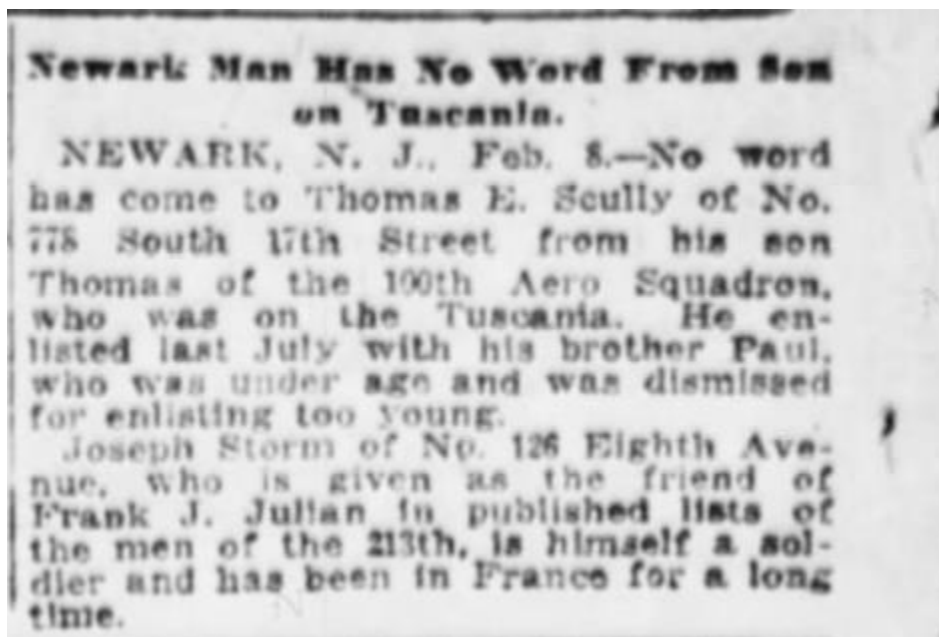

He worked for many years as a hairdresser and manager of the G. Fox & Co. Beauty Salon in Hartford. He was a veteran of the U.S. Air Force. He is survived by a daughter, Teresa of Newington; a son, Peter of East Hartford; his father and step-mother, Frank and Mary Juliano, Sr. of Avon; his mother and step-father, Mary and Salvatore Bartolotta of Wethersfield; a brother, Anthony Juliano of Windsor; a sister, Jo Ann Montano of Avon; a grandson, Peter, Jr.; his maternal grandmother, Pauline Conforto of Hartford; and several nieces; and nephews. The funeral is Monday, 9 a.m., from the D'Esopo Funeral Chapel, 277 Folly Brook Blvd., Wethersfield, with a mass of Christian burial, 10 a.m., in Corpus Christi Church, Wethersfield. Little is known definitively about this soldier. His name is common and was likely to be Juliano or Guliano originally. He also might have been Francesco and his middle name Joseph.

Enlisted 6 Apr 1917 (pre-draft). Discharged 24 Jan 1920 (remained in Army post-war).

There was a Frank J. Julian born 2 Mar 1897 East Orange, Essex NJ who died 18 Nov 1927 in Trenton, Mercer NJ.

Many of you on this forum seem to have a great deal of expertise, and our family would appreciate it very much if you could help us solve the mystery surrounding our heritage.

My grandfather left conflicting information before his death, but what we consider most accurate is this: According to military records, Frank Joseph Julian (or Gulian, or an Italian form of that name) was born in Rome, Italy in approximately 1895. He lists a mother by the name of Natiaro along with his siblings, all living in Rome. He came to America on the Verona, sailing from Naples and arriving at Ellis Island on April 1, 1909. My grandfather served in the U.S. Army during World War I, and fought in France. His injuries led to the posthumous award of the Purple Heart. During his lifetime, he claimed to be French, and it was only after his death in 1969 that our family found the military records indicating an Italian heritage.

Our family is very eager to solve this mystery, but we can't seem to make any progress, because it seems as if the answer lies in Italy. Any assistance you could lend us would be gratefully appreciated.

He left Naples May 1st, 1909

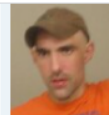
He left behind his mother Girolama back in Pignataro and is 18 years old. He was also on his way to Rochester, NY to meet his uncle Raffaele Sc.....

"New York Evening World" 8 Feb 1918 p 4 – Frank Julian's contact Joseph Storm, 126 - 8th Ave., is himself a soldier who has been in France a long time

“New York (NY) Herald” 9 Feb 1918: Mr. & Mrs. Frank J. Juliano of 8 Aquaduct Alley, Newark NJ, think this is their son who enlisted in Jun 1917. He gave the name of James Storm as his next-of-kin, but Storm has enlisted & is believed to be in France. [cannot relocate this article]

“Buffalo (NY) Times” 10 Feb 1918 p 14 – among the saved: Frank J. Julian, 126 – 8<sup>th</sup> Ave., Newark NJ.

#### Is this him?

A Frank Joseph Julian, age 26, married on 8 Sep 1921 in Chautauqua Co. NY to Flora J. Stilson. He was listed as the son of George Julian & Mary Gioilson.

#### Is this him?

“Asbury Park (NJ) Press” 18 Jan 1923 p 2

Three convicts escaped from the NJ state prison farm at Leesburg, Cumberland County, on 17 Jan 1923 and have not been captured. One, Frank J. Julian, has a two- to three-year sentence for robbery. He is about 30 years old, from Newark NJ. One of 10 arrested for fake hold-up, age 23.

#### Is this him?

“Camden (NJ) Morning Post” 1 May 1931 p 3

In Philadelphia PA: Frank Julian, age 45, Wildwood NJ, married Mary Mastrangelo, age 44, 529 Marilyn Rd. (dubious about this one)

#### Is this him?

“Long Branch (NJ) Daily-Record” 21 May 1937 p 1

Spying neighbors told Mrs. Frank Julian of “goings-on” in a bungalow at 42 Maryland Place, and she found her estranged husband and a woman there on 20 May 1937. An adultery charged was pressed by Mrs. Matilda Julian of 226 Academy St., Newark, in court. Husband Frank Julian (58 Telford St., Newark) and Mrs. Catherine Mauriodias (569 High St., Newark) are being held by Newark authorities. Police there wanted to talk to Frank about an alleged parole violation stemming from a domestic relations court there. The Julians have two children but have been separated three years.

Mrs. Julian was in Minnesota last year with a nervous breakdown, when she heard that Frank was visiting their North Long Branch bungalow with another woman. Reports of his activities continued through spring, until on 19 May she went to the bungalow. She found disturbed beds, and left the premises. She returned the morning of 20 May to find Frank and Cathereine there. A neighbor, Mrs. Palmer, had been spying on the bungalow and reporting to Matilda.

P. 3 – Mrs. Palmer reported seeing Frank and Catherine “affectionate” on the beach. Frank would not talk to her when she came to the house; he said he was scared of her as she had hit him over the head with a jar while he was visiting his children, and he went to a Newark hospital. Frank said he was showing Catherine the bungalow as a possible summer rental. Matilda wanted to know why

this involved a bottle of whiskey. Frank said he often slept at the bungalow and kept whiskey there for his own use. Matilda said she doesn't want Frank back as a husband; he does pay his alimony.

"Camden (NJ) Morning Post" 6 Feb 1940 p 18 – in Trenton NJ, a divorce was reversed by the NJ Supreme Court. Frank Julian, a Newark tailor, asked for a divorce from Matilda. He claims she hit a vase over his head, causing a deep wound. She said it was self-defense. The court ruled the act was not extreme cruelty.

"Bridgewater (NJ) Courier News" 6 Feb 1940 p 3  
The father of seven. She got the decree of divorce due to infidelity.

**Is this him?**

"Long Branch (NJ) Daily Record" 28 May 1940 p 4:  
Louise P. Julian, daughter of Frank Julian of Newark NJ & Mrs. Frank Julian of Long Branch NJ married Clarence S. Throckmorton Jr. at Sacred Heart, Vailsburg.

December 1944: Thomas L. Julian wounded, son of Frank Julian, 38 Telford St., Newark NJ

1920 Camp Merritt, Bergen NJ – this appears to be the correct Frank as his Army discharge occurred 24 Jan 1920 – this census was conducted 22 Jan 1920

Frank Julian, 27 NJ, father's & mother's birth places entered as "unknown" - then crossed off & U.S. written as places of birth, corporal, US Army
