The last survivor of the *Tuscania*, Edwin Clark Lewis, died April 1, 2001, in Zephyrhills, Florida. Born May 13, 1899, in Westford, Connecticut, Lewis was 101 years old at the time of his death. He is buried in Oakside Cemetery, Zephyrhills. Lewis's longevity was exceeded by Wisconsin survivor John Zigmond ("Swin") Swendrzynski, who lived to be 103, dying in July 1999.

He was born in Westford, but was a resident of Eastford for many years. He was a member of the State Legislature in the 1929 session, serving on the Military Affairs Committee, and was a Commissioner of the State Domestic Animals Department. He operated an automobile agency in Willimantic from 1936 to 1942, was tax collector in Eastford from 1943 to 1952, and a member of the Board of Tax Review from 1953 to 1963. He was a member of the Eastford Congregational Church.

He enlisted in Texas, and was a member of the No. 100 Aero Squadron, which was on the torpedoed ship. His parents have received no word. The last they heard from him was a letter saying that he was about to sail.

Young Lewis was born in Eastford and had lived there up to the time of his enlisting. He attended Woodstock Academy for a while. Besides his parents he has a number of brothers and sisters, among them being Darwin Lewis, formerly employed at the Putnam post office.

Recent Dinner Given for Mrs. Sarah B. Bradway, Who is 100 Years Old—Town Doubles Bond Quota and Wins Honor Flag.

At a family gathering Sunday, May 5, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Darwin Clark about 50 children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Mrs. Sarah Bosworth Bradway met to celebrate her 100th birthday. Dinner was served by Mrs. Clark, a daughter of Mrs. Bradway, with whom she lives.

Mrs. Bradway was born April 30, 1818, on the place now owned by Emerson Lyon, near Crystal lake, and has always lived in the town of Eastford (formerly Ashford), with the exception of about seven years, when she lived on the east side of Crystal lake, in the town of Woodstock. She is the only survivor of 11 children. She has three children, 14 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild. Private Edwin C. Lewis, a survivor of the Tuscania, which was torpedoed on its way to France, is a great-grandchild.

Mrs. Bradway retains her faculties to a remarkable degree. Her sight is impaired, but she has a clear memory and can tell many interesting tales of olden times. She enjoys having people come in to talk with her. She remembers how she commenced going to school at the age of 3. She was carried on horseback by her father a distance of about one and one-quarter miles.

Mrs. Bradway is a Real Daughter of the American Revolution and is a member of Elizabeth Porter Putnam chapter of Putnam. About a dozen members of this chapter came and called on her her birthday and left remembrances and flowers.
