Hans C. Jensen Enlisted Dec 1; Was Assigned to 20th Engineers

HANS CHRISTIAN JENSEN of Oakland enlisted in the forest reserve unit of the 20th Engineers in this city December 1. He was sent to train at the American University, Washington, D. C., and assigned to Company E, 6th Battalion. He was one of the men aboard the Tuscania.

Jensen is a native of Denmark, 27 years old. His sister, Mrs. J. Anderson, lives at 3216 Adeline street, Oakland. George Sorenson, an uncle of Private Jensen, is traffic manager for the Santa Fe at Topeka, Kas.

When Jensen's battalion was ordered to prepare to sail for France the young private wrote a farewell letter to his sister, inclosing his will.

Like Own Son Since He Came From Denmark

"He's an American, that's the greatest news I could have next to the word of his safety," Mrs. H. H. Kroman, aunt of Hans Jensen, 3216 Adeline street, Oakland, said on hearing that he was among the survivors. "He's been like my own son since he came from Denmark in 1909; his mother lives there still. I could feel with the countless mothers during their moments of suspense and I rejoice with them that the toll has been so light.

It will make us all true Americans. It was the blow that was needed to awaken us to a full realization of the great things that our boys must accomplish.

I am happy that Hans has been saved; I am proud that it took but eight years to make him a true-blooded American and now I am happy that he, a naturalized citizen, has been preserved to protect the honor of his adopted country at this perilous moment.

I have not made a part of this petition any declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and has withdrawn from the Department of Labor, together with copies of the true verified affidavits thereto, required by law. Old couple kept under sedation

Woman sentenced in \$28,000 bilk

(COUNTY NEWS AREA)

A Chula Vista woman who stole about \$28,000 from an elderly couple she was supposed to be caring for was sentenced to up to 10 years in state prison when she appeared in Superior Court.

Gail Calvert, 39, of 994 Agua Tibia St., pleaded guilty to grand theft Jan. 25. The charge stemmed from allegations brought on behalf of Hans and Ingeborg Jensen, 82 and 81 respectively.

MRS. CALVERT had worked for the Danish-born couple from Aug. 25, 1969 to Feb. 7, 1970 and was charged with siphoning off her employers' savings, bonds and furniture for her own use.

The Jensen's plight was brought to light when they applied for welfare benefits at the end of the woman's five-month operation.

A nephew told probation officials the Jensens owned their own home, had \$20,000 in a savings account, \$2,000 in a checking account and more than \$4,000 in bonds.

An investigation disclosed that Mrs. Calvert had refurnished her own house twice and was in the process of redoing it a third time.

The probe also revealed Mrs. Calvert had purchased a new Lincoln Continental automobile and a new Chevrolet pickup truck.

IN ADDITION, she had ordered six telephones installed in her house and there were five color television sets

as well as all new appliances in the dwelling.

A check of the Jensens' residence revealed furniture had been sold to neighbors along with crystal chandeliers, and appliances had been removed.

Chula Vista police reports and investigations by the district attorney's office disclosed that Mrs. Calvert had kept the elderly couple under the influence of sedatives.

Mrs. Jensen was spending part of her time in a hospital while her husband was being told the money was needed to pay for her medical bills.

The Jensens are now in a rest home.

MRS. CALVERT and her 35-year-old husband, Malcolm Russell Calvert, were arrested May 14, 1970. Bail was set at \$20,000 and the pair gave a bail bond broker a bad check for \$2,000 to put up bail.

They were released and the same night, after cashing other bad checks, reports say, the pair started in the two new vehicles with five children and most of their portable possessions.

The Calverts were apprehended in Montana last August by FBI agents.

Calvert, who had married his wife shortly before she went to work for the Jensens, was extradited to California.

Mrs. Calvert persuaded a local judge to set her free so that she could look after the five children.

She instead, reports continue, left the children in North Dakota, presum-

ably with members of her family, and set out again.

HER TRAIL LED authorities to Virginia where she was reapprehended Nov. 11 with a new husband of only a few days. She was extradited to California.

Mrs. Calvert was held in the San Diego County jail, unable to post bail of \$50,000, plus a 25% penalty assessment set in Superior Court.

Calvert was held in custody until last Oct. 15 when he was released on his own recognizance.

FURTHER INVESTIGATION by authorities disclosed the Calverts were receiving \$300 per month through an aide program for families with dependent children at the same time they had been living off the Jensens' money.

They were charged with grand theft, conspiracy to defraud welfare, fraud and three counts of cashing bad checks.

Mrs. Calvert pleaded guilty to grand theft. Her other charges were dismissed.

Calvert pleaded "no contest" to the welfare fraud count on Jan. 15 and was granted three years' probation. He was ordered to make restitution of \$3,300 to welfare through the probation department.

Probation reports held that Mrs. Calvert was the instigator of the crime while recommending leniency for Calvert. The probation officer recommended state prison for the woman.

Hans H. Kroman

Hans H. Kroman, 88, whose Narrow Gauge Saloon was a favorite of early-day Oakland commuters waiting for the train at Seventh and Webster Streets, is dead.

Mr Kroman, who became a successful Oakland real estate dealer after prohibition closed his saloon, died Thursday in his home at 4343 Evans Ave.

A native of Denmark, Mr. Kroman came to Oakland in 1886 and soon afterwards opened the doors of the Narrow Gauge for patrons of the old South Pacific Coast Railroad, which plied from 14th and Franklin Streets to the Alameda Pier.

Mr. Kroman was a member of the Danish Brotherhood Lodge; Odin Lodge of Dania and

the Aerofoerenjinger Club. He is survived by his wife, Sophia; two brothers, Mads Kroman and Jens Kroman, and a sister, Mrs. Dorothea Jensen.

Funeral services, conducted by the Rev. Spencer F. Petersen, will be held at 2 p.m. Monday in the Grant Miller Mortuary at 2372 East 14th St. Burial will be in Mountain View Cemetery.

- Else Louise Jensen Christensen, 8 Jan 1911 Ålborg, Denmark – 4 Apr 1996 Alameda Co. CA. SSN 563-42-1304. Emigrated to the US in Oct 1932 with her mother Lovise, heading to her brother Hans Christian Jensen in Oakland CA. She was age 21, single, born Aalborg, Denmark. – Married 5 May 1934 in Oakland, Alameda CA to Johannes (John) B. Christensen. License: “San Francisco Examiner” 6 May 1934 p 9 – Johannes B. Christensen, age 26, Alvarado CA & Else L. Jensen, age 23, Oakland CA. – In the 1940 Hayward, Alameda CA census, John Christensen (32 Denmark) & wife Else (29 Denmark, alien) & daughter Ellen (1 CA), lived at 417 Belmar; John was the proprietor of a retail bakery. - Resident of Oakland CA. Alive in Dec 1968 when her sister Ingeborg Jensen Anderson died. – Her daughter Ellen Louisebach/Louise Christensen was born 20 Nov 1938 in Alameda Co. CA & was attending Fremont High School in 1956.

Pre-war:

Baptized in Nørresundby, Ålborg, Denmark 2 Oct 1890. Confirmed in Åby, Ålborg, Denmark on 16 Apr 1905.

Emigrated 21 Apr 1909 to NYC aboard the SS "United States" from Copenhagen, Denmark, 8 Apr 1909 arriving in NYC on 21 Apr 1909. Age 19, single, carpenter, from Ålborg, Denmark, heading to his uncle H.H. Kroman, 2209 Adeline St., Oakland CA.

Declaration of intent to become a citizen 11 May 1910 – Hans Christian Jensen, age 19, carpenter, height 5'8", 150 lbs., red hair, born Nørresundby, Denmark on 28 Jul 1890. Resident of 2207 Adeline St., Oakland CA. Emigrated from Copenhagen, Denmark, on the ship "United States" arriving in NYC on 21 Apr 1909. Last foreign residence was in Aalborg, Denmark.

Naturalized in 1914.

Petition for naturalization in Superior Court of Alameda County CA filed on 15 Jun 1914. Hans Christian Jensen, carpenter, resident of 2512 Regent St., Berkeley CA. "San Francisco Chronicle" 9 Feb 1918 p 2 – photo - sister Mrs. J. Anderson at 2216 Adeline St., Oakland CA - uncle George Sorenson is a traffic manager of Santa Fe at Topeka KS

"San Francisco Examiner" 11 Feb 1918 p 3 - aunt Mrs. H.H. Kroman, 3216 Adeline St., Oakland, says Hans Jensen has been like her son since came from Denmark in 1909. His mother is still in Denmark. A naturalized citizen, it took only 8 years to make him a "true-blooded American."

Had served in 17th Co., 20th Engineers. Was naturalized in Superior Court, Alameda Co. CA, certificate 516693, dated 29 Nov 1914, age 28 on 28 Jul 1918. Height: 5'6". Physical mark: "mole center body." Last vessel: "State Zealand" – next vessel: seaman on "Hellig Olav." [form includes his photograph & fingerprint – copied above]

Sailed aboard "Stavangerfjord" from Christiana (Oslo), Norway 27 Sep 1919 to NYC, arriving 7 Oct 1919.

Appears to be him & wife:

"Oakland (CA) Tribune" Sunday 28 Aug 1927 p 11 – travel tips for visiting Paris, France, for the convention of the American Legion. There are about 850 people going from CA, with 68 from Alameda County, 41 of those from Oakland. Attending from Berkeley CA: Hans C. & Ingeborg W. Jensen, 3140 Mabel St.

His mother & sister immigrated to the US in 1932. Lovise Petrine Jensen, age 64, widow, retired, b. Assendrup, Denmark & her daughter Else Louise Jensen, age 21, single, b. Aalborg, Denmark entered the US on a "quotavisa" issued 20 Jul 1932. Their last residence abroad was Aalborg, Denmark. They sailed from Copenhagen, Denmark, on 7 Oct 1932 aboard "Frederik VIII" – arrived in NYC on 18 Oct 1932. Their relative was Lovise's daughter Anna Sorensen, resident of Villa "Rosthøj" in Mølholm, Denmark. They were heading to San Francisco CA to Lovise's son/Else's brother Hans Chr. Jensen, 4927 Cocham [then "Cochrane" is written in], Oakland CA. They planned to live in the US "forever." Both had a medical certificate statement – Lovise had senility and varicose ---. Else had def. vision. Both were "justified."

In 1970-1971, Hans & Ingeborg, then in their 80s, were bilked of \$28,000 by a woman named Gail Calvert, who was hired as their caretaker, working for them from 25 Aug 1969 to 7 Feb 1979. During these 5 months, she kept them under sedation while she stole their money, furniture, chandeliers & appliances. The scheme came to light when Hans & Ingeborg Jensen applied for welfare. Gail & her husband Malcolm Russell Calvert posted bond & fled, with Gail being apprehended in MT. She was sentenced to 10 years in state prison on charges of grand theft, conspiracy to defraud welfare, fraud & passing bad checks. The Jensens were placed in a rest home. Article in "Imperial Beach (CA) Star-News" Sunday 14 Feb 1971 p 2.
