CORPORAL JOHNSON NOT DEAD, AS REPORTED

Maryville, Tenn., Jan. 18.—It has been reported in the papers that Corporal Thomas A. Johnson was missing in action. His sister, Miss Mattie Johnson, of Maryville, received a telegram from the war office saying that Corporal Johnson had been missing since October 13th, but Miss Johnson has received several letters since that date. Her brother has been in a hospital in southern France, is well, and expecting to come home soon.

Corporal Johnson is with the 18th infantry, First division. He enlisted in Waxahachie, Texas, and is a Knoxville boy, but has lived in Texas for several years. He sailed for France last February on the Tuscania, the vessel that was torpedoed off the Irish coast.

**T. A. JOHNSON SPENT SEVERAL
HOURS IN THE WATER BE-
FORE HE WAS PICKED UP**

T. A. Johnson, of Texas, who was the guest of his sister, Mrs. J. T. Tillery in Maryville last week, was one of the soldiers aboard the Tuscania which was sunk by a German torpedo vessel on Feb. 5, 1918. Mr. Johnson gives a vivid account of the torpedoing of the big transport which carried about 2,000 men. He said that the officers of the vessel had been dodging submarines, having been advised of their presence nearby. It was about dark that the fatal shot came. Mr. Johnson said that as he left the vessel the ship was standing about on its side. Because of the excitement among some of the men, a number of the boats were lost

and some fatalities occurred through mishandling of the life boats, while others perished in the water before relief could come to them. Mr. Johnson said he was in the water about six or seven hours on a raft before he was picked up by a tug boat and carried to the shores of Ireland.

Mr. Johnson was a member of the thirty-second division, and was in the battles of Soissons, St. Mihiel and the Argonne. He said he had a great experience but he did not hope to have another one like it.

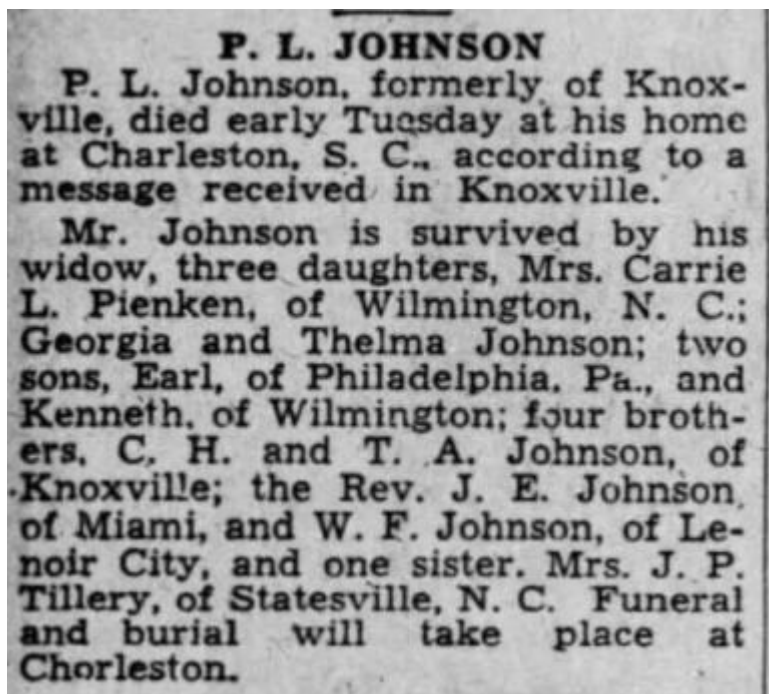

Rev. J. E. Johnson Comes
From Texas to Preach at
Deaderick Avenue.

HAS GAINED SUCCESS

Twenty-Four Years, He Was
Leader of a Bible Class at
This Church.

Rev. J. Edward Johnson, of Texas, and Rev. C. O. Johnson, of Louisville, Ky., will preach at the Deaderick Avenue Baptist church Sunday. Rev. J. E. Johnson began his active religious life with the Centennial, now the Deaderick Avenue Baptist church, twenty-four years ago. He united with this church and taught a large Bible class in the Sabbath school. He was for several years one of the most active members of this church. He was educated at Carson and Newman college at Jefferson City, and at the Southern Baptist theological seminary at Louisville, Ky. Since completing his education, Rev. Mr. Johnson has occupied some of the leading pulpits of the south, and has been eminently successful in all of his work. He was for several years pastor of First Baptist church of La Grange, Ky., also the First church of Hubbard City, Texas, the Seventh Street church of Waco, Texas, and the First Baptist church of Waxahatchie, Texas. From this pastorate he recently resigned to accept the educational secretaryship of the Foreign Mission board, which position he now holds, which is one of great importance. His many friends are delighted with the privilege of hearing him again. He will speak at the Deaderick Avenue church at the morning service; and at the Bell Avenue Baptist church at the evening service. Rev.

Mr. Johnson has been attending the Southern Baptist convention in Asheville, and after spending a few days with old friends and relatives will return to his field of labor in Texas.

Rev. C. O. Johnson, who is to fill the pulpit of the Deaderick Avenue church at the evening service, was also a former member of this church. He was educated at Carson and Newman college. Immediately after he graduated from this college, he was called to the Deaderick Avenue church as an assistant pastor, and served the church in a most acceptable manner. He resigned from this position to accept a call to the pastorate of one of the leading churches of Los Angeles. He recently resigned this pastorate in order to take a special course of study at Baptist Theological seminary at Louisville, Ky.

He has a host of friends in Knoxville who will be delighted to hear him again. He will speak at the Bell Avenue Baptist church at the morning hour and at the Deaderick Avenue church at the evening service.

W. W. Shannon, of the Stough party, will speak to the Baraca class at the Deaderick avenue Sabbath school at 9:30 o'clock. Gen. R. A. Mynatt, who is the teacher of the Baraca class at Deaderick avenue, is expecting a large attendance of the men to hear Mr. Shannon. A special invitation is extended the men of the city to meet with the class and hear Mr. Shannon.

SOME TENNESSEANS IN TEXAS.

There are those who will remember J. Edward Johnson of Knoxville and O. L. Hailey, who was pastor there. When I was pastor I had the privilege of baptizing J. Edward Johnson. We did not know then the value of that service to the denomination. After a splendid career, Johnson reached Hubbard City, Texas, where he did a splendid work. He was then called to the care of Seventh and James Street church, Waco. That is near Baylor University. There he had a phenomenal success. Then Waxa-

hachie wanted him. They were more successful than many other places, for he located there. It was thence I called him to help me in Corsicana. He came July 15. The weather was up about the 100 degree mark, and did not fall. There was a most vigorous political campaign on, and we had many who could not attend. But we needed the meeting. Johnson set the standard high and sounded the rally. The ranks closed up. He was with me ten days. There were nearly fifty professions. So far, 23 have joined the church. Many more are confidently expected. The church is greatly edified.

I have had many preachers help me in meetings, but I do not think I have ever had so good preaching all the way through. It was just right. Not a single adverse word has reached me.

When you consider that I have been pastor here for three years and seven months, and that we have received 178 by letter and statement and 196 by baptism, making a total of 374, that is a pretty encouraging meeting. It was a great joy to have Brother Johnson come and help us. He is a splendid gospel preacher. Of course we talked Tennessee. And you may say that I am planning to spend a part of August in Tennessee, perhaps the third and fourth Sundays. A greeting to Tennessee Baptists.
