Homer J. Clement, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. H. Clement of Sun City, was one of the survivors of the ill-fated Tuscania. In 1916 he went to Idaho and purchased a home. When the call came for engineers he responded and was enlisted in Company E, 20th Engineers, on Dec. 2, 1917. This was the so-called "lumber jack" regiment (it was destined to get out timbers for the Army). He was immediately transferred to Washington, D. C. and sent over on the Tuscania. When the news came of the sinking of the ship, his parents and friends feared the worst, but on Sunday noon his parents received a telegram from the Adjutant General's office stating: "Officially reported that Homer J. Clement was saved from Tuscania."

Homer J. Clements, only brother of our drayman A. W. (Fred) Clements, was on the transport Tuscania when it was sunk recently by a sneaking Hun sea-hyena. The War Department sent a cablegram to his mother at Sun City that he was rescued and was all right. This is the first news we have had of him since Homer enlisted in the Navy in one of the western states several months ago. Homer is well known in this community, having lived here and at Sun City many years and his friends are sure glad to hear that he escaped being one of the victims of the bloodthirsty Hun.

TEN TUSCANIA SURVIVORS DINE

At the Desert last night, 10 survivors and wives of the Tuscania, torpedoed off the Irish coast by a German submarine during World war I, met for their annual banquet. George Frisbie presided.

The Tuscania, bound from Hoboken, N. J., for Liverpool, England, was torpedoed February 5, 1918, with 2500 soldiers aboard. An estimated 350 lives were lost in the sinking.

WOMAN KILLED WHEN CAR ROLLS, DIVES INTO RIVER

LEWISTON, Idaho, March 30.—Luella Wilson, 28, was killed and John Ramsey, 60, hospitalized yesterday when the car she was driving plunged into the Clearwater river near Myrtle. Both were residents of Lapwai.

Deputy Sheriffs Clarence Kyle and Bud Huddleston, who investigated with County Coroner Kermit Malcolm, said the 1953 automobile was apparently traveling at "a terrific rate of speed" when it veered off the right side of the road for 200 feet, turned over and rolled 66 feet before entering the river.

Mrs. Verner McKay, who with her husband operates a store at Myrtle, said that Pat McKay, working in the yard, saw the accident and ran to the store with the news. Pat and Verner McKay and Charles Eckerman of Grangemont went to the scene of the accident and noted Ramsey sitting on top of the car which had landed on its wheels in the water. They pulled him to safety with the aid of a rope.

Body Is Seen

Homer Clements of Stites came by and said he saw a body floating away from the scene of the wreck. Going to the scene, Mr. and Mrs. McKay spotted the body of Miss Wilson and McKay dived into the water and brought her to shore where artificial respiration proved fruitless.

Ramsey was taken to Tri-State Memorial hospital at Clarkston where his condition is said to be satisfactory.

Miss Wilson was born May 21, 1925, at Kamiah. She was married to Emmett Redearth at Portland in 1943 and divorced in 1944. She is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Michael Wilson, Spalding; a son, Michael Wilson, Spalding, and five brothers, Justin and Marcus Wilson, Spalding; Simon, Lapwai; Levi, Warm Springs, Ore., and Calvin, San Diego, Calif.

Her body is at Brower-Wann funeral home.

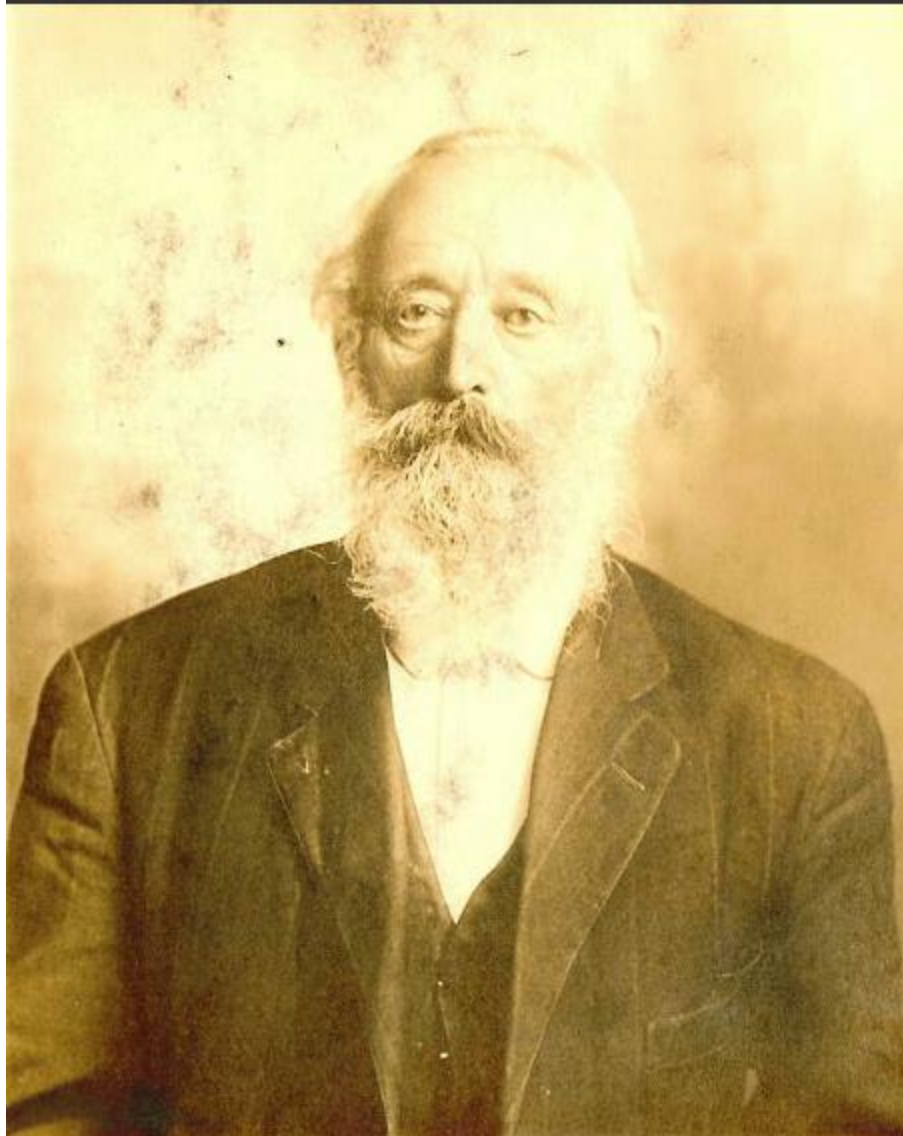

Uncle Milt Clements.

One of the oldest settlers we have discovered in our rambles through Barber county is Uncle Milt Clements, of Sun City. He is a native of Illinois, served through the war of the rebellion, came to Barber county and settled on Mulberry creek in 1872 and is living on the same section of land today. He has served one term as county commissioner, seven terms as deputy sheriff and was door keeper of the senate during Lewelling's administration.

Mr. Clements is one of the survivors of the blizzard that swept over the western part of the state in January, 1875, one of the most furious and longest continued winter storms of which there is any record. It was the year the Indians had their war paint on. The militia had been called out for the protection of the settlers on the border, and a stockade had been built at Sun City and garrisoned. Mr. Clements was at that time a sergeant in the state militia and with a squad of three men was on his way from Hutchinson when they were overtaken by the storm. Two of the party, Bartlett and Walker, were frozen to death, while Reuben Marshall and Mr. Clements were so badly frozen that they had to have their feet amputated and Mr. Clements is now using artificial feet,

though one would hardly notice the fact. The ordeal was a severe one and the suffering great. The best thing possible was done, however, and the government at Washington prevailed upon through the influence of Judge S. R. Peters to

place his name on the military rolls with a pension of \$72. A thrilling story might be written of Mr. Clement's experience and some day we may make the attempt.

B. DEAF-MUTES.

The object of this Supplemental Schedule is to furnish material not only for a complete enumeration of deaf-mutes, but for an account of their condition. It is important that every inquiry respecting each case be answered as fully as possible. Enumerators will, therefore, after making the proper entries upon the Population Schedule No. 1, transfer the name (with Schedule page and number) of every deaf-mute found, from Schedule No. 1 to this Special Schedule, and proceed to ask the additional questions indicated in the headings of the several columns. Care must be taken not to enumerate persons who are deaf only (hard of hearing) or dumb only (tongue-tied) as deaf-mutes. A deaf-mute is one who cannot speak, because he cannot hear sufficiently well to learn to speak. Enumerators may obtain valuable hints as to the number of deaf-mutes, and their residence, from physicians who practice medicine in their respective districts, also from school-teachers. Great assistance may be derived from questions addressed to deaf-mutes themselves: Do you know any deaf-mutes in this neighborhood? The class feeling of the deaf and dumb, arising from their isolated state, is so great that they seek each other out for the sake of companionship, and ordinarily know every deaf-mute for miles around.

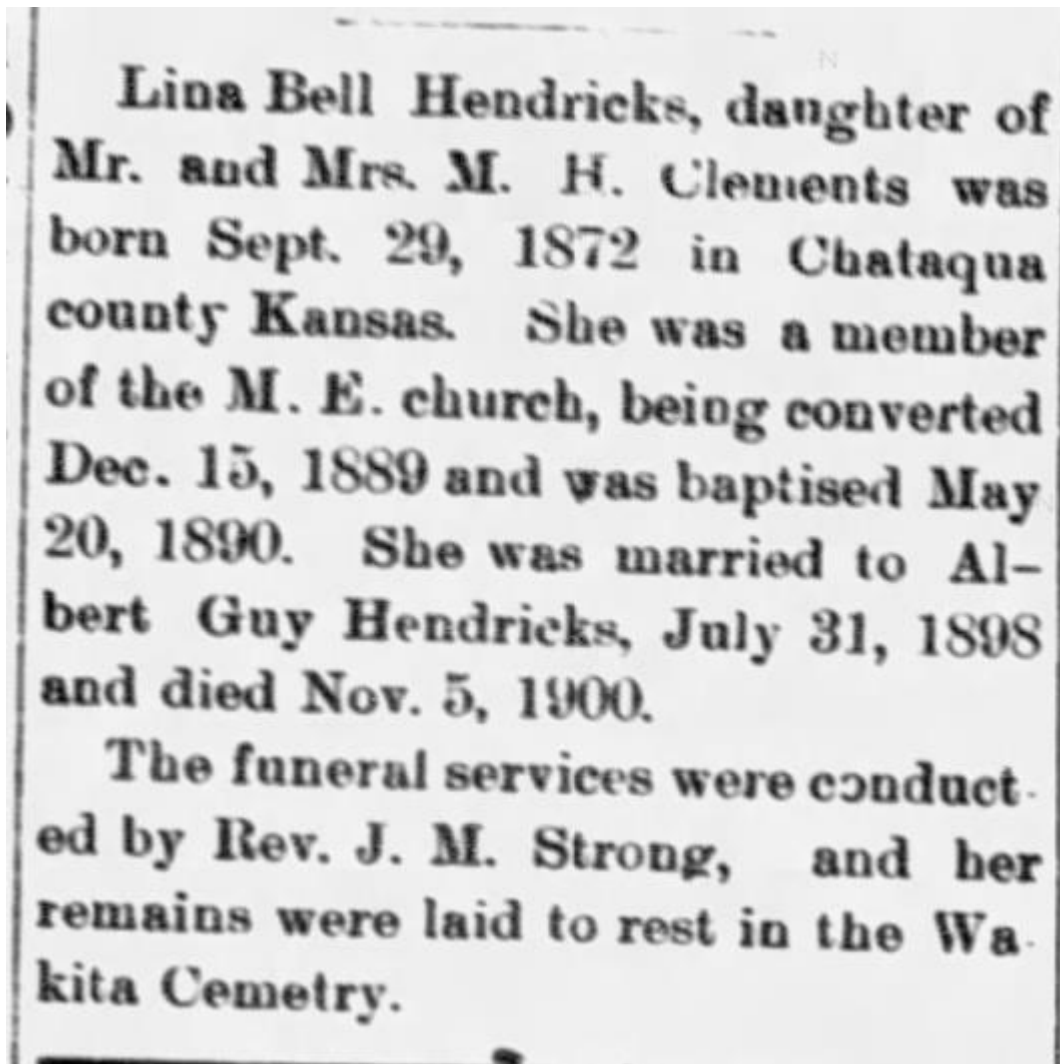
Obituary

- **Alice B. Clements Sotin Nau**, 11 Feb 1927 ID – 25 Dec 2023 Lewiston, Nez Perce ID. - Was 3 years 1 month old on 7 May 1930. – Married to Lawrence Sotin (1919-2 Oct 1953, F: 16402676) in 1947. Buried in White Bird ID, 70th Engineers Maintenance Co., WWII. They had 2 children. - Lawrence died 2 hours after the start of hunting season when one of his hunting companions shot at an elk & the bullet ricocheted. Lawrence lived for a time after being shot & admitted that he had not followed the agreement to stay in a gulch. Both he & his companion shot at the same elk & he left the gulch to track it. - Married Vincent H. Nau (1927-1997, F: 74938755, buried in Ferdinand ID) on 26 Dec 1958. Then Alice Mary Soten [sic] was christened 7 Oct 1960 in Ferdinand, Idaho Co. ID [listed as daughter of Homer Clemens (sic) & Amy Kyle] & then married [again?] to Vincent Nau on 7 Nov 1960 in Ferdinand, Idaho ID. [Converted to his church?] - - “Moscow-Pullman Daily News” (Moscow ID) 14 Jun 2007. At age 80, Alice published her first novel, “Aftermath,” set in ID, which she had self-published at Steele Press in Lewiston ID. She grew up on a farm & is a retired teacher & librarian. [She published a sequel entitled “Into Your Hands.” Her life story is available online, as published in the “Lewiston Tribune” 25 May 2013 at https://lmtribune.com/northwest/riveting-tale/article_4fe72073-28f5-5125-9375-10d374df1fb8.html [not operational as of 7 Apr 2025] – found at <https://www.lmtribune.com/northwest/riveting-tale-4fe72073> but requires subscription. - “Riveting Tale” - As a 17-year-old from Stites ID, Alice Clements Nau, now age 86, was crawling around the inside of tail sections & other parts of aircraft cutting off damaged parts & repairing them with sheet metal & rivets. She had taken off her senior year of high school to move to North Island near San Diego. Her sister [apparently Betty] had gone down earlier to San Diego. Her parents had owned a service station & grocery in Stites, had sold the business & moved to AZ. She asked the US Navy for a job. She was tiny & could fit in tight spaces inside the planes, from which the Navy had carefully washed the blood before repair work. She was paid 79 cents an hour, with double for overtime. Although men were paid more, she thought this was a very good wage. The Navy men did not harass her, and she thought if anyone had, the others would act like a whole bunch of big brothers, instead of only the one she had. In Aug 1945 she returned to Kooskia to finish high school & graduated in 1946. She got a job at the telephone office in Grangeville. She married Lawrence Sotin, who had been shot down behind enemy lines in the Battle of the

Bulge & took 15 days to get back to the Allies. Lawrence & Alice had 3 children. He was killed in a 1953 hunting accident. She decided then to go to college, at Lewis-Clark State College (then Lewis-Clark Normal School), where she met & married Vincent Nau. They moved to Cottonwood ID & had 5 children. She taught school for 24 years. "Spokane Chronicle" 2 Oct 1953 p 15 – Idaho's first hunting fatality this season was Lawrence Sotin, age 35, of Stites ID. He died 2 Oct 1953 in an ambulance en route to Lewiston ID. He was shot in the back yesterday 2 hours after the opening of the hunting season when a bullet from the gun of his brother, Jack Sotin, of Clearwater ID, ricocheted off a tree & hit him in the spine. The hunting party was at Newsome Creek about 35 miles south of Grangeville & about 7 miles from the nearest road. Sotin was carried 1 ½ miles on a litter & 5 miles on a Jeep, part of the way accompanied by a doctor. – Alice is buried in Ferdinand Community Cemetery, Ferdinand, Idaho Co. ID. F: 74938828

Buried in Tahoe Cemetery, Kooskia ID. Not on Find A Grave.

"Barber County Index" (Medicine Lodge KS) on Thursday, 21 Jul 1898, Judge Funk issued a marriage license to Albert G. Hendricks of OK & Miss Lena Clements of Sun City KS,

daughter of Uncle Milt Clements, "a highly respected young lady." – "Medicine Lodge (KS) Cresset" 29 Jul 1898 p 3 – Albert G. Hendricks of OK & Miss Lena Clements, daughter of Uncle Milt Clements & his wife, of Mulberry Ranch, were married a few days ago, don't have the exact date, but the license was issued 21 Jul 1898. Lena & Albert had a son, Riley Hendricks. The 1900 census (conducted 21 Jun 1900) showed Albert G., 33 IN, b. Jun 1866, farmer, living with wife Lina, 28 KS, b. Sep 1872 & son Riley, 11 months OK, b. Jan 1899 [this doesn't compute with date of census] in Ware township, Grant, Oklahoma Territory. They had been married 2 years; she had given birth to 1 child, with 1 then living. Lena died 5 Nov 1900. On 27 Aug 1905 Albert G. Hendricks, age 36, of Wakita OK, married Lizzie J. Duncan, age 26, in Canadian Co. OK. "El Reno Daily Globe" 26 Aug 1905 p 1. It appeared the family stayed friendly with Albert after Lena died, as shown in the "Kansas Star" (Olathe KS), 1 Nov 1911 p 2 – Effie Clements of Sun City KS was a guest of Mr. & Mrs. Albert G. Hendricks of Wakita OK for some time. Obituary: "Wakita (OK) Weekly Herald" 8 Nov 1900 p 7 – Lina Bell Hendricks, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. M.H. Clements, d. 29 Sep 1872 in Chataqua [sic] Co. KS. A member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, to which she converted 15 Dec 1889 & was baptized 20 May 1890. Married Albert Guy Hendricks 31 Jul 1898. Died 5 Nov 1900. Funeral conducted by Rev. R.M. Strong, with burial in Wakita Cemetery. Buried as Lina B. Clements Hendricks in Wakita OK. Tombstone reads she died at age 28 years, 1 month, 7 days. Albert's obituary: "Lockwood (MO) Luminary" 16 Feb 1940 p 1 – B. 9 Jun 1865 Hendricks Co. IN; d. at his Lockwood MO home on 8 Feb 1940. "Idaho County Free Press" (Grangeville ID) 13 Dec 1917 p 3 - H.J. Clements of Clearwater ID among those cleared by the draft board & presumed enlisted.

"Wilmore (KS) News" 21 Feb 1918 p 5 & "Coats (KS) Courant" 14 Feb 1918 p 1 [same article, with Wilmore newspaper crediting Coats paper] - Homer J. Clements, the only brother of "our drayman" A.W. (Fred) Clements, was on the Tuscania "when it was sunk recently by a sneaking Hun sea-hyena." The War Department sent a cable to Homer's mother at Sun City KS that he was rescued & well. This is the first news received since Homer enlisted in the Navy [i.e. Army] in 1 of the Western states [Idaho] several months

ago. He is well-known in this community [Coats] as he lived here & at Sun City for many years & his friend will be pleased to know he did not fall victim to the bloodthirsty Hun.
