Girl Killed by Tractor as She Reaches for Dog

An attempt to prevent the fall of the family's pet dog from a precarious perch atop a farm tractor cost the life Tuesday of Lucille Hollinger, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Hollinger, of South Myrtle Creek. The girl was driving the tractor back from a sheep pasture, while her sister, Alice, 14, and brother, Edgar, 11, and their dog went along for the ride, Coroner H. C. Stearns reported.

The dog started to fall from the machine and Lucille released the controls to save the family pet, Stearns reported. The tractor swerved over a 15-foot embankment and crushed the girl as it rolled. The sister, Alice, suffered bruises and cuts but was not seriously injured. The boy escaped uninjured.

Surviving are the parents, two sisters, Mary Hollinger of Portland and Alice of Myrtle Creek, and two brothers, Robert of Pearl Harbor, T. H., and Edgar, at Myrtle Creek. Mrs. Ruth Hauser of Myrtle Creek is the maternal grandmother of the accident victim.

Funeral services will be held in the Christian church at Myrtle Creek at 2 p. m. Thursday, Rev. Harry Baird officiating. Services will be concluded in the I. O. O. F. cemetery at Myrtle Creek. Arrangements are in charge of the Douglas Funeral home.

The N. P. Ice Crop.

The ice crop is about over for this season, says the North Powder News. The P. F. E. Co. finished cutting this week. The company put 7000 tons in to the ice house here and shipped 3000 tons to the Huntington plant and 250 tons to Umatilla. The company employed local men for most of the work, but it was necessary to have some experienced men, and switchers were brought from Truckee, Cal., and Ogden, Utah. The Truckee switchers have the reputation of being the best in the country, but we are informed by reliable authorities that the past two years work has developed four North Powder switchers who are equal of any from Truckee. The local experts are Mark Robinson, Edgar Hollinger, Geo. Miles and Will Dalton.

Edgar W. Hollinger
has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the **Lots eleven, twelve, thirteen, and
fourteen of Section eleven in Township twenty-nine south of Range four west
of the Willamette Meridian, Oregon, containing one hundred sixty-two acres
and eighty-four hundredths of an acre,**

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant the tract of Land above described;
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of
the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and
rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws,
and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the
authority of the United States.

ALFRED HOLLINGER

Alfred Geltich Hollinger, 76, of 1901 S. Fourth died Friday morning in Bannock Memorial Hospital following an illness.

He was born June 2, 1901, at Wilson, Kan., to John Alfred and Mary Catherine Hutchinson Hollinger. Shortly after his birth, his family moved to North Powder, Ore., where he grew up in the forest country, enjoying the out-of-doors and hunting.

In the early part of the century, he traveled the West, working in lumber and mining in Oregon and Nevada. He also worked on construction of the old highway which follows the route of the Warm River Canyon in the Island Park area. He worked a number of years for PFE in the maintenance department and for the Union Pacific Railroad in Po-

number of years for PFE in the maintenance department and for the Union Pacific Railroad in Pocatello as a machinist. He retired in 1952 because of his health.

On Nov. 20, 1936, he married Maebelle Gardner at Brigham City, Utah, and they made their home in Rupert until 1941 when they moved to Inkom. Since 1960 they lived in Pocatello.

Mr. Hollinger was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Survivors include his widow of Pocatello; three sons, Jay Rln Hollinger and Keith Utley Hollinger, both of Pocatello, and Robert H. Hollinger, Burlington, Vt.; two daughters, Catherine Powers, Erie, Pa., and Edith B. Laufer, Buffalo, N.Y.; a brother, Edgar H. Hollinger, Little Rock, Ark.; two sisters, Nina Timpty, Wetumma, Okla., and Iva Dunkin, Eugene, Ore.; 23 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. A daughter, Norma Lish, died in 1962.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday in the Manning Chapel, conducted by Bishop Paul Lusk of the LDS 12th Ward. The family will receive friends Tuesday from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Manning Chapel.
