TUSCANIA SURVIVOR HERE AFTER SERVICE IN ARMY

Hallie Hoselton Says No Panic Aboard Vessel

Hallie Hoselton, one of the survivors of the Tuscania disaster, arrived home in Eugene yesterday, having been discharged at Camp Lewis a few days ago.

Mr. Hoselton was a member of the 20th engineers of the United States army and served nearly a year in France. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. M. Hoselton, of Coburg, and has many other relatives in this county.*

Mr. Hoselton says the soldiers on the Tuscania were not at all panic stricken when the Hun torpedo found its mark and that everything was orderly.

The survivors of the disaster were taken to England where they were given a complete new outfit and later transferred to France for duty.

HALLIE HOSELTON ACROSS — WAS PASSENGER ON TUSCANIA — WHEN TORPEDOED

Hallie M. Hoselton, one of the survivors of the Tuscania disaster, in which several hundred American soldiers lost their lives in the sea after the vessel had been torpedoed by a German submarine, arrived in New York from France yesterday, according to a telegram received by his folks here. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. M. Hoselton, and a member of the 20th engineers.

Mr. Hoselton in his letters has never said much about the disaster or about how he was rescued. His folks and friends are anxious to hear the story from his own lips.

Mrs. L. M. Hoselton on Friday received a letter from her son Hallie Hoselton also on the Tuscania. It was very brief and is as follows:

"Am getting along fine. Arrived safely on other side." It is dated February 8, three days after the accident, and he was then in a hospital according to word received from the war department. His address is Co. F, 6th Battalion, 20th Engineers, A. E. F. via New York.

One day this week, while his mother was mopping the floor, the three year-old son of Lewis Hoselton of Crow backed against a pan of hot water and sat down into it accidentally. The youngster was quite severely burned before his clothing could be removed, and it was necessary to call Dr. Brown to dress the injuries. He is now considered out of danger.

This would seem to be his brother Lewis Hoselton – the family lives in Crow - but in 1906 he was 9 or 10 – his brother Mode was around 3 years old - “Eugene (OR) Morning Register” Saturday 6 Jan 1906 p 4

Lewis Hoselton was in from Crow yesterday. He informs us that his saw mill located four miles southwest of Crow postoffice on a tributary of Wolf creek will be started up next week. The output of the mill is from 3000 to 4000 feet of lumber daily and he finds ready sale for the product.

Mrs. Howard Fox and daughter Joan, have left for Cincinnati, Ohio, where Mrs. Fox will join her husband, member of the Red's pitching staff. Fox spent the winter in Bend. Mrs. Fox is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Hoselton, of the Shady Nook auto court, in Bend. He was in the employ of the Medo-Land creamery while in Bend. Fox joined the Cincinnati squad in March, for training.

Hallie's daughter Marilyn married Major League Baseball pitcher Howard Francis Fox, while her sister Mabel married Howard's brother Delano Fox - "Bend (OR) Bulletin" 24 Apr 1945 p 5

Major League Baseball Player. He attended the University of Oregon on a basketball scholarship for a year before signing as a pitcher with the Cincinnati Reds in 1943. His one winning season, 1950, came a year after his 6-19 mark made him the losingest pitcher in the Major Leagues that year. In December 1951 he was sent to the Philadelphia Phillies with catcher Smoky Burgess and second baseman Connie Ryan for catcher Andy Seminick, Eddie Pellagrini, Dick Sisler, and Niles Jordan (a deal that turned out to be very unpopular in Philadelphia). He appeared in 13 games for the Phillies, going 2-7. His last year in the Majors was 1954 when he appeared in 38 games, all in relief. After pitching in the Texas League in 1955, he was stabbed to death while bouncing three young men from the tavern he owned near San Antonio. In 248 Major League games he accrued a lifetime 43-72 Won-Loss record with 6 Saves and a 4.33 Earned Run Average.
