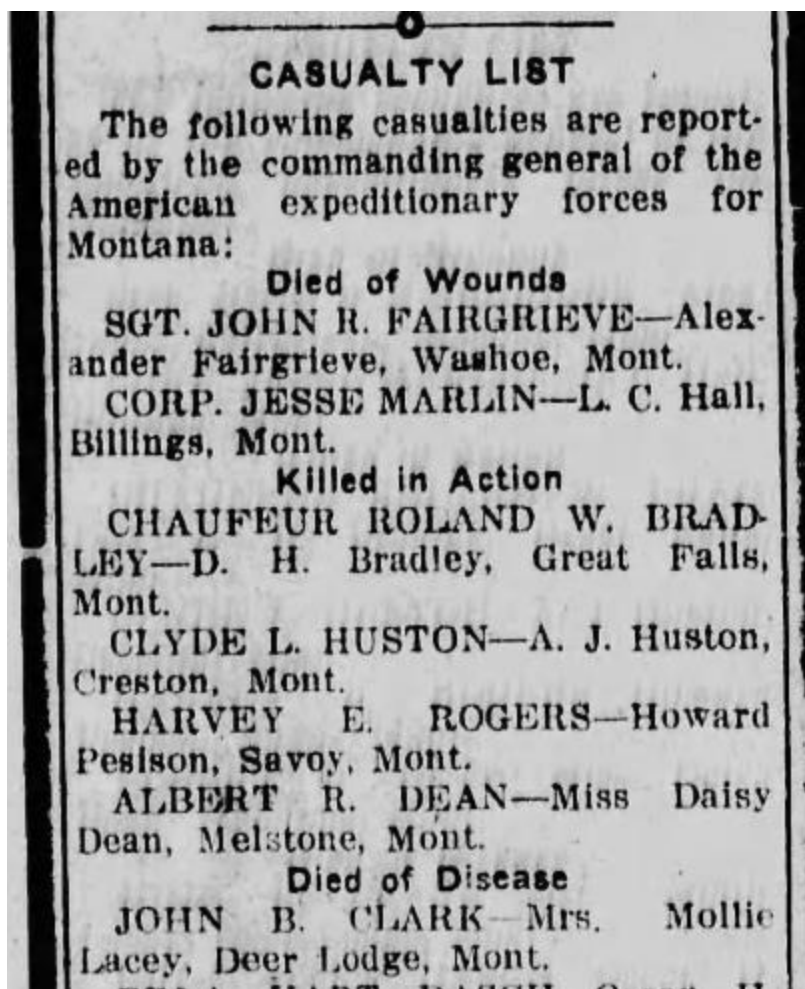
Deer Lodge, March 20.—Miss Mollie Lacey received word this week that John B. Clark of the 31st Engineers, well known in this city, had died in France from lobar-pneumonia, Feb. 27. Clark went to France on the Tuscania and when the big boat was sunk off the coast of Scotland was reported lost at the time. Friends were more than pleased when Clark sent word that he was alive, and had some thrilling experiences. Now comes the word that disease has claimed him. Clark's parents are both dead and he gave as his next of kin Miss Mollie Lacey, a friend of many years standing. Following is the telegram to Miss Lacey:

"We deeply regret to inform you that it is officially reported that Sergeant J. B. Clark died Feb. 27 of lobar-pneumonia.

Asa was born 18 Feb 1889 in Santa Barbara, Santa Barbara CA & died 30 May 196 Camarillo, Ventura CA. He was the son of Charles Everett Dale Hoffman (1864-1947) & Virgiletta E. Haviland.

In the 1920 census for Pasadena, Los Angeles CA, Mabel Hoffman, 33 ME, divorced, father b. Canada, mother b. Scotland, is a housemaid/servant in the household of Charles H. & Rebecca I. Hibbard

In the 1930 census for Santa Monica, Los Angeles CA, Mable Hoffman, 42 ME, father b. ME, mother b. Scotland, is a servant on 24th St. She lists herself as widowed & that she was age 29 at the time of her 1st marriage.

She married James Lang ("Jay") Bunker (1901-1996, F: 61215906) on 4 May 1980 in Provo, Utah Co. UT.

Mollie Lacey came to Deer Lodge, Powell MT ca. 1935, noted in her obituary as 35 years before her death. She operated a hotel.

She married Frank Howard of Porterville, Tulare CA. The newspaper account in Dec 1924 says she had been married "some time since." He was a fruit grower, born in WI, who died 16 Jan 1926 in CA & was buried 2 Feb 1926 in Porterville Cemetery, Porterville, Tulare CA, F: 87492238.

"Butte (MT) Miner" 11 Feb 1918 p 2 – "Former Milwaukee Man Among Survivors" – J.B. Clark of Co. D, 20th Engineers, formerly employed on the "rip-track" of the Milwaukee, was saved from the Tuscania. John Fredericks received a large photo of the members of Co. D & Clark was pictured.

"Anaconda (MT) Standard" 13 Feb 1918 p 10 – word was received from John B. Clark, thought drowned on the Tuscania, that he was safe

"Anaconda [MT] Standard" 26 Apr 1918 p 13 – J.A. Fredericks recently received a newspaper from John B. Clark from England, with a note to that effect that Clark would soon be in France. Clark, with the 20th Engineers, was the only man from the county on the Tuscania; he was not injured in the explosion nor did he have any ill effects from exposure. His Deer Lodge friends will be glad to hear that he is safely on the other side.

"Butte Miner" 24 Feb 1919 p 6 – Miss Blanche Savoie, a Butte girl who is overseas with a "theatrical combination" entertaining boys in camps, keeps track of all MT boys she meets. She reports, among those in the "best of health:" J.B. Clark, Deer Lodge.

"Butte Miner" 3 May 1919 p 8 says John B. Clark reported by War Department to be dead of pneumonia 27 Feb 1919 "but from whom friends have had letters dated in March" [copied above]

"Butte Miner" [MT] 21 Mar 1919 p 3 "Tuscania Survivor Dies of Pneumonia" in France, rank sergeant, 31st Engrs. Both parents are dead; long-time friend Miss Mollie Lacey notified. [copied above]

"Anaconda [MT] Standard" 28 Mar 1919 p 3 - Sergt. John B. Clark, Mrs. Mollie Lacey, Deer Lodge, died of disease [think the rank "Sergeant" may be a mix-up with the John Frederick Clark who died]
