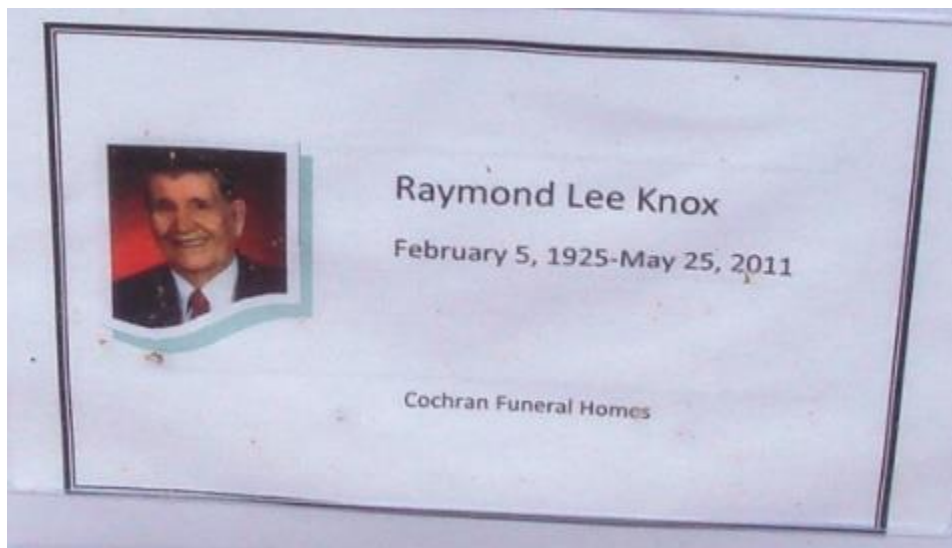

Mishap Victim's Funeral Today

BRECKENRIDGE, Dec. 14 — Funeral for Willie C. Glenn, brother of Mrs. D. B. Knox and J. R. Glenn of Abilene, was scheduled for 3 p. m. Saturday at the Breckenridge cemetery, where burial was to take place under direction of the Kiker funeral home.

The Rev. A. J. Morgan, Baptist minister, was to conduct the rites.

Mr. Glenn, 30, an oil well pumpjack operator for Rush & Griswold oil operators at Odessa, died in an Odessa hospital at 8 p. m. Wednesday of injuries suffered when dragged 973 yards by a horse on Friday, Dec. 6.

The accident occurred while Mr. Glenn was trying to train one of his horses as a rope horse and was caught in a loop of the rope.

Mr. Glenn had lived at Odessa the past nine years, but was at Caddo most of his life prior to that time.

Survivors in addition to the Abileneans are his wife and two daughters, Lynette and Sherry Ann of Odessa; parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Glenn of Breckenridge; sisters, Mrs. J. M. Henley of Carthage, Mrs. Woodrow Peeks of Odessa and Mrs. Bob Holford of McCamey; five brothers, Ernest Glenn of Pampa, Dee of Caddo, O. B. of Breckenridge and Delbert of Texon.
