Funeral Services for Patrick Loughrea Are Held at Notre Dame

Funeral services for the late Patrick Loughrea were held at 9 o'clock this morning at Notre Dame church, with Rev. Fr. J. Hannachek officiating at the church, and Rev. Fr. Ray at Hope cemetery where interment took place. The services were largely attended by his old neighbors and friends.

Patrick Loughrea, a former resident of Chippewa Falls, died in St. Paul early Saturday morning after an extended illness, following a stroke suffered 13 years ago. He was born in Beaurivage, Province of Quebec, 79 years ago and came to Chippewa Falls as a young man. He was married to Isabella McGee, who preceded him in death four weeks ago. They made their home at 105 Jefferson avenue until 12 years ago when the family moved to St. Paul, where they have since made their home.

Mr. Loughrea is survived by two daughters, Anne and Mildred, and three sons, Robert and Wilfred of St. Paul, and F. Francis of Buhl, Minn. A brother, John, of Duluth, and three grandchildren also survive.

She was married here to Patrick Loughrea and the family lived at 105 Jefferson avenue, until twelve years ago, when they moved to St. Paul, which has since been their home.

Mrs. Loughrea is survived by her husband, two daughters, Anne and Mildred, three sons, Robert, Wilfred and E. Francis, and three grandchildren. A brother, Ed. McGee, of Spokane, Wash., and a sister, Mrs. Dennis Thornton of Seattle, Wash., also survive.

KAS SKULL FRACTURED

WILFRED LOUGHREA VICTIM OF
UNUSUAL ACCIDENT—CON-
DITION VERY GRAVE.

Wilfred Loughrea, the thirteen-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Loughrea, 105 Jefferson Avenue, is very near death as the result of a peculiar accident at the Fair Grounds on Friday. He and another youngster named McKee were playing with a twelve pound shot. McKee threw it into the air and Loughreau attempted to catch the lead ball. It was too heavy for him, went through his hands and struck him on the head. He was knocked unconscious, and was hurried to the hospital where it was discovered his skull was fractured. Drs. McRae and Hayes operated at once, and found it necessary to remove a part of the skull. The boy's brain is damaged and meningitis is feared. The little fellow's condition is very serious and his recovery is doubtful.

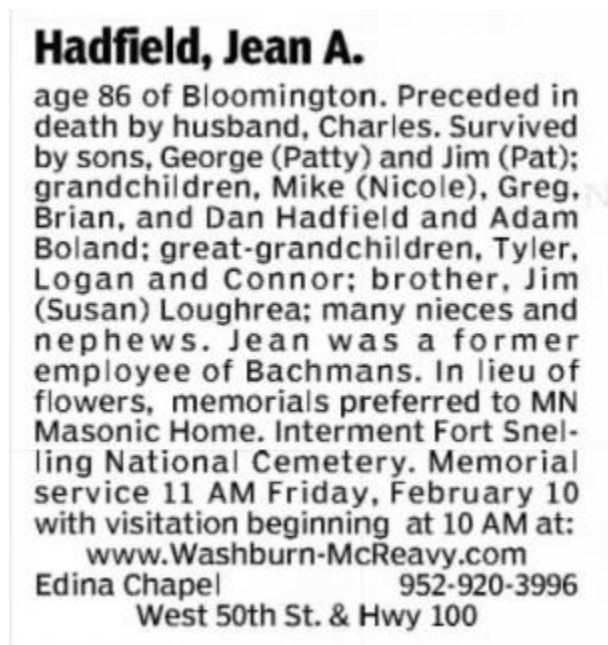

Take Third Place in State Meet by Chalking Up Decisive Victory.

Buhl carried too many guns for Red Wing and won third place in the state high school basketball tournament by chalking up a 35 to 16 victory over the Wingers in the game that just preceded the title contest Saturday.

The speedy Rangers, hitting their stride again after being upset by Wadena in the semi-finals Friday night, never gave the Red Wing lads a chance. Pouring in baskets steadily, Buhl took an 18 to 2 lead at half time and increased that edge by three points in the second half despite a comeback on the part of the Wingers. The Purple team made a rally to start the third quarter but after the Buhl lead had been sliced a bit, the northerners went back to the business of rolling in the buckets.

Coach Ed Loughrea of Buhl took his team's upset at the hands of Wadena very philosophically. "We did much better this year than last," he commented, "and we'll have five of this year's squad back next year. We expect to be down again."
