Contact With Wire Is Fatal to Worker

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 19.—Accidental contact with a high power electric line while at work upon a pole caused the death of Noah Jackson, 44, of 305 South Lake Tuesday. Thomas Witt received severe burns and lost two fingers when he attempted to rescue Jackson, and was himself rescued by other men who cut the wires.

Lineman Loses 2 Fingers in Futile Try to Save Pal

When his body came in contact with a high voltage wire at the top of a light pole at Naud and Wilhite streets yesterday, Noah Jackson, 44, of 305 South Lake street, was so badly burned that he died shortly after the accident, despite heroic efforts of Lincoln Heights police to revive him with an inhalator.

Thomas Witt, 28, of 2108 East Avenue 31, made a vallant effort to rescue his comrade and suffered severe burns of both hands, it being necessary to amputate two fingers of the right hand. He was treated by Police Surgeon Saverien at Receiving hospital.

A. W. Kermode, J. P. Bennett and James Stewart, fellow workmen of the two injured linemen, climbed the pole and carried down the stricken workers. All were employed by the bureau of power and light.

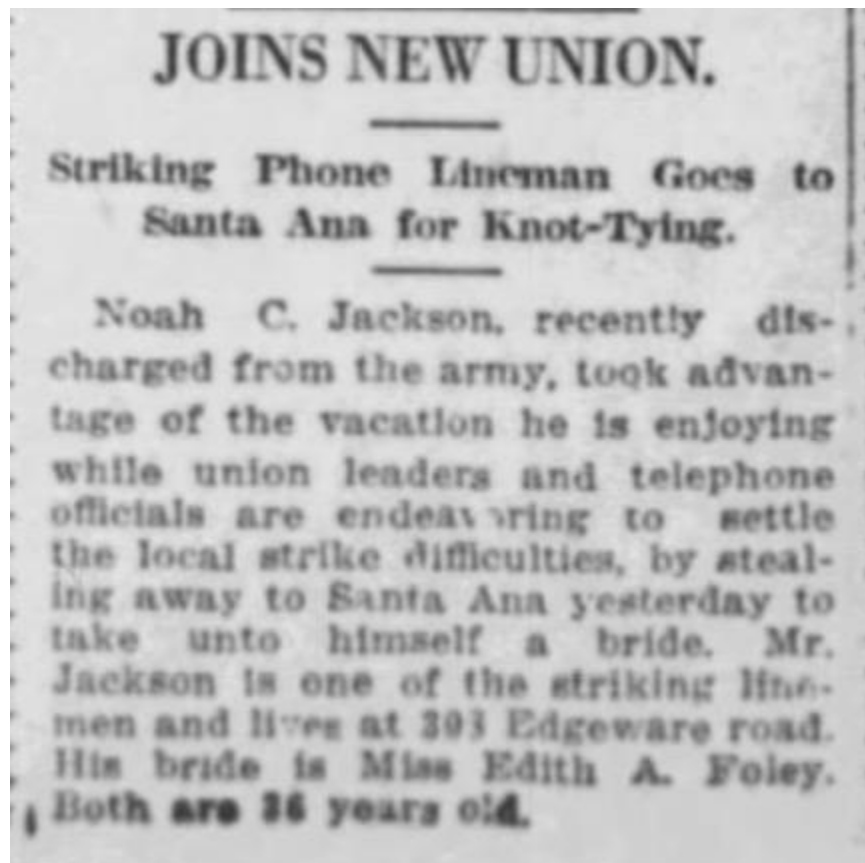

FALLS ASLEEP WITH CIGARET IN MOUTH

LEONARD JACKSON INCINERATED
AS HE LAY IN BUNK HOUSE
AT SANTA MARIA.

The body of Leonard Jackson, aged 28, who was burned to death at Santa Maria last Friday night, was buried yesterday at the coast town, funeral arrangements being made by his brother, J. R. Jackson, who went to Santa Maria from his home in Los Angeles.

Young Jackson was well known here, having been employed as a waiter at the French Cafe of late. He was a member of Cooks and Waiters' union No. 550. He was a rig builder, leaving here to accept a position at his trade on an oil lease at Santa Maria.

Jackson met death in a bunk house, where he had fallen asleep with a cigarette in his mouth, according to information received here from the coroner at Santa Maria by Isaac Blunberg, secretary of the Cooks and Waiters' union. Besides his brother Jackson is survived by a sister, Mrs. Dickson, who resides on A street in this city.

VICTIM DIES OF INJURY

Santa Maria Times.

Leonard Jackson died this morning at one of the sanitariums from burns sustained last night at one of the Central Rooming House cottages, due to the bed clothes catching fire.

Jackson was horribly burned all over on his body and his agony must have been terrible.

How the fire originated is not known, but it is presumed to be due to a cigarette having fallen into the bed clothes.

He was 25 years of age and has a brother at Coalinga and another at Los Angeles.

Judge Morris summoned a coroner's jury and held an inquest on the remains today.

Edith's obituary (copied above) appeared in the "Los Angeles Times" Wednesday 13 Mar 1963 p 47. Survivors were 2 nieces, 1 nephew, 1 cousin. Buried in the same plot with Noah with her tombstone inscribed "Edith Jackson Wegren" in Forest Lawn Memorial Park, Glendale, Los Angeles CA.

Foley, age 36, both residents of Los Angeles CA. It was Noah's 2nd marriage, having been widowed & Edith's first. They were married 23 or 24 Jun 1919 in Santa Ana, Orange CA. The "Los Angeles Times" Wednesday 25 Jun 1919 p 22 reported that Noah C. Jackson, 393 Edgeware, recently returned from the Army & currently 1 of the union electrical linemen on strike, stole away to Santa Ana CA yesterday to join a different union – marriage to Miss Edith A. Foley. Both bride & groom were age 36. [Note that the next year, in the 1920 census, Noah says he is 34 years old & Edith says she is 33.]

Taylor, 1874-1950, buried in Bates City Cemetery, Bates City, Lafayette MO, F: 152693041, with Hattie Ann Taylor (1884-1964)?
- James Fremont Jackson, 6 Aug 1877 in AZ or NM or "on the Santa Fe trail" – 14 Jul 1937 or 1938 El Dorado Springs, Cedar MO. Age 2 in the 1880 census, b. AZ. Jackson, married 24 Mar 1908 in Los Angeles, Los Angeles CA to Ellen Mary Smith, both age 25. He was the son of John Jackson & Sarah Baker, she the daughter of Charles J. Smith & Lydia Gifford. - His CA death record lists his mother's birth surname as Baker. His obituary in the "Los Angeles Times" Wednesday 11 Jun 1952 p 40 is copied above. CA death record: son of Jonathan A. Jackson, mother's birth surname Baker. Widowed. Lived 50 years in Los Angeles CA. Serviceman for Southern California Telegraph & Telephone. Died at White Memorial Hospital. Burial in Rosedale Cemetery. Buried in Angelus Rosedale Cemetery, Los Angeles, Los Angeles CA but not on Find A Grave as of 1 Apr 2021.
- Alice Elizabeth Jackson Gray, 17 Jul 1885 Rice Co. KS (Jul 1885 in 1900 census) – 6 Jan 1963 French Camp or Stockton, San Joaquin CA. Wife of Clarence Gray (1884 MO – 1966 CA, F: 223548204). Both were employed at Stockton (CA) State Hospital. Her CA death record & Social Security record list her mother's birth surname as Baker. Buried in Park View Cemetery, Manteca, San Joaquin CA. F: 223548063
- Leonard Harrison/ Marion Leonard / Lenard Jackson, Nov 1888 KS – 22 Jan 1917 [or 26 or 24 Jan] Santa Maria, Santa Barbara CA. Listed as Lenard M., born Nov 1888 KS in the 1900 census). Two news stories about his death are copied above. He fell asleep with a lighted cigarette in his mouth, was burned badly and died later. He is listed as a rig builder, the same occupation that Noah claims. Buried in Santa Monica Cemetery, Santa Monica, Santa Barbara CA. F: 70826606
- Eva Mae/Marie Jackson Ferguson, 8 Jul 1890 KS (listed as Jul 1890 in 1900 census) - 9 Aug 1982 Sacramento Co. CA. SSN 570-70-6123. CA death record lists mother's birth surname as Baker.

Notes:

There are several men named Noah Jackson found in newspaper accounts in KS, including Noah D. Jackson of Centerville KS who married Nellie McRae.

But there are some unresolved questions.

There is a long list of their children on their family tree. There is a Noah Asher Jackson, b. 1886 listed – an Eva Marie Jackson (1890-1982) who is Noah C. Jackson's sister from California evidence – an Alice Elizabeth Jackson (1885-1963) also identified as his sister in CA - but no John/Jack Jackson, Noah's wartime next-of-kin.

"Los Angeles (CA) Evening-Post" 9 Feb 1918 p 1 – telegrams are pouring into local homes announcing the safe rescue of Tuscania survivors, but in some homes relatives are anxiously awaiting news, like the relatives of Sgt. Noah Jackson, 100th Aero Squadron, 308 Edgeware Rd.
