Fatal Milpitas Accident

Truck-Auto Crash Kills 3 Mothers, 3 Daughters

MILPITAS (AP) — Six persons were killed—three mothers and three daughters—in a head-on collision between a light sedan and a huge truck and trailer near the Ford plant here last night.

The sedan was demolished. The bodies of the dead and dying were strewn over the highway.

The accident took place at the intersection of the Old Oakland Highway and Capital Ave. about 9:30 p.m. Apparently, the sedan containing the women was headed toward Oakland.

William F. Cisneros, 32, San Jose, the truck driver, said the car suddenly entered the highway in front of his truck. He said he was unable to swerve in time to avoid hitting it. He suffered a broken arm.

The victims, all of Oakland, were:

Mrs. Jeanette Ramirez, 27, and her daughter, Marvel Lee, 12, Mrs. Evelyn Brackett, 31, and her daughter Sue, 13, and Mrs.

Nellie Mae Kelly, 32, and her daughter Eva Drennan, 14.

Four of the victims were killed instantly. Mrs. Kelly died an hour after her arrival at O'Connor Hospital in San Jose. Sue Brackett died after reaching Santa Clara County Hospital in San Jose.

The three mothers were en-route home from San Luis Obispo where they had gone to pick up their daughters who reportedly had run away from home last Tuesday. Two of the women, Mrs. Kelley and Mrs. Brackett, were sisters.

Mrs. Brackett, it was reported, was due at work last night at the Owens Illinois Glass Company where she is employed.

What the women were doing on the old highway and not the new Oakland freeway, authorities didn't know, but it is believed in the dark and rain they became confused about the routes.

The bodies were taken to the Chapel of the Flowers in San Jose pending removal to Oakland.

WAR BOARD NOW IN FULL CHARGE

Ed. (Butch) Fink, of Alluwe, and Joseph R. Johnson, of Cedar, the two Nowata county soldiers who were aboard the Tuscania, were among those who were saved when the big transport was sunk by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland and the kaiser lost in his first round with the soldiers of Nowata county.

August Fink, of Alluwe, the father of Ed. Fink, received notice from the war department Monday that his son was among those who had been landed safely in England. Even before the telegram was received the friends of "Butch" Fink at Alluwe boasted that "if the boat was within 200 miles of land when it was sunk and anyone was saved that 'Butch' would be among the survivors." The Alluwe boy came through without injury and made good the boasts of his friends. Those who knew Johnson were alike confident that if the torpedo did not make a direct hit on his person that he would be in the list of saved. They, too, proved to be good prophets.

The report that the Nowata county soldiers got through without mishap was received with relief by all of the people of Nowata county.
