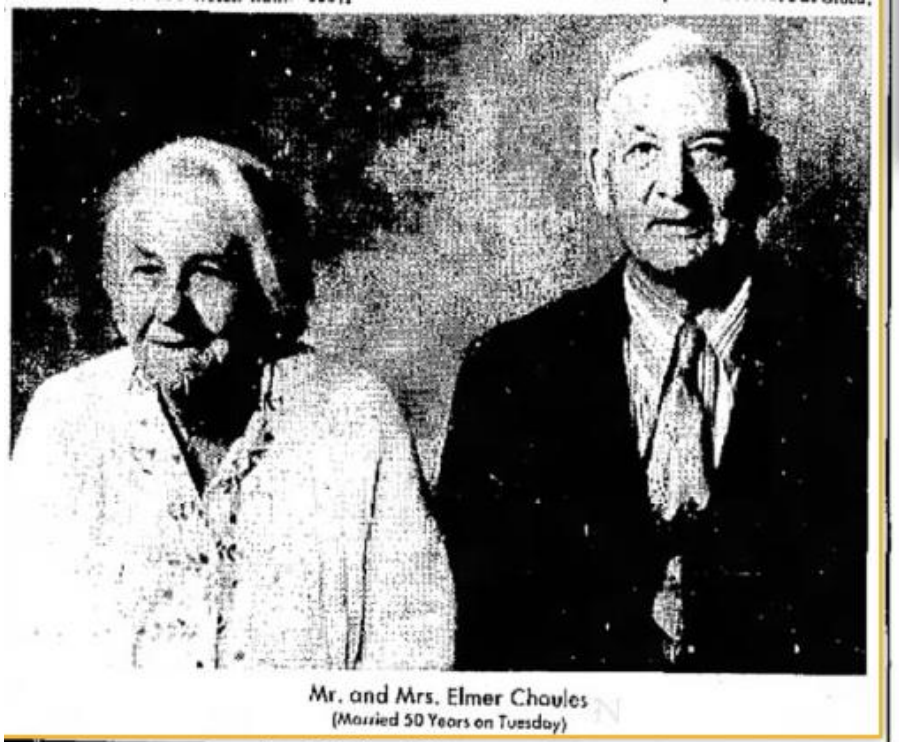

Mr. and Mrs. Choules had a farm between Franklin and Fairview at the foot of Little Mountain until he started working on the railroad and moved to Pocatello in 1947. He started out as a fireman and later became an engineer. He retired in June, 1960.

He graduated from high school in Preston. While in school he was active in athletics and was on the basketball team that won the championship of the Rocky Mountain

area of Utah and Idaho. He is a World War I veteran.

Mrs. Choules (Martha Irene Oliverson, was born Nov. 4, 1897. Her parents were Levi and Martha Oliverson. She attended the A.C. College in Logan, and also the Utah Business College in Salt Lake City. She was active in the LDS church and was a teacher in the Primary.

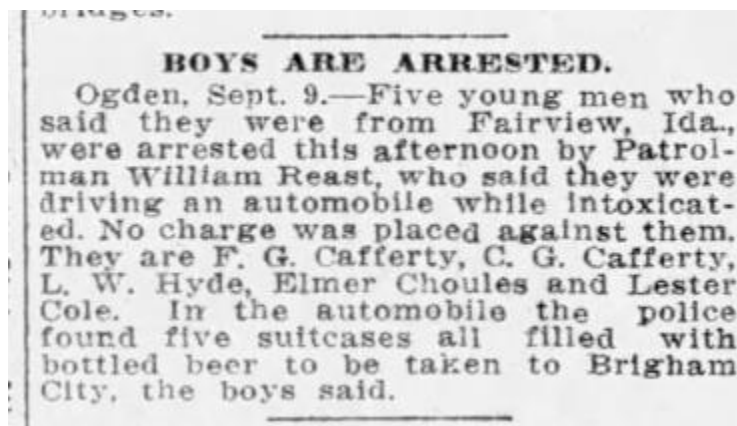

FOUNDERS DAY PROGRAM AT ONEIDA ACADEMY

(Special Correspondence.)

PRESTON, Nov. 30.—Wednesday afternoon at 1 o'clock the Founders' day program was rendered in the assembly room of the Oneida academy. The principal speaker was Prest. C. N. Jenson, of the Brigham Young college, who congratulated the academy upon having such unusual musical talent as was exhibited at the meeting. Prest. Jenson chose as his theme the obligations which rest upon rational intelligent beings. He said the capacity to weigh, to judge, to know is priceless, and that rational beings should learn that the only way to get eternal happiness is from the labors of the day. Prest. Jenson said he finds a spirit of pessimism creeping over the young people of the Church, many of whom have begun to wonder if there is anything in the faith of the fathers after all. Such people, Prest. Jenson declared, have forgotten that not all there is in life is intellectual; science never gives a person what, down in his heart, makes him meet the battles of life. The poets and prophets of the ages have

as much right to their belief and are as worthy of consideration as the scientist. Prest. Jenson urged the students to have pride in their family name and keep it sacred. He declared many young people are much like men are when they climb a mountain, they see where they are going before they start, but soon after they begin the ascent they forget. The mountain climber, although he beheld the different elevations he would have to surmount before he could reach the highest summit, after hours of toil is surprised to see the summit still farther on. People sometimes turn aside or back when they reach the first summit and few ever stand on the highest peaks. The rule of life is that people must find themselves in solitude, the speaker stated, and to illustrate his point he cited his audience to the Israelites who were kept in the wilderness 40 years that they might know themselves; the Latter-day Saints who were brought away from the world that they might find their own souls. "Young people, who are the heirs of everything that has gone before—you are the heirs of the ages!" Prest. Jenson declared earnestly. "Young people who do not leave their Church richer than they found it—what do you think of them? Where much is given much is expected—young people, you are the heirs of the ages!"

Prest. Jenson caught the spirit of the occasion and delivered a message to the people which will aid them to make their lives bigger and better.

The remainder of the program was excellent, also. Principal Joseph A. Geddes welcomed the patrons and friends of the school. Atty. A. W. Hart, a member of the board of education, spoke in place of Prest. Joseph S. Geddes, who was not feeling well. Atty. Hart spoke of the Thanksgiving spirit of the nation and people. The musical numbers were deserving of comment. The duet, "Music of the Pines," sung by Miss Barbara Neeley and Miss Vera Geddes, was beautiful. The music suggested the whispering of the wind through the pines, and the voices of the two young ladies blended well. The two numbers rendered by the girls' chorus were well received. Mrs. Blanche Kendall McKey read a poem written by her sister, Miss Kate Thomas, which fitted the occasion.

After the meeting the crowd repaired to the gymnasium, where the all-star Oneida game of basketball took place. The all-stars had an exceptionally strong line-up since, nearly all of them are attending other schools and were in good physical condition. The game resulted in a victory for the all-stars. Score 28 to 16. Coach Packer's team had played but one game together, in fact, the first team has not yet been definitely selected. This accounted for the rather loose team work. The all-stars were N. Barlow, Lloyd Tolman, V. Neeley, L. Ballif, H. Nuffer, S. Packer, M. Merrill; the academy team men were E. Choules, O. Rawlins, L. Forsgren, E. Cole, G. Packer, G. Lake, E. Miller. The game was interesting owing to the manner in which the two teams went after the ball. Between halves the faculty of the academy played the Jefferson school faculty a game of volley ball, which resulted in a victory for the academy, by a score of 21 to 5.

The Founders' day ball in the evening was well attended by the students. The nine-piece academy orchestra furnished the music.

Preston Wool Pool Has Annual Meeting

On Saturday, the members of the Preston Wool Pool met in their annual meeting at which time A. G. Eames and W. S. Evans were elected to succeed themselves as directors, and William L. Beckstead elected to fill the unexpired term of Myron Carter who has retired from the sheep business. Carry-over directors are Howard Hall and Elmer Choules.

The meeting was in charge of A. G. Eames, president of the association, Chase Kearn, acting as secretary, gave a financial report of the association and stated that in 1935 the pool handled wool for 117 farm flock owners and marketed 65,000 pounds of wool.

Prof. Fuhrman of the USAC economic division, was the principal speaker. He stressed the importance of delivering to the Marketing Association a high quality product and of loyalty to co-operative groups. He also indicated that cooperative marketing of farm products had grown rapidly in the last few years and at the present time approximately 25 per cent of the total agricultural products of the country were marketed through cooperative organizations.

Wool Pool Gets High Price for Big Clip

PRESTON, Idaho—The Franklin county wool pool announced the sale of 70,000 pounds of wool to the D. Harris Wool company of St. Louis. The price is stipulated at 30 cents per pound, f. o. b. Preston. The pool involves the fleeces from 120 farm flocks. This is the fifth consecutive year the pool has been in operation.

In 1935 the pool sold 65,000 pounds of wool belonging to 117 growers to the same company for 22 cents per pound. Directors of the pool are: A. G. Eames, Howard Hall, W. S. R. Evans, W. L. Beckstead, Elmer Choules and Chase Kearl, county agricultural agent.

Franklin Fleece Pool Ships 64,000 Pounds

PRESTON—More than 64,000 pounds of wool have been shipped out of Franklin county through the Franklin County Wool Pool since Monday. The pool board consists of A. G. Eames, chairman, and Howard Hall, W. L. Beckstead, W. S. Evans and Elmer Choules, as well as Chase Kearl, Franklin county extension agent, ex-officio member and secretary.

The wool, including the clippings from 111 flocks, was sold to B. Harris, St. Louis wool buyer, at 30 cents a pound, an 8-cent increase over the 1935 price. In that year, 63,752 pounds were pooled at 22 cents, with a cash return to the county of \$14,025.44, compared with \$18,840.60 which will be received from the wool this year. The pool is a University of Idaho extension service project.

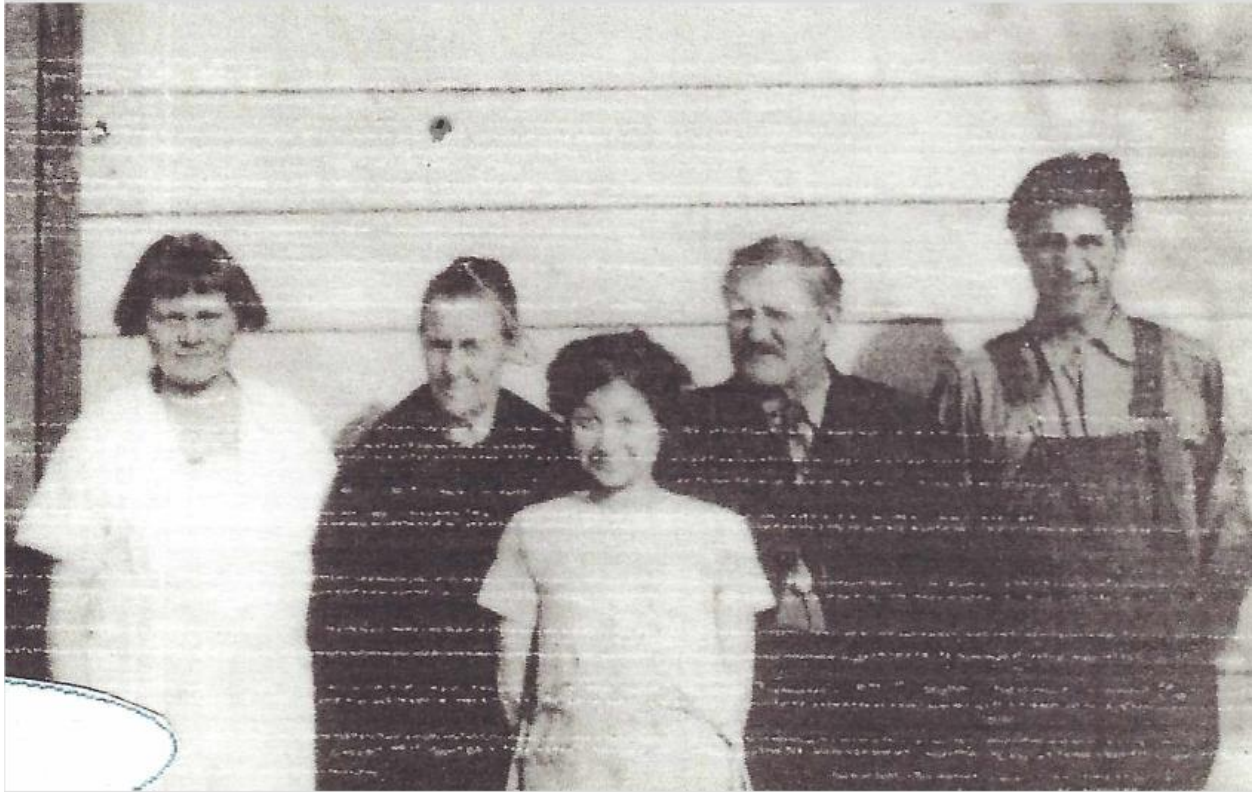

A brief history of Mary Ann Hill Choules, written by her grandson Bill Choules, as I remember her.

Grandma was a small woman with big black piercing eyes. She was very ambitious and rather plain in her nature and mannerisms. She had long dark hair and always pinned it up in a bob on the back of her head. She did a lot of the sewing for the family, quilted and knitted many items. She used to can lots of fruits and vegetables and made pickles, jams, and jellies. She enjoyed keeping the cellar full.

Grandma was a very good cook and I enjoyed eating with she & grandpa, which I did often. I will always remember the delicious Thanksgiving dinners she would prepare. Some of her specialties were pumpkin pie and apple dumplings. One thing I enjoyed was her homemade bread. I liked to eat bread and milk with Grandpa with good sharp cheese, which they always seemed to have.

Grandma & Grandpa always had a very good & large garden and always grew watermelons in it. They had a large raspberry patch and the family would come and help pick berries. It seemed like there was always enough to go around. They had a large orchard with apples, pears, cherries, plums and peaches. They also had currants & blackberries. Grandma always had lots of pretty flowers. Grandpa always tried to plant his potatoes on good Friday.

They raised cows, chickens, pigs and horses on their farm and grew hay, grain, peas, corn and sugar beets. We used to thin & top the beets the old fashioned way (with a hoe & beet knife).

Grandma was very good to me, but those big black eyes had a way of telling me if she disapproved of something I did. She usually gathered the eggs and was not too happy with me when she discovered I had used her eggs for target practice on the side of the chicken coop, as I wanted to be a baseball pitcher. Between she and my dad they disciplined me quite well. She was a good disciplinarian. I guess she had a lot of practice with all her boys. They had ten children, 4 girls & 6 boys, and raised 8 of them to maturity.

My Grandparents were in their later years when I was born, in 1927. Grandpa lost his hearing when he was only about 35 years old and as a result they did not go to church very much in their later years because he could not hear, but they always paid a full tithing. They communicated with each other by writing on a slate with chalk. One day when I stopped by Grandma had written on the slate, "Who got our car?"

For several years we shared a car with our Grandparents. Grandma used to like someone to take her to Preston to shop and visit on Saturday afternoon. Saturday was about the only time most people went to town in those days. One funny incident I remember was that one Saturday after she finished her shopping she went and got into a black car thinking it was her own. What a surprise she was in for when she found out it was the wrong car.

Grandma used to have an all-wooden washing machine, which I liked to help Grandpa turn to wash the clothes. She was so excited when she got her first new electric Speed Queen washer. In fact, I think she really appreciated everything she got new.

Grandma knitted me a pair of gray mittens for winter, which I was very proud of. We had an appaloosa colt which was a regular pet. I was petting him one day & he grabbed one of them and chewed it up so quickly I couldn't grab it before he ruined it. I was heartbroken until Grandma knitted me another one.

Grandma & Grandpa lived a plain and simple life, worked hard, raised & enjoyed their family and had a testimony of the church. I have many pleasant memories of times I spent at their home. I would say without hesitation that Grandma was a very good wife, mother and homemaker.

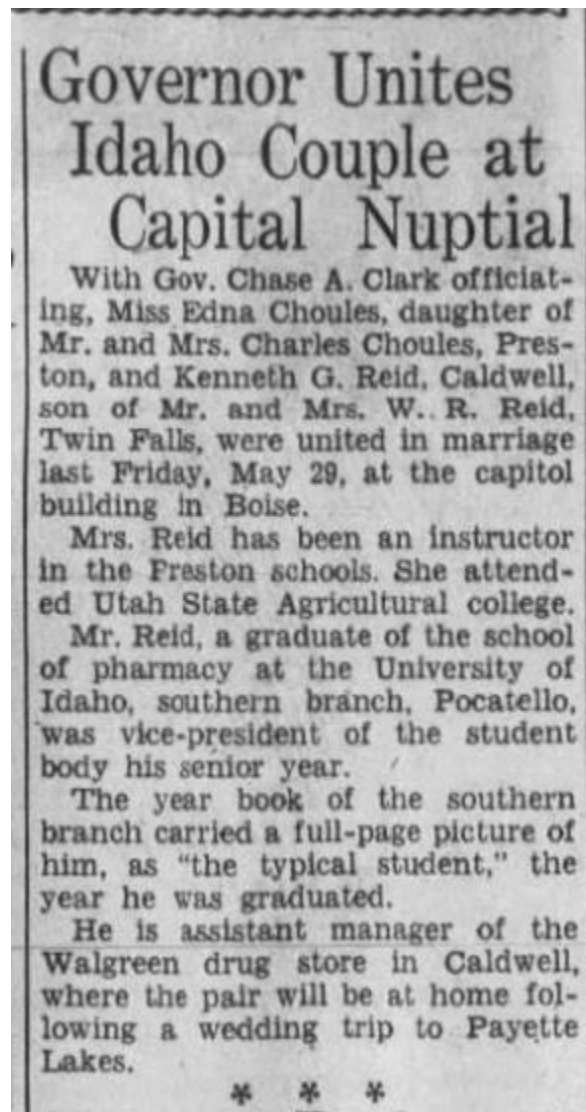

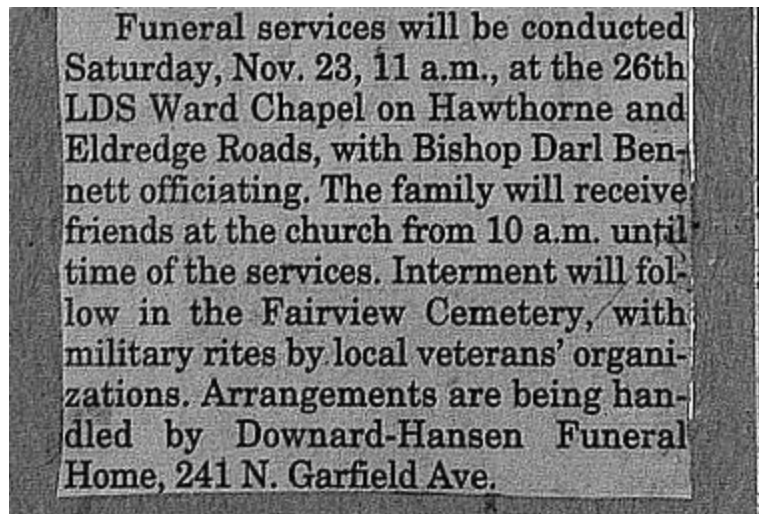
He married Martha Irene Oliverson Dec. 22, 1920 in the Salt Lake City LDS Temple.
