ONLY THREE SPOKANE MEN ON TUSCANIA NOW MISSING

Irene Smith, Anton B. Olson and Jesse R. Kime,
All From Spokane County, Unaccounted For
—List of Survivors Still Incomplete.

All but three men from Spokane county who were on the torpedoed troop transport Tuscania have been accounted safe by the war department, in Associated Press dispatches, or wires to relatives.

Irene Smith, a private in the headquarters company of the Sixth battalion, 20th engineers (forest), is still missing, as are Anton B. Olson of Milan, and Jesse Robert Kime of Deer Park. Smith has a wife and two children residing in the city, and formerly worked for the Phoenix mill.

Twenty-one Left in Halifax

The safety of twenty-one more soldiers who sailed on the Tuscania was assured to-day by announcement from the War Department that the men were taken from the ship at Halifax because they were ill. The names of the twenty-one ill, who now are removed from the list of missing, follow:

HOMES FOR THREE OF SEVEN POOR CHILDREN

Seven children of Mrs. Kimes of Deer Park, who was sent as a destitute to the county farm a few days ago, were brought to the city and lodged with Matron Hubbard of the juvenile detention quarters last night. Miss Hubbard reports that the youngsters were in a pitiable plight. They received warm baths and good food and today are enjoying themselves. This after-

noon they were removed to the quarters of the Washington Children's society, not the Northwestern Home Finding association, until the 13th when their cases will be taken up by the authorities. The oldest is a boy of 15 years, while the youngest is but 15 months old. Applications have already been made for the adoption of three of the children.

Jesse Kime, a 14-year-old white boy, was found in the Indian camp near Fairmount cemetery last night by Probation Officer Gifford and brought to the juvenile detention rooms.

The boy stated that he is being taken care of by a preacher named White, and that during his guardian's absence for a couple of weeks he paid a visit to the local camp. White is preacher on the Spokane Indian reservation.

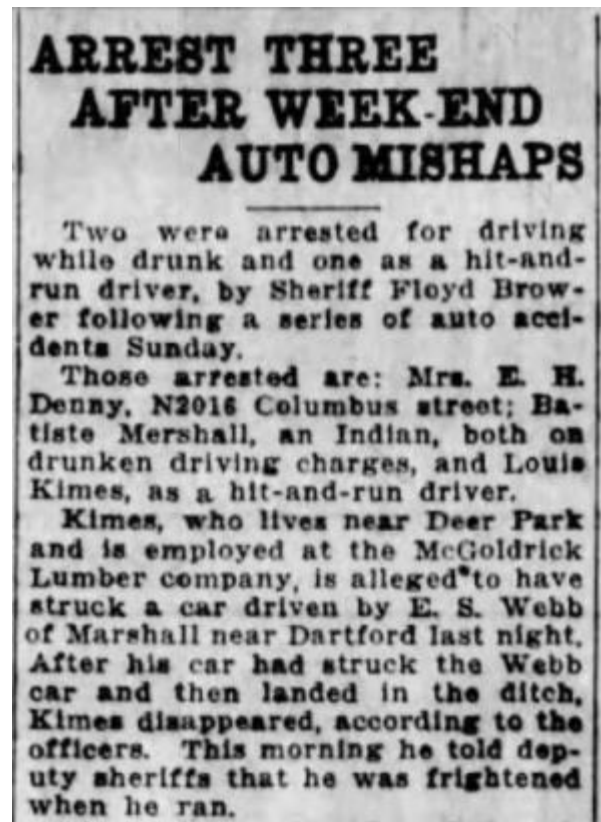
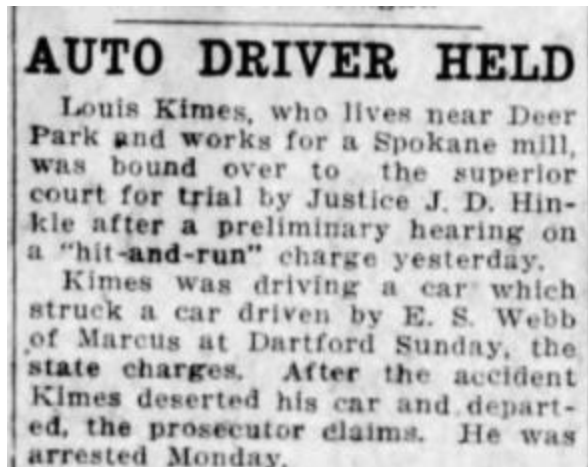

- William Emmet Kime, 10 Jan 1923 NY – 9 Feb 2007. SSN 089-14-3340. Twin brother of James Kime; listed 2nd in the 1930 & 1940 censuses, so presumably the younger. His Social Security number is 1 digit lower than that of his twin. When he registered for the WWII draft

on 30 Jun 1942 (the same day as his twin), he lived at 147 Skillman St., NYC, NY & listed Mrs. Fanny Kime of that address as his next-of-kin. He was unemployed. - Resident of Selden NY in Sep 1973. His residence at the time of his death was Shirley, Suffolk NY.

- Kenneth Anthony Kime, 27 Apr 1926 NY – Mar 1987 (presumably NY; last residence was Shirley, Suffolk NY). SSN 109-20-6502. – When he registered for the WWII draft on 28 Apr 1944, he lived at 166 Franklin Ave., Brooklyn NY with his next-of-kin Mrs. Frances Kime. He was employed at the Waterbury Rope Co. & had a speech impediment. - Resident of Selden NY in Sep 1973. Buried in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, Center Moriches, Suffolk NY. F: 178457732

Siblings: In the 1900 census, his mother reports giving birth to 7 children, 5 of whom are living. Listed are Arthur, Etta, Mable, Jessie & Francis so 2 additional siblings had died. In the 1910 census his mother Laura reports having birth to 10 children, 8 of whom are living.

- Arthur Clarence Kime, 27 Sep 1890 CO – 7 Sep 1922 Spokane, Spokane WA. Probably the 15-year-old boy referred to in the newspaper when he & his siblings were taken into care in Feb 1906. In the 1920 census Arthur, 29 Colorado, lives with his parents & youngest brother Louis in Denison, Spokane WA. His WA death certificate lists him as a rancher, single, died of status lymphatacus. His death was a corner's case; an autopsy was performed. Buried in Wild Rose Cemetery, Deer Park, Spokane WA. F: 20475964
- Etta Belle Kime Harper, 13 May 1892 KS – 27 Jan 1957 Alameda, Alameda CA. Wife of William Mumford Harper (1881-1967) whom she married 22 Jun 1909 in Spokane, Spokane WA. Not on Find A Grave as of 6 Jun 2021.
- Mable E. Kime Clark, 1 Jan 1894 Sharon Springs, Wallace KS – 3 Jul 1978 Deer Park, Spokane WA. Wife of Clifford Justin Clark (1875-1942, F: 78299434) whom she married 12 May 1911 in Spokane, Spokane WA. In the 1930 census her father William Kime lived with them in Denison, Spokane WA. Buried in Greenwood Memorial Terrace, Spokane, Spokane WA. F: 78323588
- Frances Vesta Kime Sahli, 14 Feb 1900 Sharon Springs, Wallace KS – 8 Mar 1990 Torrance, Los Angeles CA. SSN 548-71-6227. Wife of Wilfred Bruce Sahli (1897-1963) whom she married 15 Jun 1918 in Los Angeles Co. CA. Her foster parents are Willard Franklin Merrick & Mary May Elvira Davey Merrick. She is listed in 1910 in the Los Angeles Co. CA census as their "adopted daughter." Buried in Pacific Crest Cemetery, Redondo Beach, Los Angeles Co. CA. F: 160506846
- Girl Kime, b. 31 Jul 1902 WA (according to an Ancestry.com family tree). Since there were 7 children removed from the Kime home, this would make an accurate count.
- Boy Kime? A 15-month-old boy is listed in the article describing the removal of the Kime children from their home.
- Louis Franklin Kimes, 14 Jul 1904 Deer Park, Spokane WA – 22 Oct 2000 Everett, Snohomish WA. SSN 535-07-6916. His surname appears as KIMES. The newspaper article about the removal of the seven Kime children mentions a boy who is 15 months old in Jan/Feb 1906; this might be him. He is listed as Lewis Kime, age 3, in the 1910 census for Denison, Spokane WA, living with his parents William & Laura, which means he was likely born after the removal of his siblings in 1906. In the 1920 census he is living in Denison WA with his parents & older brother Arthur. In 1920 he is listed as age 10, making his birth ca. 1910 (but that census said he was 3). - Husband of Ruth Laura Schultz (1912-2010, F: 90047911) whom he married 16 Mar 1941 in Seattle, King WA. Buried in Crown Hill Cemetery, Seattle, King WA. F: 90047881

Notes: Sometimes the family surname is found spelled KIME and sometimes KIMES. It appears Jesse's youngest brother use the KIMES spelling.

Pre-war:

In late January/early February 1906, Jesse's mother was sent as a destitute to the county farm, leaving behind her 7 children, who were in a "pitiable plight" when taken to the juvenile detention center for baths & food. Their case was to be heard on 13 Feb 1906. Applications had already been received to adopt 3 of the children. [There is no mention of the family father, William Kime.]

Jesse was taken into the care of Rev. Hiram F. White. His sister Frances Vesta Kime is adopted into the family of Willard Merrick. In 1909, while Rev. White is absent for a few weeks, being a preacher on the Spokane reservation, 14-year-old Jesse moves into a Native American camp near the Fairmount Cemetery, from where he is taken by authorities to juvenile detention.

Jesse visits his maternal grandparents, the Cochran family, in 1914 & 1915.

Wartime:

"Semi-Weekly Spokesman-Review" (Spokane WA) 11 Feb 1918 p 1 - no news about him (but he was not on the ship) - lived on Wild Rose prairie, on farm when enlisted, 22 years old.

"Spokane (WA) Spokesman-Review" 11 Feb 1918 p 2 – Jesse Robert Kime, father William E. Kime of Deer Park, who was on Tuscania, has not yet been reported lost or saved as of 11 p.m. 10 Feb 1918.

Post-war:

"Brooklyn (NY) Daily Eagle" Thursday 23 Sep 1937 p 5 – Joseph M. Keegan, age 19, nephew of Mrs. Jesse Kime of 147 Skillman St., was accepted by the US Marine Corps.

"Brooklyn (NY) Daily Eagle" Saturday 23 Jun 1945 p 5 – obituary of Rose Keegan Goetz, who died 19 Jun 1945. She was the daughter of the late Caroline Keegan. Survived by her sister, Frances Kime & brother-in-law Jeffe [sic/Jesse] Kime & 4 nephews, among them James, William & Kenneth Kime [sons of Jesse & Frances]. Rose was the wife of George Aloysius Goetz. She was born 1894 NY, died 1945 NY, F: 193749986.
