got his clothes wet. They landed him in England and he was given a royal time. By this time, his folks say, he ought to be on the firing line.

He ought to have a joyful time, for it's a cinch that none of the Teuton "Archies" will ever get within hailing distance of this bird-man with his charmed existence. That grin of his looks like a good luck horseshoe, eh?

Castillo's father has the distinction of having given five of his six sons to the cause. Two are with the "Grizzlies," the crack California field artillery regiment; one is in the Coast Artillery at the San Francisco Presidio; another is at Camp Lewis.

Cyclers to Compete Sunday

PIERCE TROPHY AT STAKE

THE Pierce Trophy Race, one of the biggest cycling events of the season, will be contested over the famous San Leandro course next Sunday. The racers will be on their marks promptly at 1:30 p. m. to catch the signal to start, and it will be a scorching affair. For a month or more the bike riders have been training for this important event and

the teams were selected only after the closest sort of competition. That the contestants will be fit to ride for their lives goes without saying. Three clubs representing as many cities will have teams in the race, viz.: Garden City of San Jose, New Century of San Francisco and Acme of Oakland. The teams will each consist of ten of their fastest riders, not including substitutes.

The race will be run in heats, the riders starting away five minutes apart. The length of the course is 8 1/2 miles.

The team making the fastest time will be declared the winner, and if the Centuries add another win to their two they will be the permanent owners of the trophy.

The other clubs have one win each and will put up a strong fight to beat the Centuries. The course is in the shape of a triangle. It starts several blocks outside of San Leandro, then along the carline or main road as far as Hairpin turn and then to Tank corner and back to San Leandro. The New Centuries will be represented by such riders as W. Hammit, F. Murray, H. Born, Earl Castillo and G. Holmes. The Garden Cities will enter riders like N. Eisentrout, O. Inman, I. Eckman and I. Moon, while the Acemes will have Cecil Nelson, F. Hoffman, A. Hoffman and Eddie Carroll as some of their speed marvels.

The riders of each will alternate on the track, the only condition being that one or the other must be on the "grind" continuously. In case of an accident two laps are allowed for the unfortunate rider to resume his position.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Out of the war zone today came the names of hundreds of American boys saved from the torpedoed transport Tuscania, to ease anxiety in the homes of this country. The names are now being sent across the water in a steady stream, and as rapidly as possible are being compiled for publication. Not until the entire list is in will the war department be able to check up and determine those who gave up their lives.

Twenty-five thousand new members in 1940!

This is the goal of the Department of California of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. With Harold B. Lull, department commander, leading the drive, every V. F. W. post in the State is attempting to go over its quota.

In a recent circular, mailed to families of veterans who saw service overseas or in foreign waters, the V. F. W. points out the value of membership in the organization. Help in obtaining needed medical service and hospitalization, and in obtaining other rights and privileges accorded veterans is described as one advantage of membership.

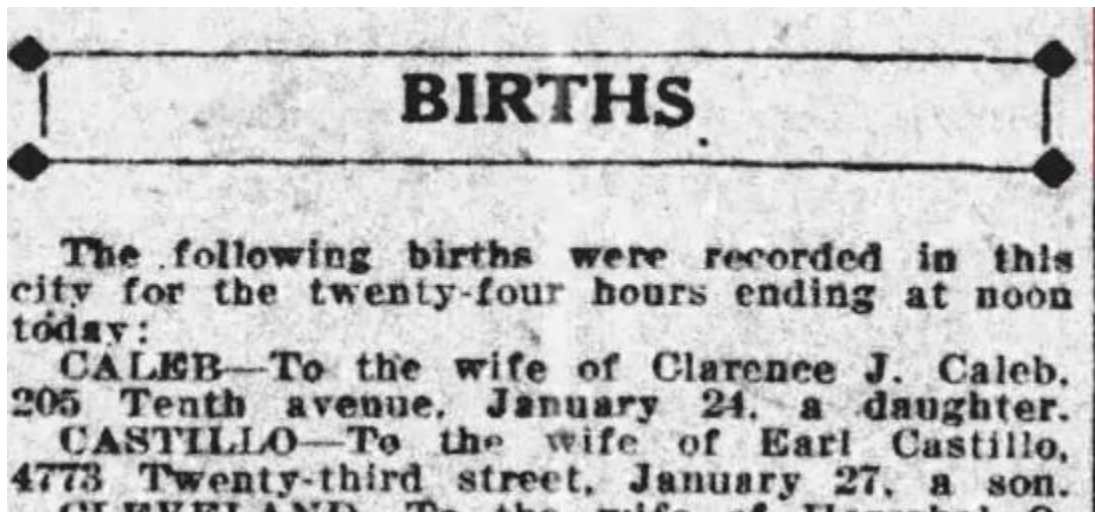

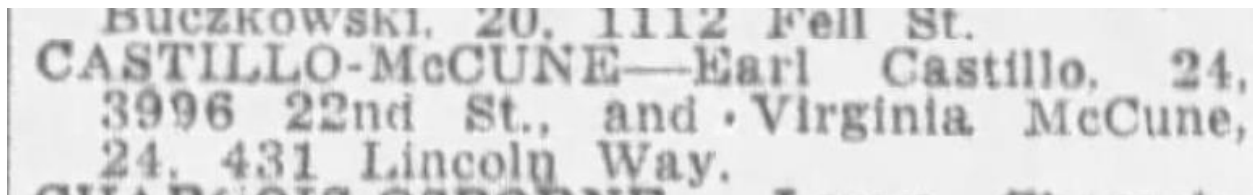

LOAN SHARK PLACED IN CUSTODY FOR EMBEZZLEMENT

Money Lender C. H. Morrell Is
Accused of Securing Salary
Demand of Fireman and
Cashing It Without Authority

Leo M. Castillo of Truck 6
Further Charges That He
Kept \$50 of Amount and
Paid \$48 to I. Franklin.

C. H. Morrell, a money lender, was arrested yesterday upon complaint of Leo M. Castillo, a fireman of Truck 6, who accuses him of embezzlement.

Attorney James M. Hanley, who represents Castillo, says that his client is another loan shark victim. "On October 2, 1901," said Hanley, "Castillo borrowed \$62.50 from Morrell, and promised to pay him interest at the rate of 10 per cent a month. On November 30, 1901, Castillo paid Morrell \$20 on the principal. Thereafter, and up to September 1, 1905, Castillo paid Morrell the regular monthly interest of \$4.25. I hold receipts showing that during that period Castillo paid Morrell a total of \$237.75 on the original loan of \$62.50.

"On September 30, 1905, Morrell went to the Auditor's office and secured Castillo's salary demand for \$98. He cashed this at the Treasurer's office. He then deducted \$50 for himself, and sent Castillo a receipt in full for his indebtedness. The remaining \$48 was paid by Morrell to I. Franklin, another money lender with whom Castillo had done business.

"Castillo claims that he never gave Morrell authority to cash his salary demand, and I am informed that the Auditor has been unable to find any such authority on file in his office. Morrell's attorney has told me that Morrell claims that he destroyed a power of attorney that he held from Costello authorizing him to cash his salary demand. We are prosecuting Morrell on the charge of embezzling the \$48 which he paid to I. Franklin. Castillo says that he never authorized Morrell to make any such use of his money."

MONEY BROKER IS SAID TO BE AN EMBEZZLER

**Morrell Accused of Paying T
Victim's Share of Month's
Salary to Fellow Vulture.**

It is claimed that C. H. Morrell has overreached himself in his profitable little business of loaning money to employees of the city and others, and then, having taken away the hide and tallow according to contract, walking away with everything else from porterhouse steaks to soup bones.

October 2, 1901, Leo M. Castillo, connected with truck 6 of the Fire Department, borrowed \$62.50 from Morrell, agreeing to repay it at the rate of \$20 a month and 10 per cent interest on deferred payments. The next month he repaid \$20, and since that time has regularly paid \$4.50 a month interest, his total payments to date amounting to \$297.75.

He claims that he never gave Morrell a power of attorney to collect his salary for him, but this seemed to be no bar to the loan shark, who, because Castillo was ill and could not come promptly to time on September 30th last, collected the \$98 due the fireman through the complaisance of some one in the Auditor's office, deducted the amount due him to square up his loan, and then turned the balance over to I. Franklin & Co., fellow-vultures of finance, to apply on a loan which Castillo had obtained from that concern.

Attorney Hanley, who has been taking care of the firemen in these matters, decided to waive the denial of Castillo that he never gave Morrell a power of attorney, and, basing his charge on the fact that the money shark failed to turn over the balance of the salary to the fireman, obtained a warrant from Police Judge Cabaniss yesterday charging Morrell with misdemeanor embezzlement.

The note which Castillo gave to Morrell is printed below to show that there is little left the fireman but his life, and even the title to that is clouded:

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., October 2, 1901.—
For value received I promise to pay to the order of myself sixty-two and 50-100 dollars as follows: \$20 on Oct. 30, '01; \$20 on Nov. 30, '01; \$22 50 on Dec. 30, '01, with interest at 10 per cent per month after maturity of each payment, at room 609, Examiner building. If any of said payments are not paid when due and payable, the whole of the principal sum then remaining unpaid shall forthwith become due and payable at the option of the holder of this note. And to secure the payment of above note I hereby authorize irrevocably any attorney of any court of record to appear for me in such court, any term, time of vacation, or before any Justice of the Peace at any time hereafter and confess judgment without process in favor of the holder of this note for such amount as may appear unpaid thereon, together with costs and ten dollars attorney's fees, and to waive and release all errors which may intervene in any such proceedings and consent to immediate execution upon such judgment, hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said attorney may do by virtue thereof.

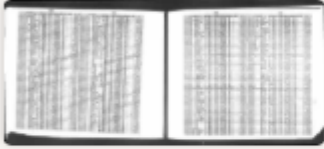

FEAR DROWNING OF FISHERMAN

Virgil Franceschi, 52 1625 North Point street, San Francisco, was believed drowned early yesterday after clinging to an overturned skiff for several hours following an accident near the mouth of Petaluma river at Black Point, Marin county.

His fishing partner, Lester J. Castillo, bay city butcher residing at 1275 23rd avenue, San Francisco, was rescued from the waters of San Pablo bay yesterday by coast guardsmen who had participated in an all-night search for the fishermen after it was reported that two men had been seen clinging to their overturned boat.

Franceschi, San Francisco liquor store owner, is believed to have drowned during the night when he lost his grip on the small capsized boat after clinging to the craft since before noon Sunday.

craft since before noon Sunday.

According to Castillo's story to officers, he and Franceschi rented the boat from Chris Warner, operator of the Little Cliff House at Black Point at 8 o'clock Sunday morning. They anchored off Black Point and started to fish. During the morning a high wind came up and roughened the bay, sending waves into their boat.

Despite frantic bailing, the craft finally swamped and they grasped the bottom, releasing the anchor, Castillo said. They drifted across the bay, several times within sight of other boats, but never within hailing distance.

During the night, Castillo said, Franceschi disappeared. Yesterday Castillo waved at planes flying overhead, and within a few minutes was picked up by a coast guard crash boat.

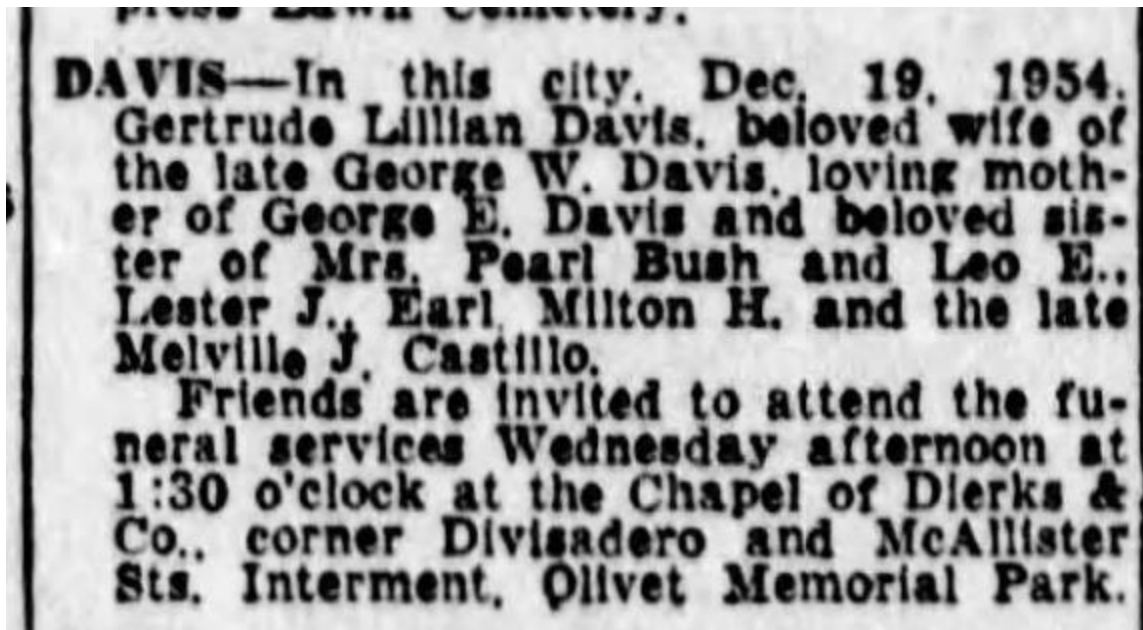

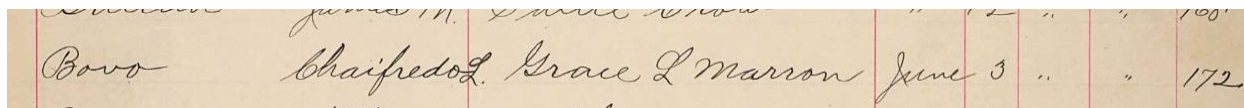

Byron Banker Suicides

**ALFRED BOVO KILLS
SELF IN BANK WHILE
TEMPORARILY INSANE**

While temporarily deranged due to overwork, Alfred Bovo, cashier of the Byron branch of the Bank of Tracy, shot and killed himself in the lavatory of the bank about 12:30 Sunday afternoon. With him at the time was his best friend, the Rev. Father J. C. McNamara, who is at a loss to account for the act except through the fact that the deceased was out of his mind at the time.

When the news of the suicide reached the directors of the institution a hurried examination was made of the books and affairs of the bank and all were found to be in perfect condition. The books were kept up to the minute and every cent was accounted for. The affairs of the bank were found to be in a very prosperous condition and the directors were at a loss to account for the rash act of the cashier.

According to the story told by Father McNamara he had walked to the Bovo home with Mr. Bovo following Mass Sunday morning. He had luncheon at the Bovo home and he and Mr. Bovo went down town together. They arrived at the bank shortly after 12 o'clock and sat down to talk for a few moments. After chatting for a while with the priest Mr. Bovo gave Father McNamara a letter which he asked him to mail. He then asked to be excused for a moment and walked into the lavatory.

An instant later Father McNamara heard a shot and rushed into the lavatory to find Mr. Bovo lying on the floor bleeding from a wound in the temple. Father McNamara hurriedly called for help but Mr. Bovo had died almost instantly.

The deceased was 32 years of age and leaves a wife and little daughter a mother, two brothers and two sis-

ters. The latter all reside in San Francisco, from which city Mr. Bovo came six years ago to take charge of the affairs of the Byron bank when it was first established. The entire community is deeply shocked over the sad death of this brilliant young man. He was highly respected throughout this section of the county and was a leader in all movements looking toward the benefit of the city and county in which he lived. His death comes as a sad blow to all who know him for he was regarded as a young man with a most brilliant future.

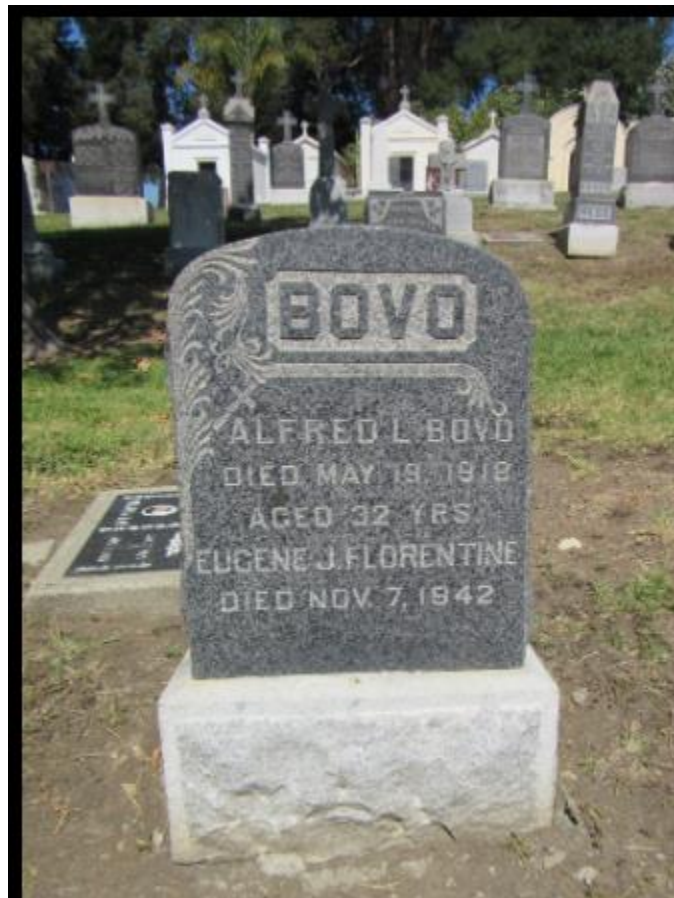

Maud Hammond Castillo sailed from Liverpool, England, on 13 May 1919 aboard the SS “Harrisburg” – arriving in NYC on 23 May 1919. This was a “Detachment of Army Officers & Enlisted Men’s Wives.” She was listed as a resident of Thetford, Norfolk, England. Her mother’s name was Annie. She had been naturalized in London Spec. [illegible] – [as were all the rest of the wives listed, presumably by marriage to their American soldier husbands.] Going to 655 [illegible, likely Noe?] in San Francisco CA.
