Another Award

Claiming to be suffering from tuberculosis, due to exposure following the sinking of the Steamship Tuscania, Floyd T. Huntington, disabled war veteran, confined at Cushman hospital, Tacoma, was today awarded \$95.00 a month government compensation by the appeals board of the United States Veterans' Bureau at Seattle. Mr. Huntington claims Pacasco, Wash., as his home.

Evidence presented to the Board of Appeals of the government agency showed that Huntington floated in the cold ocean water for more than four hours following the torpedoing of the Tuscania. Following that he was obliged to stay on an open deck of the rescuing vessel for five more hours. Affidavits offered showed that Huntington had no tubercular symptoms before the war. The appeal board concluded that the exposure following the sinking of Uncle Sam's troop ship while on its way to France caused the present condition of the war veteran.

FORMER STUDENTS HERE INVOLVED IN \$100,000 BALM SUIT

A suit asking for \$100,000 and charging alienation of affections was filed in the district court at Las Vegas today by Julian (Swede) Anderson, former University of Nevada football player, against Floyd T. Huntington, representative at the Hoover dam of the Ingersoll-Rand Company.

Huntington, who went to Las Vegas a few months ago from New York, is charged by Anderson in the complaint with inducing Mrs. Anderson to obtain a divorce from her husband and marry him. The complaint asserts that Huntington financed a trip to Yerington for Mrs. Huntington, who was formerly Miss Irma E. Whiteacre of Yerington, to file suit for divorce.

The decree was granted on July 6 on grounds of cruelty. Anderson filed an appearance in the case and accepted service of summons. The action was filed on June 24. Huntington and Mrs. Anderson were later married in Goldfield.

Anderson was a member of the class of 1927 at the university and was prominent in athletics. His wife also attended school here and was also a stenographer living here for some time. They were married in Minden on February 13, 1928.

Floyd Huntington, Tunnel Engineer, Dies At Colfax

Floyd Huntington, 50, widely known engineer who had charge of tunnel construction work on the San Joaquin Light and Power Corporation project at Balch Camp and the Southern California Edison Company tunnel work at Big Creek, died Thursday in a sanitarium at Colfax.

Until he became seriously ill last year, Huntington was tunnel superintendent on the Metropolitan Aqueduct in Southern California, and previously directed tunnel construction at Boulder Dam. The Six Companies awarded him a medal for efficiency in cutting the huge diversion bores at the dam.

He also was in direct charge of various other large tunnel projects in the West and in Mexico and South America.

Huntington was born in Potters Valley, Calif. Surviving him are his widow, Irma Huntington; two children, Jean and Seldon, and a sister and two brothers. The body was sent to Los Angeles for interment in Forest Lawn Mausoleum.

Modesto Inquest Called In Radio Man's Death

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 4.—A coroner's inquest will be held here Tuesday, August 11th, to examine circumstances surrounding the death of Thomas B. McTammany, radio executive, of Modesto.

On July 16th police and firemen, summoned by apartment house residents, climbed through a window into apartment 3, at 430 Steiner Street, here, and found McTammany dead in the bathroom.

The coroner's report said McTammany had apparently been dead since June 30th. The coroner's report said the man probably had been drinking. An autopsy availed little because of the condition of the body.

The police notified E. F. McTammany, a brother, of Turlock, who claimed the body. Funeral services were held at Gantner, Felder and Kenney, with burial July 21st at the Cypress Lawn Memorial Cemetery.

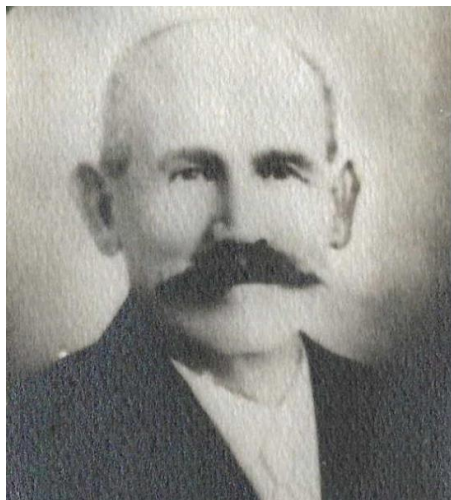

Huntington who married Thomas R. McTammany in Carson City NV on 28 Feb 1941. In the 1941 Modesto CA city directory, Thomas R. & Irma E. Huntington live at 309 Kimble. - Thomas McTammany is found dead in his apartment bathroom on 16 Jul 1942 in Fresno CA (see article copied above) & is buried in Cypress Lawn Memorial Park, F: 87709035.

In his will, dated 3 May 1913, Floyd's father Clark A. Huntington bequeaths to his son Clark G. Huntington a deed to property (42 acres), his hunting knife, belt & \$1 – to his daughter Hazel M. Huntington a deed to property (39 acres) & \$1 – and \$1 each to his 2 sons by his previous marriage: William A. Huntington & Floyd T. Huntington. He also made a bequest to his wife Lillian I. Huntington & her two younger children, Lester Ethan Huntington & Leata I. Huntington, of about 80 acres of land, plus all real or personal property he possessed at his death.

In a memoir written by Floyd's half-sister Hazel Huntington Johnson Gally when her mother Lillian is in her 80s (likely the early 1950s), Hazel writes that her father, Clark Allen Huntington, had spent most of his life in California but came to the Big Bottom country of WA in 1906 & filed on a homestead of 160 acres. The family, consisting of Clark & wife Lillian, son Clark & daughter Hazel

moved onto the homestead from Centralia WA in spring 1907 in a covered wagon, assisted by Lillian's father, Grandpa Garrison. The nearest store was at Randle WA & the trip took 2 days. The family moved into the Hager place, which they had rented for the first year. Clark built a house that winter & the four family members moved in the next spring. In May [1908], Lillian gave birth to twins, Lester & Leta. Lillian was now "over eighty years young" and Mrs. Al Kirk. Al & Lillian still live in on the homestead.

In 1922, "claiming to be suffering from tuberculosis" due to exposure following the sinking of Tuscania, having spent 4 hours in cold ocean water and then 5 more hours on the open deck of the rescuing ship, Floyd T. Huntington, "disabled veteran, confined at Cushman hospital, Tacoma" produced evidence & then was awarded \$95 a month by the appeals board of the US Veterans' Bureau in Seattle WA. His home was listed as Pacasco [sic/Pasco] WA. Floyd had not had tubercular symptoms prior to the war.
