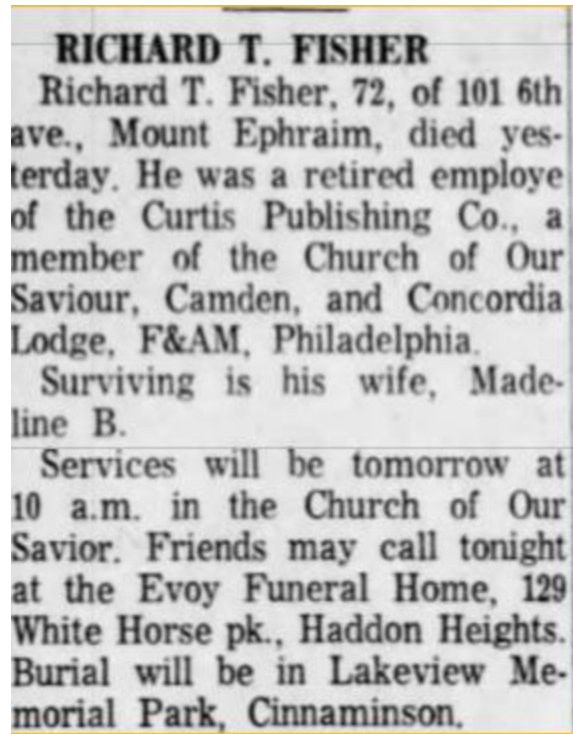

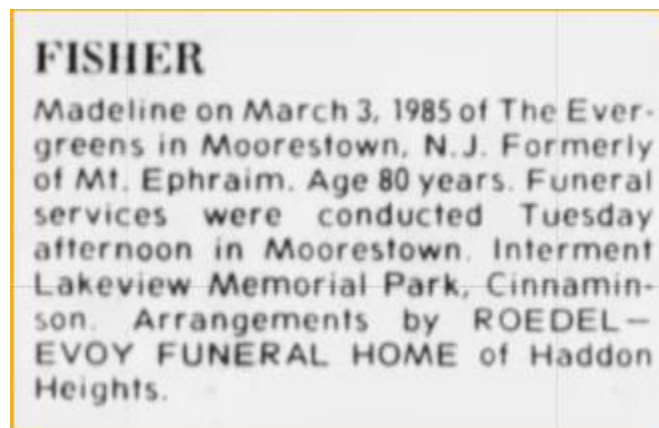

Verdun Grant Hill passed away peacefully on April 17, 2017, with his devoted daughter and only child by his side. He was born on Oct. 16, 1918, in his grandmother's home in Byesville, Ohio, to Grant Hill and Goldena Yontz. Verdun received his unique name at the time his father was in the Word War I battle in Verdun, France. Verdun often joked that he was lucky that his dad was not fighting in Metz or Versailles, France, at the time of his birth. Following that war, his parents located in Cambridge, Ohio, where Verdun attended school and had jobs ranging from funeral home work to owning and driving a taxi cab.

In 1939, he joined the Navy and began a tour of the Pacific as a machinist aboard the USS William B. Preston. On Dec. 7, 1941, while harbored in the Philippines, his ship was attacked by Japanese planes returning to Japan after their devastating strike on the U.S. Fleet in Pearl Harbor. Fortunately, the men of the Preston were able to turn back the assault, and the ship made its way to safety in Darwin, Australia. However, while in Darwin, the Japanese aircraft later utilized a combination of bombs and machine gun fire to attack both the Preston and the USS Peary moored adjacent to Verdun's ship. Sadly, the Peary was sunk by the bombing while the Preston was heavily damaged. The Preston then limped to the harbor at Perth for repairs. After repairs were completed, Verdun's ship spent the remainder of the war picking up downed Allied pilots from the Pacific's waters.

Upon Verdun's return back to the States after the war, he left his Cambridge home and traveled to Florida and then Texas. His intention at that time was to journey to San Diego to reenlist, however, during his stay in Dallas, his plans were derailed when he met the love of his life, Margaret Elizabeth Monnier, who was an RN at a local hospital. Although Margaret was usually very slow and deliberate when making life decisions, Verdun swept her off her feet, and they married after only a two-week courtship. They soon moved to Pittsburgh, Penn., where she worked in a hospital, while he drove a city bus during the day and studied watch-making at night. Upon graduating, he was employed by several jewelry stores before Margaret convinced him that their newborn daughter, Carol Ann, should be raised in Dallas beside her family. Following the move to Texas, Verdun worked for a number of jewelry stores prior to opening a store of his own in Dallas. After selling that successful store, Margaret and he opened a Hallmark Gift Store, where Verdun also repaired watches. Once again, he sold a successful store and began repairing watches for Rolex in their factory repair center.

Shortly after retiring, Margaret and Verdun purchased an Airstream and traveled throughout a large portion of the U.S. Once their travels were complete, they relocated from Texas to Oceanside, Calif., to be close to their daughter, Carol; son-in-law, David Forsyth; and baby granddaughter, Natalie. The Hills enjoyed Oceanside for 27 years but were ready to move with Carol and David to Roseburg, Oregon, in 2011, and to be with their granddaughter, Natalie, and her husband, Brian Baumgartner. Natalie and Brian blessed Verdun with two great grandchildren, Audrey and Bowen. On April 20, 2015, Verdun lost his beloved Margaret—his wife of 68 years. This is a loss from which Verdun never recovered. Verdun spent the remaining two years of his life preparing through his Bible study to meet Margaret once again in Heaven. We know that they are dancing to the sounds of Benny Goodman music this very minute. Verdun's life was one that was a well-lived 98 1/2 years. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather. He will be missed by his family, and the many friends he touched along the way.

The family wishes to thank the caregivers at Verdun's home, as well as the caregivers and staff at the Transitional Care Unit of the Roseburg V.A., who provided true loving care for Verdun in his final days. Services with military honors for Verdun will be held at the North Umpqua Bible Fellowship (1547 Wild River Drive, Roseburg) on Thursday, May 4, at 2 p.m. The family requests, in lieu of flowers, that donations go to the North Umpqua Bible Fellowship.
