He was born Dec. 22, 1889 in Germany and in 1896 came to the United States, settling in Minnesota. Later he lived in Stone Lake, where he was a mason for more than 40 years. He lived in Withee a short time before moving to King in 1974.

He married Lila Weaver Feb. 4, 1920 in Owen. She died Nov. 10, 1982. He also was predeceased by three brothers and a sister.

There are no immediate survivors.

Carl Meyenburg was age 2 when he emigrated with his parents & 3 older brothers departed 10 Jun 1892 from Hamburg, Germany, on the "Empress." They had been residents of Pritzwalk, Prussia, and were heading to Quebec, Canada.

Apparently after the death of his mother 15 months after the family arrived in the US, the children were scattered.
