Two Wausau World War veterans are recalling the terrible experience they had 18 years ago tomorrow when the Army transport ship Tuscania was sunk off the coast of Ireland. They were among the survivors of the ship, which went down with a loss of 225 American soldiers. The local veterans, Herbert Hurd, 107 Ross Ave., and T. W. Regling, 715 McIndoe St., knew each other well during their service and they were in the same squad of eight men and soldiered in the South before embarking for the battlefields of France, where they were "buddies." The annual reunion of the Tuscania Survivors Association will be held at Sheboygan tomorrow. Hurd was one of the

eight organizers of the association Feb. 5, 1920, in Milwaukee.

But today they decided that it would be more convenient to hold a little reunion celebration right here at home.

One of the trio was asked what the program would be. He replied: "Nothing for publication."

The three local survivors are Stanley F. Staples, a former association president; Herbert E. Hurd, a former secretary, and Theodore W. Regling.

They were on the British transport ship Tuscania when it was submarined by the German navy February 5, 1918, during the World war, off the Irish coast. Of the 2,300 American troops aboard, 220 were drowned.

Hold Hearings In 36 Cases in Probate Court

Hearings on claims, proofs of wills and appointment of administrators were heard in 36 probate cases in the probate branch of Portage county court on Tuesday and Wednesday. The hearings were set for Tuesday, but because of the large number, many of them were laid over until Wednesday.

The will of Frank Hurd, Belmont, who died at the home of his son, Fred M. Hurd, in the town of Belmont, on July 5 was admitted to probate Tuesday on petition of the son, Fred, who was named executor in the will.

Personal property valued at about \$3,000 is distributed under the terms of the document. The sons and daughters, Henry C. Hurd, Fred M. Hurd, Nellie Robbins, Annie Harris and Herbert Hurd will each receive one-sixth of the estate. The will also provided \$300 be turned over to another daughter, Marjorie Abel, and that Fred M. Hurd be allowed \$10 per week for the care of his father from April 17, 1931, until the time of his death, in July, and that \$50 be given to the Elmwood cemetery.

The heirs waived notice of hearing on the petition for probating the will and letters testamentary were granted the petitioner, as executor.
