Services for Paul E. Malloy, 54, of 1302 N. 59th st., a fire department lieutenant, will be held at 9:30 a.m. Saturday at the Becker funeral home, 5330 W. Lisbon av., and at 10 a.m. at St. Sebastian's church. Burial will be in Holy Cross cemetery. Mr. Malloy died Thursday at the veterans' hospital at Wood after a long illness. He was lieutenant of engine company 35 and truck 16.



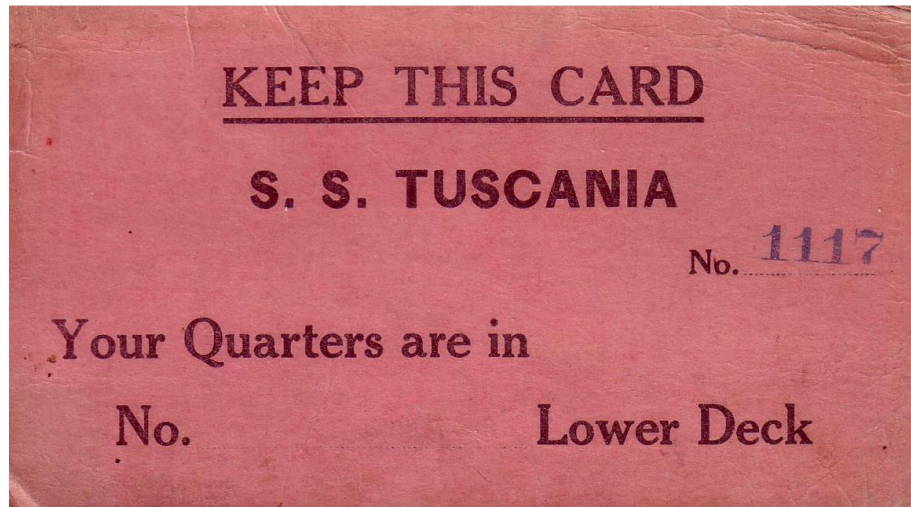

Mr. Malloy was with the 32nd Red Arrow division in World War I. He was a survivor of the Tuscania, British troopship torpedoed in 1918 off the Irish coast while carrying American soldiers. He was a member of the Tuscania Survivors' association.

Surviving are his wife, Viola; two sons, Patrick and Paul; a half-brother, Gordon; two foster brothers, Lee and Frank Krill, and his stepmother, Mrs. Clara Randall, all of Milwaukee.

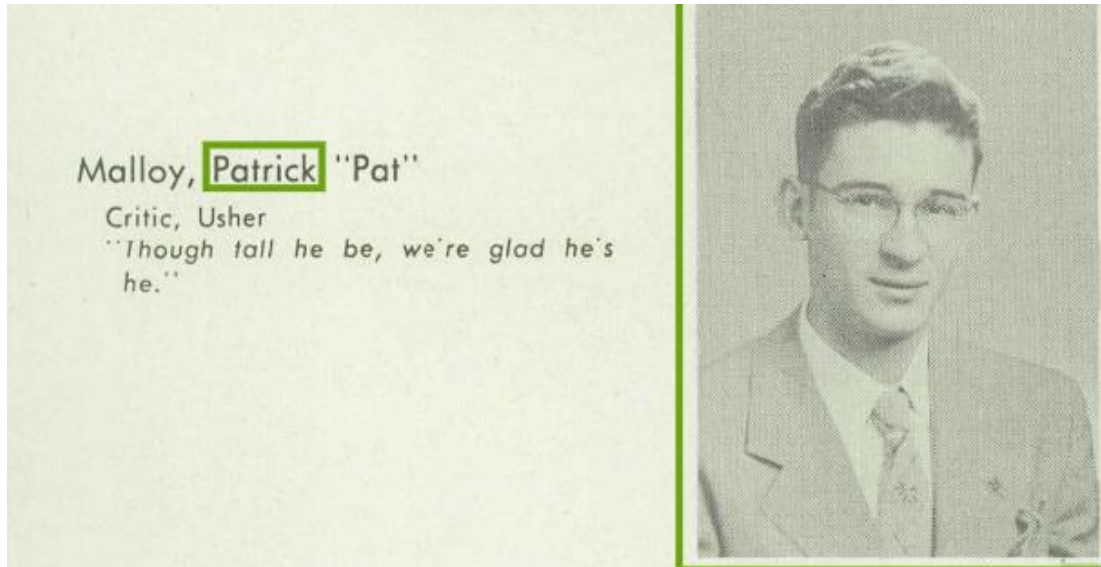
Crash Follows Fatal Heart Attack

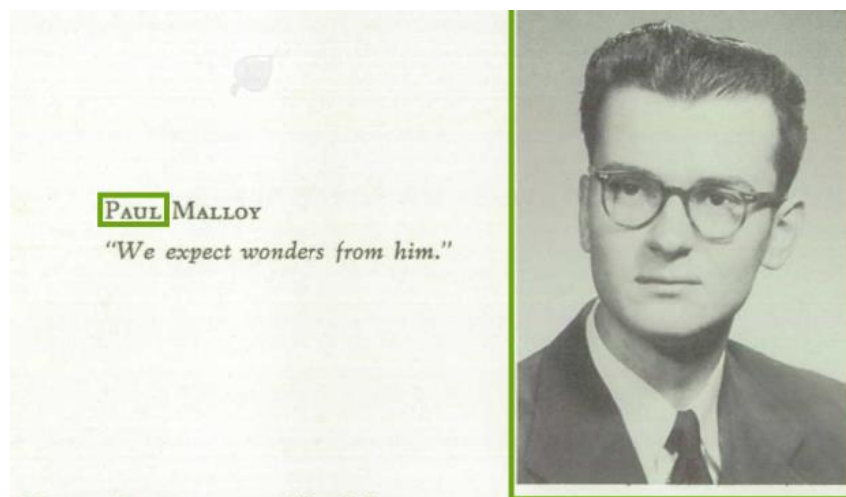
