One San Francisco Boy in 100th Aerial Squad

Corporal Julius Hunter Janetsky Jr., member of the One Hundredth Aero Squadron, Aviation Field No. 1, is believed to have been aboard the *Tuscania*. This advice was given additional impetus yesterday by the father and brother of the young man, who live at 335 Fifth avenue, Julius H. Janetsky Sr., and Edward Janetsky.

The father of Corporal Janetsky said yesterday that he had reason to believe that his son was the only San Franciscan in that particular unit.

Corporal Janetsky was a native San Franciscan and was graduated from Commercial High School.

Two Soldiers Tell of Escape From Tuscania

Lieut. E. A. Welch and Julius Janetsky Write Letters on Narrow Escape From Diver.

Two San Franciscans writing home of their experiences as soldiers with the American Expeditionary forces tell of the Tuscania destruction.

Below are letters from Lieutenant Eugene A. Welch, engineers U. S. R. detached, to his mother, Mrs. J. W. Welch, 1279 Seventh avenue, and Julius Janetsky, One Hundredth aero squadron, to his mother, Mrs. J. Janetsky, 335 Fifth avenue.

Janetsky in his letter says:

I lost everything—came off the ship in my shirt sleeves. Some cold. I feel sorry because I lost quite a few good plans of mine. I was sitting on my bed waiting for my supper and at 5:30 o'clock, BANG! The lights went out. It was as dark as night. Up on the deck I went. I waited two hours upstairs to get down. Then we had to fight for ourselves. I waited for a submarine chaser. Then I took a rope and swung to it. Then the Germans aimed another torpedo at the chaser. They just missed it by inches, thank God.
