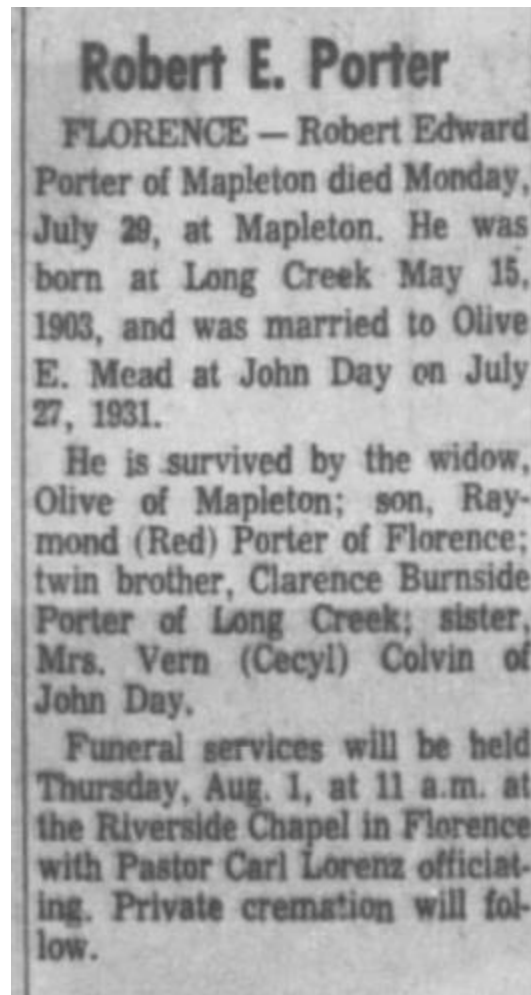

It is expected the body will reach here Monday morning on the overland train,

A special messenger was sent this morning to notify his parents of the death of their beloved son, and they are expected to arrive here Monday.

The thanks of our citizens are due Mr C H Taylor for the interest he has taken in the matter, having raised the money and attended to all other details.

The people of Eugene have done themselves credit in ordering the body brought home among his friends for interment.

THE REMAINS BROUGHT HERE.

Funeral of the Late Charles Mead Will Be Held Tomorrow.

The gay departure of the Oregon Volunteers to the service of their country is still fresh in the minds of the people of Eugene, and the first sad return was experienced this morning when the remains of Charles Mead, who died at San Francisco last week, were brought here for burial.

The remains arrived on this morning's early train, and were met at the depot by about 25 members of Co C, and escorted to the armory.

The parents of the deceased arrived here from Hermann about 2 o'clock, and arrangements were then perfected for the funeral, which will be held at the armory tomorrow at 10 a m, and the remains will be interred in the Odd Fellows cemetery. The funeral services will be under the direction of Company C. Friends invited.

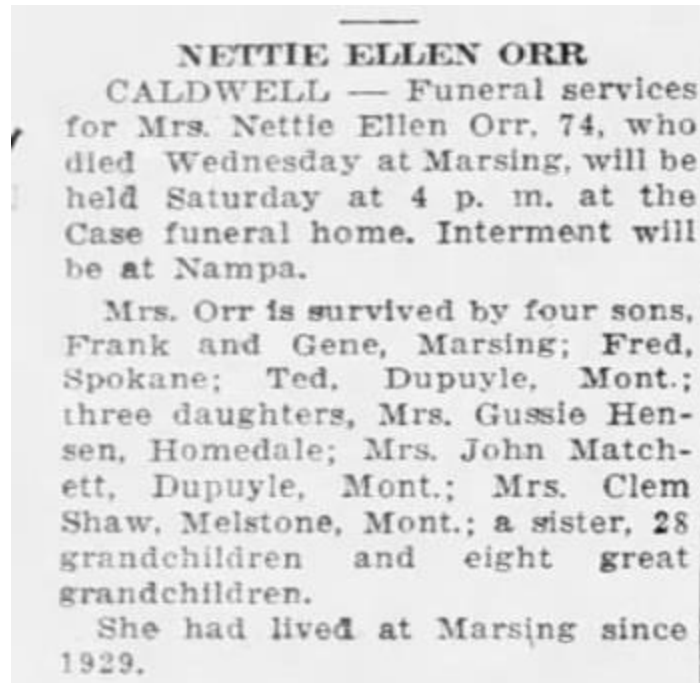
