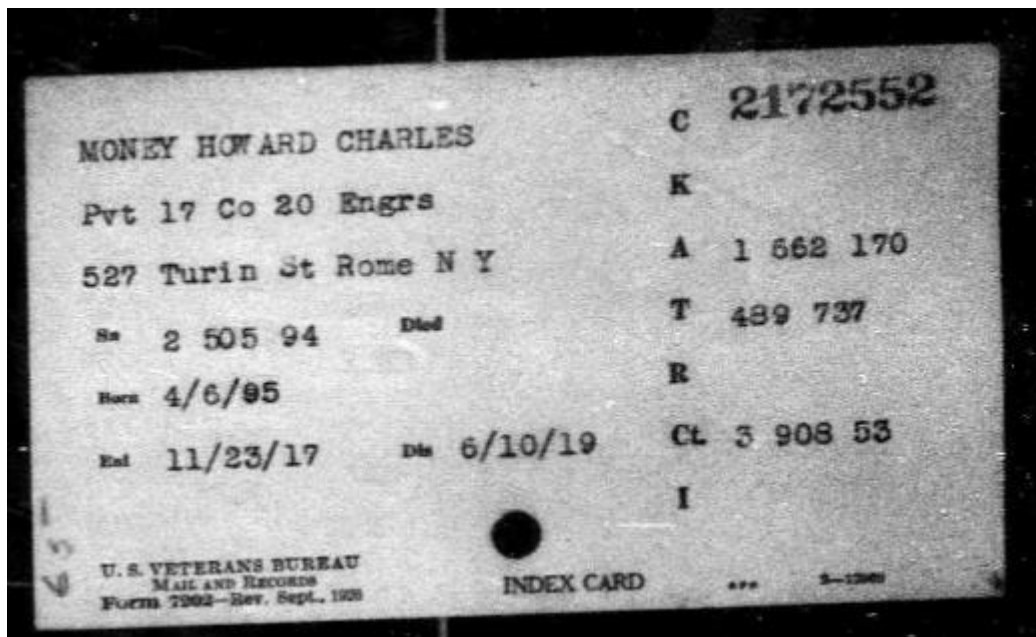

Tuscania Survivor Says There Was No Need for Anyone to Have Drowned

Some So Excited They Jumped Overboard Two Minutes After Ship Was Torpedoed, Rome Boy Writes in Letter Home.

Private Howard Money, Company K, Sixth Battalion, Washington engineers, who was a passenger on the ill-fated Tuscania, writes his mother, Mrs. Louisa Money, in Rome, that the loss of life was unnecessary.

His letter follows, in part:
"We all enjoyed the trip very much, especially on that afternoon when we sighted land. The fellows were in high spirits when they knew that they would land the next day. But we got there sooner than we expected. I landed in a small Irish town with about 500 others, and the rest were scattered in different places. We are all together now in England."

No Cause For Loss.

"Those fellows who lost their lives were themselves to blame, because they had at least two hours to get off before the ship sunk. Some were so excited that they jumped overboard two minutes after we were torpedoed. About ten minutes after we were struck I got off in a lifeboat, which held fifty-three fellows."

"We had two mess calls on February 5th, at 5 and 6 o'clock. I was in the second call for supper and was down in my sleeping quarters getting ready for supper, when we were all given a shocking surprise at 5:45 o'clock. The lights were out. We grabbed our lifebelts and went to the boats to which we had previously been assigned. We left the ship and rowed around more than four hours before we were picked up. Some of the fellows were pretty scared when we went over the big waves."

"There isn't any danger of drowning with life belts on, but some of the fellows didn't wear any. I wasn't a bit excited and took everything easy. There were so many in our boat that we could hardly handle the oars. I rowed with the others to keep the boat head-on with the waves so that it wouldn't tip over."

Big Waves Exciting.

"There is one incident that I won't forget as long as I live and that was the excitement of going over the big waves in a small loaded boat. The fellows had plenty of time and there wasn't any use of losing a single life. We are all happy now."

"We lost everything except the clothes we wore. We are now getting fully equipped. The Irish people used as fine as long as we were with them."

"The weather is very nice here and we all feel healthy. I hope you won't worry over this matter, as I am safe and sound and will be good and brave. I suppose you read all about the trouble in the papers. It ought to get up some fighting spirit in the United States. I will close now, hoping to hear from you all. Love to all and best wishes. Good bye and good luck."
