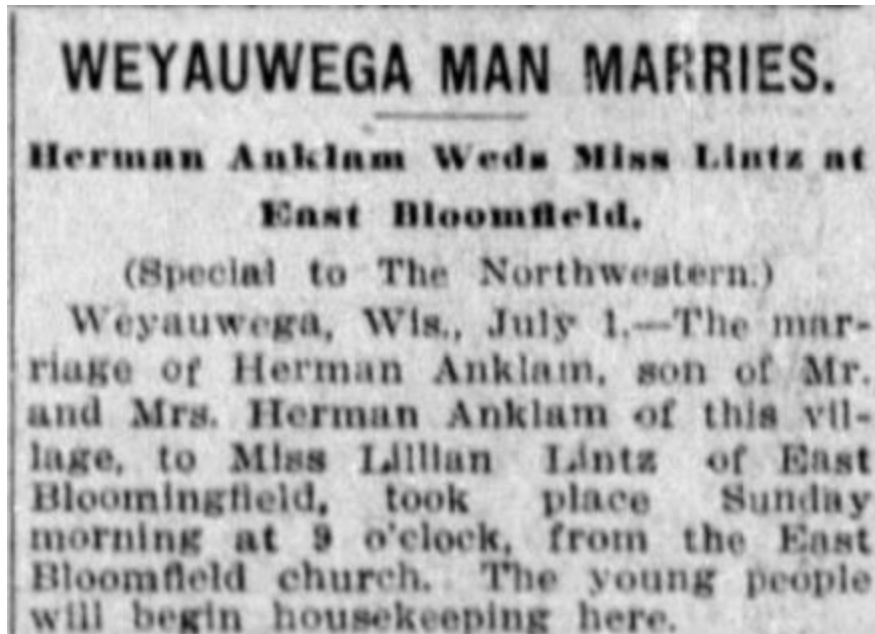

Four days after Tuscania sank, Robert's sister Lillian Lind Anklam died. Her obituary (copied above) says the family was notified of his survival by the time of her funeral – but newspaper accounts only confirm his survival later.

"Wisconsin State Journal" (Madison WI) Monday 11 Feb 1918 p 1 – the War Department lists among the missing Robert F. Lind of Poyssippi WI.

"Wausau (WI) Daily Herald" Tuesday 12 Feb 1918 p 1 – not yet reported as a survivor: Robert F. Lind, Poyssippi WI.

"Stevens Point (WI) Journal" Thursday 21 Feb 1918 p 4 – there are 37 new names listed as survivors of Tuscania. Among them, from WI, is Robert F. Lind of Poy Sippi.

Post-war:

"Wisconsin Rapids (WI) Daily Tribune" Saturday 19 Feb 1927 p 2 – there were 27 Waushara Co. WI veterans aboard the Tuscania. Some of them met recently at Wautoma to form the "Tuscania Survivors." One of those aboard was Robert F. Lind.
