**RECEIVE NEW ORDER FOR
ARMY RECRUITING HERE**

A communication was received at the local army recruiting station on College street yesterday from the war department saying that hereafter recruiting for the regular army, the drafted national guardsmen, and technical units of the national army will have to be conducted through the regular recruiting channels. This means that all recruiting for the various departments of the army will be done at the army station on College street.

The order stated that it is intended to place the ~~recruiting of the national~~ guards on the same basis as that of the regular army.

Applicants accepted at the regular army recruiting stations for service in the national guard units will be sent for enlistment to regular army stations or depots. It was also stated in the message that candidates for the guard service will not be accepted in excess of the number of vacancies reported.

The following men were accepted at the army station yesterday: Benjamin E. Warren, Camden county, infantry service; James W. Martin, Reed Springs, Mo., field artillery; Walter Heston, Pleasant Hope, Mo., infantry service, and Evan W. Chase, Mountain Grove, Mo., for the aviation section of the signal corps.

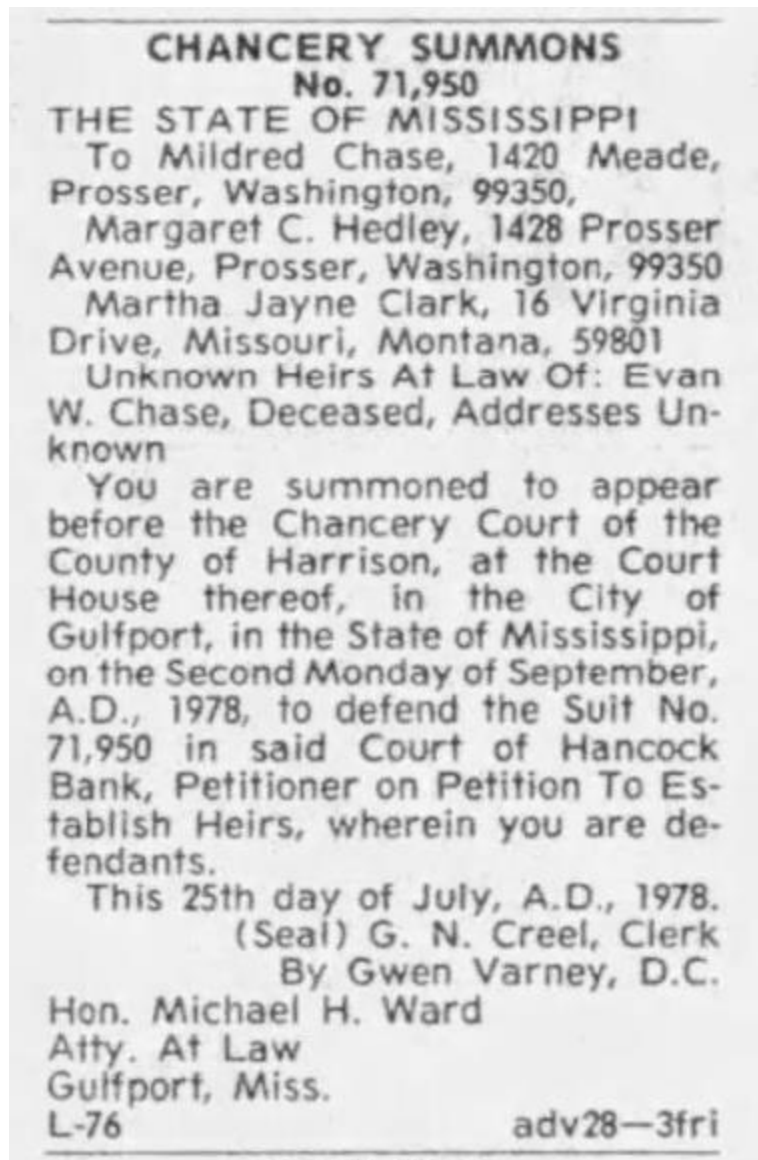

MESA, Ariz. – Paul Kenneth “Ken” Clark, 78, died Oct. 21, 1997, at Mesa Lutheran Hospital after several months of heart complications.

Ken was born Feb. 11, 1919, in Mountain Grove, Mo., to Edwin and Edna Clark. He was raised there and attended the University of Missouri and Southwest Missouri State.

He married Martha Jayne Chase on Jan. 24, 1942. They lived in Mountain Grove until he went into the new-and-used-furniture business, first in Coffeyville, Kan., and then in Joplin, Mo.

In 1947 he and the family moved to Sunnyside, Wash., where he became a cement finisher at the Hanford Atomic Plant. Upon its completion, he moved to Anaconda where he was a concrete foreman at both the Warm Springs and Galen expansions, and later, at the Anaconda High School. Soon after, with the encouragement of the local general contractors, he began his own concrete construction business in Anaconda.

Upon the closing of the smelter, he moved the firm to Missoula where he enjoyed success at both commercial and residential projects. He sold the business and retired in 1984. In 1992 the Clarks moved to Mesa where he resided until the time of his death.

Ken came to love golf after his retirement. Throughout his life, though, he enjoyed sightseeing, fishing trips and spending time with his family and friends. He will be fondly remembered for his warmth, his strength of character, his sense of humor, his numerous distinctive expressions, his hard work and his devotion to his family.

A memorial service was held Oct. 25 in Mesa. Interment was at Mesa City Cemetery.

J. A. Chase, 67, until a few years ago one of Mountain Grove's outstanding citizens, died Tuesday night at his home in Jefferson City, where he had been residing for the last 18 months. He had been employed in the state auditor's office.

Mr. Chase lived in Mountain Grove from 1888 to 1927. He first went to Mountain Grove to accept a position as cashier of the Mountain Grove bank. In only a few years he had risen to the position of president of the bank, which position he held until 1927, when the bank was reorganized and he resigned. He then moved to Joplin, where he engaged in the insurance business until accepting the position in the state office.

During his residence at Mountain

Grove, he engaged in many civic enterprises. He established the town's first electric light plant and was one of the founders and supporters of the old "Ozark Trail," one of the first better road movements ever advanced in the Ozarks.

He is survived by two sons, Will J. Chase, manager of a branch of the National City bank of New York stationed at Medellin, Colombia, in South America; Evan W. Chase, in the veterans hospital at Gulfport, Miss., and one daughter, Mrs. Lucille Miller of Beltsville, Maryland.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the Baptist church at Mountain Grove. The Reverend R. F. Carroll of Frederickstown, Mo., will officiate.

“Mansfield (MO) Mirror” 14 Feb 1918 p 4 – in this morning’s newspaper was the news that the Cunard liner Tuscania, with 2,179 American soldiers on board, was torpedoed & sunk. There are 1,912 reported safe. Evan Chase of this city was on board, but his parents have received no word.

“Lincoln (KS) Sentinel” 14 Feb 1918 p 1 – The war has hit close to home. Evan W. Chase, in the aviation corps, a cousin of Mrs. W. Cipra, was reported saved.
