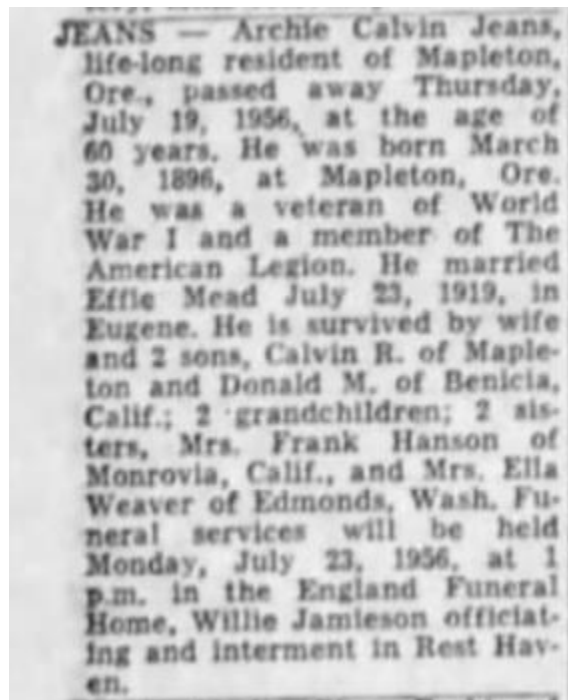

EARLY CHILDHOOD.

Was Resident of Mapleton 22 Years;
Leaves Son in Army Engineer
Regiment.

Mrs. Mary M. Jeans, a resident of Lane county since childhood, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Frank Hanson, in this city, Saturday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock, at the age of 55 years 5 months.

Mrs. Jeans came to Eugene with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Emery Rauch, when but 8 years of age, and she lived in this county until the time of her death. She had made her home at Mapleton for the past 22 years.

Mrs. Jeans leaves a husband, B. B. Jeans, four daughter, Mrs. Frank Hanson and Mrs. Roy Deal, of Eugene; Mrs. Albert Larson, of Curtin, and Mrs. Charles Weaver, of Earl, and two sons, Archie Jeans, who is a member of the 20th engineers in the United States army at Vancouver, Wash., and Carson Jeans, of Mapleton.

The funeral will be arranged when word is received from the son in the army. Branstetter and McLaughlin will direct the funeral.

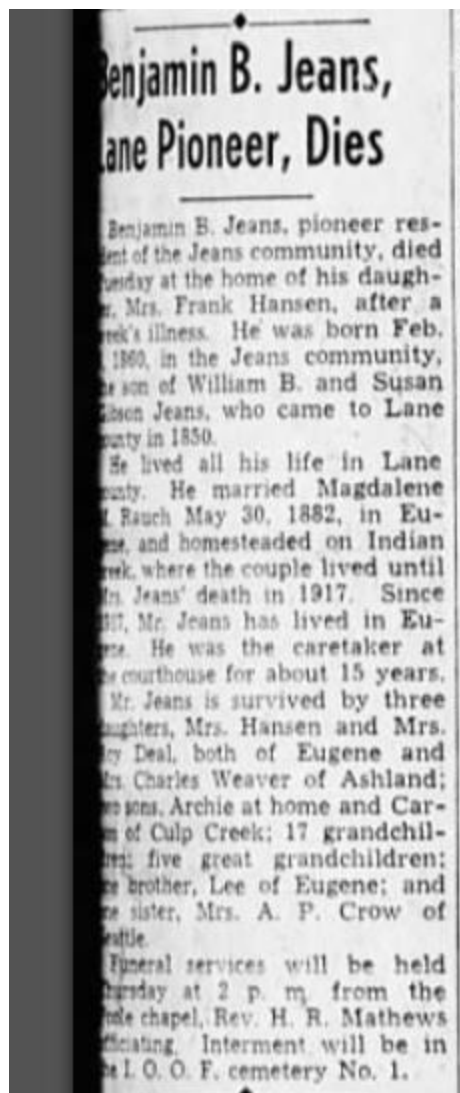

New Grand Juror To Be Appointed Soon

A new Lane grand juror to take the place of Benjamin Jeans, who died since the last session of that body, will be appointed by Judge G. F. Skipworth of the circuit court before the jury is called again. The order for the appointment of a new man on the jury was made Wednesday on motion of District Attorney L. L. Ray.

The fall term of circuit court will convene October 16 and it is expected the grand jury will be called to meet a week previous.

Farm Meeting Held On Indian Creek

O. S. Fletcher, county agricultural agent, and Arthur S. King, extension soils specialist at the state college, conducted a meeting at the Archie Jeans farm on Indian creek in the western part of the county Saturday to discuss irrigation and drainage problems and forage crops with the farmers of that locality.

Miss Gertrude L. Skow, county home demonstration agent, accompanied them and talked to the women on methods of conserving food and demonstrated home-made drying equipment.

In discussing the irrigation and drainage problems Mr. King paid especial attention to water rights and methods of distributing water and Mr. Fletcher told of control of noxious weeds in forage crops. Tree pruning was also demonstrated.

The meeting was held both forenoon and afternoon with a basket luncheon at noon.

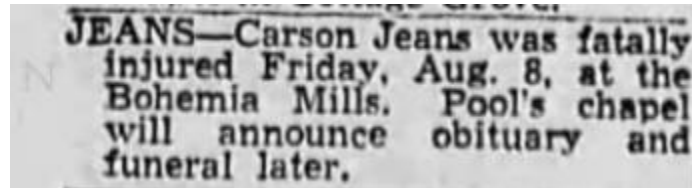
13-Year-Old Hurt When Gun Goes Off

The condition of Donald Jeans, 13-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Archie Jeans of Mapleton, who was shot through the right lung by an accidental discharge of his .22 rifle Wednesday, was described by his physician as still critical Thursday. The boy is making satisfactory progress, however, according to his doctor. He is at the Eugene hospital.

The accident occurred about 6:30 Wednesday evening. An operation was performed to remove the bullet.

Pre-war:

Throughout the 1910s, Archie is paid for road work, as reported in the "Eugene (OR) Guard."

"Eugene (OR) Guard" Wednesday 10 Sep 1913 p 8 – Archie Jeans returned to his home in Indian Creek valley last night after spending a few days at his brother-in-law J.R. Deal's. [his sister Estelle's husband]

"Eugene (OR) Morning Register" Tuesday 18 Jan 1916 p 2 – "Archie Jeans made a pleasant trip in his new sleigh to Reed Sunday."

Wartime:

The day the Tuscania was torpedoed & sunk was the 25th birthday of his sister, Ella Jeans Weaver. Twelve years later, his son Calvin Richard Jeans was born on 6 Feb 1930.

Post-war:

"Eugene (OR) Guard" Thursday 7 Aug 1919 p 2 – newlyweds Mr. & Mrs. Archie Jeans have taken up housekeeping on the Jones ranch

Archie often hosted educational meetings on his farm in Mapleton OR.

He also collected bounties for killing various "pest" animals, such as:

"Eugene (OR) Guard" Monday 23 Sep 1935 p 3 – bounty collected by Archie Jeans of Mapleton for 1 coyote

"Eugene (OR) Guard" Sunday 5 Feb 1939 p 3 – bounty collected by Archie Jeans of Mapleton for 2 bobcats

On 19 Jul 1933, his 13-year-old son Donald Jeans was accidentally shot in the right lung by the discharge of a .22-calibre rifle. An operation was performed to remove the bullet. Articles from the "Klamath News" (Klamath Falls OR) Thursday 20 Jul 1933 p 1 and "Eugene (OR) Guard" Thursday 20 Jul 1933 p 1 copied above.

"Eugene (OR) Guard" Sunday 23 Aug 1942 p 3 – Donald Jeans of Vallejo CA was in Eugene Thursday. An employee of the Mare Island Navy yard, he is here on a week's visit with his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Archie Jeans of Mapleton.
