Club Mourns John Kujawski

Outside the Wisconsin club Monday morning, the flag was at half staff. Inside, there was a special notice on the members' bulletin board. Both were saying the same thing: Johnny was dead. For more than 60 years, John Kujawski was almost as much a club fixture as the gazebo which graces the gardens of the private club at 900 W. Wisconsin av.



Mr. Kujawski

tel. Club personnel called him captain.

Club members called him Johnny. There are now 850 members, some of them grandchildren of members Mr. Kujawski knew in the early part of the century. His ability to recognize all the members by name was widely known.

In 1954, the club honored Mr. Kujawski with a dinner attended by members.

Mr. Kujawski continued working at the club until a few weeks ago when he became ill. He died Thursday at Mount Sinai hospital of a heart ailment.

A notice of his death was

posted on the members' bulletin board, an honor usually reserved for members. Members had requested the notice.

A Milwaukee native, Mr. Kujawski, 78, lived at 3361 N. 54th st. He was a member of the Old Time Baseball Players Association of Wisconsin and of St. Casimir's Catholic church, 2620 N. Bremen st., where the funeral was held Monday. Burial was in Holy Cross cemetery.

He is survived by his wife, Mary; a son, Robert, La Crosse, and two sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Orcholski and Mrs. Charles (Lillian) Bloom, and a brother, Stanley, all of Milwaukee.

He started as a pin boy in 1904, when the club was called the Deutscher club, when there were fewer than 50 members and when the bowling was nine pins—bowlers rolled a large ball with no finger holes.

Later, Mr. Kujawski was put in charge of the billiards room, then became a waiter and in 1940, the maitre d'ho-

His NOK is his father, Barney John [?] Kujawski of 2608 W. Locust. "left ear deformed" – 5'9" – 140 lbs. – Robert enlisted in the US Army on 13 Aug 1942 Milwaukee, Milwaukee WI. Husband of Dorothy Schlueter (4 Jul 1916-6 Jul 2013, SSN 391-10-3895). – Both Robert & Dorothy are buried (according to their obituaries) in Graceland Cemetery, Milwaukee, Milwaukee WI (where Barney & Mathilda are buried) but not on Find A Grave as of 2 Jul 2021.

Siblings: his siblings – as did Bernard (who became Barney) changed the Polish versions of their first names to Americanized ones. Barney/Bernard was born between John & Stanley. In Polish, the letter "A" ends feminine names & the letter "I" ends masculine names. In the 1900 census his mother Anna says she has given birth to 12 children, 9 of whom are living – and in the 1910 census, as given birth to 12 children, 8 of whom are living.

Husband of Rosalie/Rosalia Beker (Balger), with whom he had 4 children between 1896 & 1901. – On his marriage record, Jakob Kujawski, b. Bublit, a steamfitter, son of Ferdinand Bublit & Amalia Raasch. Buried in Holy Cross Cemetery & Mausoleum, Milwaukee, Milwaukee WI. F: 170236513
