Adeline married 1912 in Portsmouth, Scioto OH to George W. Pemberton (1888-1937, F: 181123425). Or was it 4 Jul 1910 in CVatlettsburg, Boyd KY – George Pemberton (son of Richard Pemberton & Lizzie Hackworth) married Adeline Gilmore. Is this a wedding trip?: “Chillicothe (OH) Gazette” 8 Aug 1912 p 2 – Mr. & Mrs. George Pemberton will visit 2 weeks with relatives at Clarksburg, Atlanta, Waverly, Woodlyn & Williamsport & will be at home after 12 Aug 1912. - Buried with surname Pemberton.

- Pauline Gilmore Yuenger Dykes, b. 26 Jul 1906 Ironton, Lawrence OH (or Portsmouth OH?) – 2 Dec 1992 NC. At age 18, married on 7 Oct 1922 in Lawrence Co. OH to Raymond L. Yuenger. In the 1930 & 1940 censuses with surname Yuenger. In Jun 1956, Social Security recorded surname change to Dykes. Husband Lester John Dykes (12 Dec 1904 - 29 Jun 1956). Buried in Forsyth Memorial Park, Winston-Salem, Forsyth NC. F: 117123578

First was married to Franklin Clay Payne In 1942 she is listed as the wife of Frank E. Payne in Lawrence Co. OH. Listed as survivor in George's Sep 1964 obituary. Obituary on Find A Grave: Ruth Payne Elbert, 76, formerly of Kankakee IL, now of Joliet IL, d. 21 Dec 1993 at St. Joseph's Hospital, Joliet IL.
