The petition of Anthony Larsen hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 3109 Division Ave, Chicago, Illinois.

Second. My occupation is electrician.

Third. I was born on the 13 day of May, anno Domini 1888, at Hinder, Denmark.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Copenhagen, Denmark on or about the 1 day of July, anno Domini 1910, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Philadelphia, Pa, on the 1 day of August, anno Domini 1910 on the vessel Nordcape.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 1 day of August, anno Domini 1910, at Chicago, in the 1 Court of Chicago.

Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is _____. She was born _____ in _____, and now resides at _____ (Give number and street.) Chicago, Illinois.

I have _____ children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practices of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Christian X King of Denmark, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 1 day of August, anno Domini 1910, and in the State of Illinois, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 10 day of July, anno Domini 1917, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____ at _____ on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 1917, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, _____

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
