A mother's intuition told Mrs. M. J. Daley of 511 Tenth avenue, her 19-year-old son, Charles P. H. McVey, was aboard the Tuscania. Scores of friends visited Mrs. Daley at her home yesterday and tried to comfort her, but she refused to believe McVey might not have been on the vessel.

"He has been drowned," she said; "something tells me."

McVey enlisted in the aviation corps November 26, 1917. He was assigned to No. 158 Aero Squadron and sent to Texas for training. After he left Texas Mrs. Daley heard nothing from him. The aero squadron to which McVey is attached was reported to have been aboard the transport. The young man is a native of San Francisco and a graduate of Sacred Heart College.

Mrs. M. J. Daley, 511 Tenth avenue, fears that her 19-year-old son Charles P. H. McVey, was on board the Tuscania. This squadron was reported to have sailed on the Tuscania. McVey is a graduate of Sacred Heart College and a native of San Francisco.

Sacred Heart Flag Contains 250 Stars

An alumni service flag bearing 250 stars was dedicated yesterday at Sacred Heart College by Archbishop J. Hanna before the faculty and 600 students.

The flag carries three gold stars, commemorating El. Ray Gozzett, lost on the torpedo patrol boat Alcedo; Charles McVey, who perished on the *Tuscania*, and Cornelius Sullivan, who died on a Pacific transport. Patriotic songs and an address by John H. Becker, '18, preceded the dedication.

Convinced that her son, Charles Patrick McVey, a member of the U. S. aviation corps, lost his life when the *Tuscania* was sunk by the Germans off the coast of Ireland on February 6, Mrs. Catherine Daley, 511 Tenth avenue, yesterday filed a petition for letters of administration on his estate. The papers filed by Mrs. Daley with County Clerk H. I. Mulcrevy say that McVey left an estate valued at \$6500, consisting of San Francisco real estate. The mother is the sole heir.

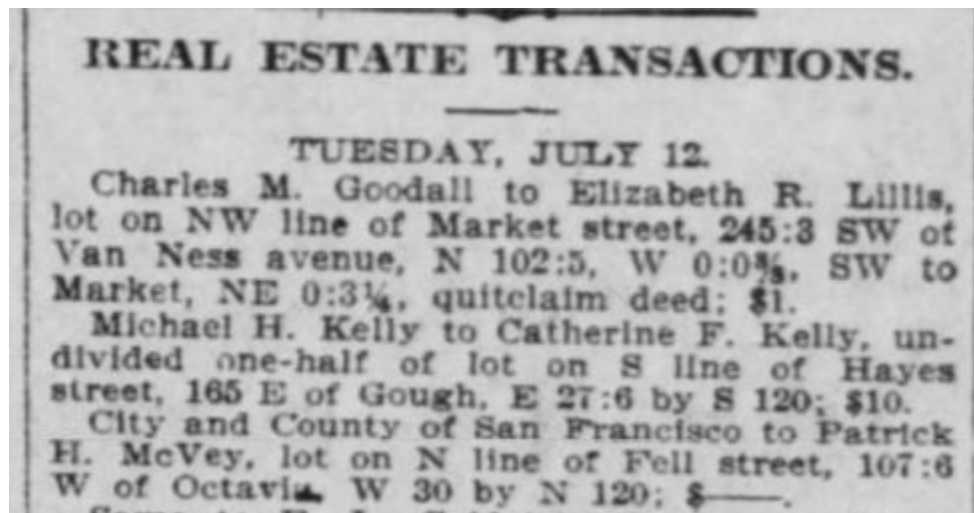

"San Francisco Chronicle" 11 Feb 1918 p 2 – the name of Charles H.P. McVey is Charles P.H. McVey. His mother, Mrs. M.J. Daley, 511 - 10th Ave., was officially notified by the Adjutant General that he was NOT on the ship.

"San Francisco Examiner" Monday 11 Feb 1918 p 1 – not yet reported as a survivor: McVey, Private Charles P.H., 158th Aero Squadron, San Francisco

"San Francisco Examiner" 12 Feb 1918 p 5 - word was sent to Mrs. M.J. Daley, 511 Tenth Ave., San Francisco, from the government that Charles McVey was alive. He is 19 years old, a graduate of Sacred Heart College.

"San Francisco Chronicle" 10 Apr 1918 p 8 – Charles McVey's mother Mrs. Catherine Daley is convinced he died on board Tuscania & she is the sole heir of his \$6,500 estate, consisting of San Francisco real estate.
