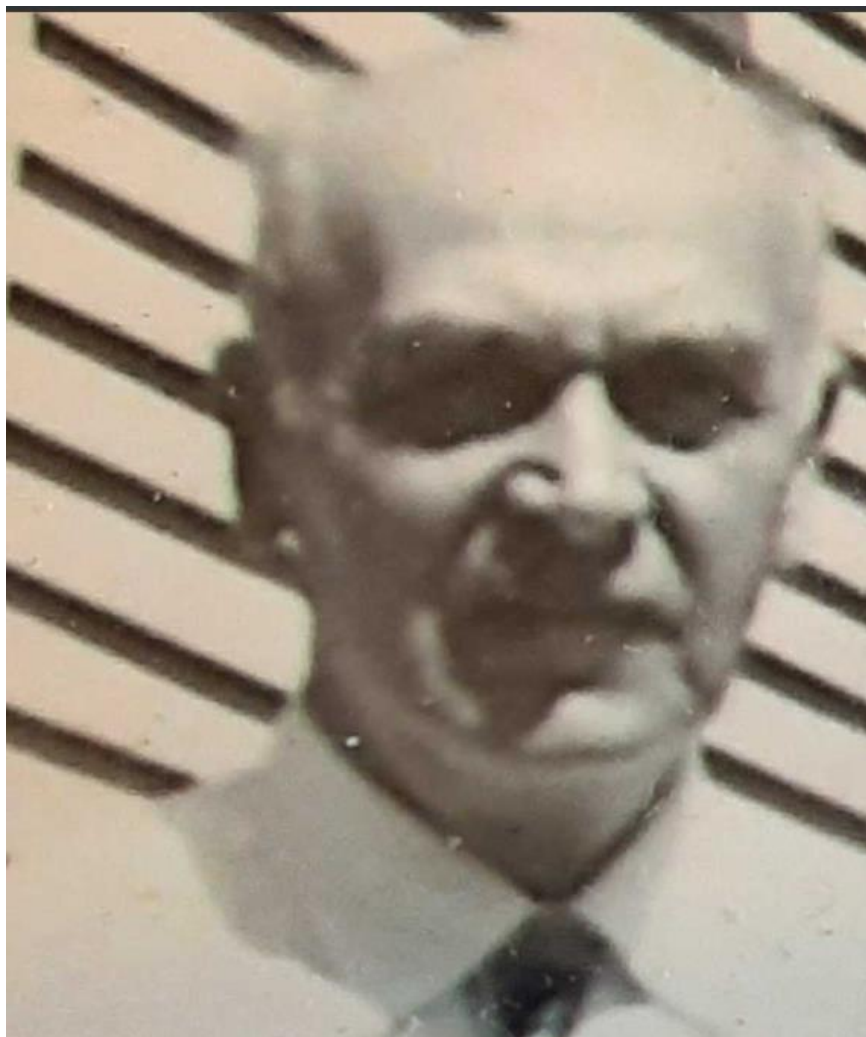

Mrs. Louis Verbracken, Chippewa Falls, and her sister, Mrs. Dan Curten of Minneapolis, have returned from Milwaukee where they attended the funeral services for their brother, Ernest Morency. Mr. Morency was born in Chippewa Falls on Oct. 25, 1893, and attended Notre Dame School. He was a veteran of World War I; then went to Milwaukee where he was married and where he had lived since. He passed away on Nov. 27.

It was expected that the body would be shipped here, but the cost is too great. In winter about \$1200 is required to transport a body. Mr. Morency's estate is being looked after by his brother, who states in his letter that the hotel will be sold in time and the proceeds sent to the widow in this city.

Mrs. Edmere Morency, 60, pioneer resident of Chippewa Falls, was found by her daughter, Mrs. Louis Verbrecken, to have died some time early Sunday morning, when she called on her mother at about 9 o'clock Sunday morning at her home, 104 S. Main St.

Mrs. Morency had been in apparently excellent health when she retired Saturday evening, and according to the family physician, she died about 4:30 o'clock Sunday morning from heart disease.

The deceased came to Chippewa Falls with her parents, Mr. and Mrs.

Plymouth Pelouin, when she was seven years old. She was born at Putnam, Mass., in 1879. Her husband, who was a miner in Alaska, preceded her in death about 21 years ago.

Surviving are one son, Ernest Morency, Milwaukee, two daughters, Mrs. D. J. Curtain, St. Paul, and Mrs. Louis Verbrecken, this city. She is also survived by seven grand children and one sister, Miss Delphine Pelouin, and three brothers, Norman, Peter, and Felix Pelouin, all of this city.

Funeral services will be held at 9 o'clock this morning at the Holy Ghost church and interment will be made at Calvary cemetery.

MRS. E. MORENCY DIES ON SUNDAY

**Pioneer Resident of Chippewa
Falls Found Dead in Bed by
Her Sister.**

Mrs. Edmere Morency, aged 60 years, passed away in her sleep at her home, 124 South Main street, Sunday morning. Her death was discovered at 9:15 by her sister, Mrs. Dolphine Pelloquin, the two women having made their home together.

Relatives today said Mrs. Morency was apparently in the best of health prior to the time she retired Saturday evening. She and her sister remained up late reading and talking, and Mrs. Morency appeared in good spirits when she retired. A physician who was called said she passed quietly away in her sleep, and heart trouble is believed to have been the cause of her death.

Mrs. Morency was born Edmere Pelloquin at Putnam, Mass., and came to Chippewa Falls with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Plymouth Pelloquin, when she was seven years old. She attended Notre Dame school and in 1889 was married to Ernest Morency, whose death occurred 21 years ago in Alaska. Surviving relatives are two daughters, Mrs. Louis Verbracken of this city, Mrs. D. J. Curtin of St. Paul, one son, Ernest Morency of Milwaukee; seven grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Delphine Pelloquin of this city and three brothers, Norman and Peter Pelloquin of Hallie and Felix Pelloquin of Blue Island, Ill.

Mrs. Morency's death came as a shock to a large circle of acquaintances who had known her during the 53 years of her residence in Chippewa Falls. She was a devout Christian and possessed many fine traits.

Funeral services will be conducted tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock at the Holy Ghost church and interment will be in Calvary cemetery.

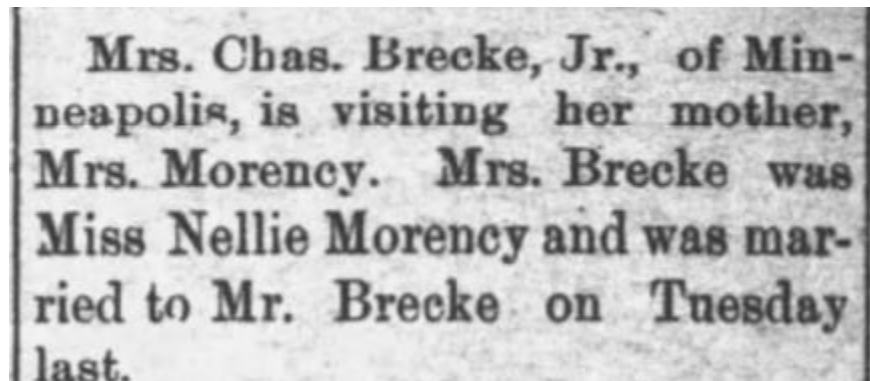

CHARLES BRECKE, Jr.

The death of Charles Brecke, Jr., occurred at Sacred Heart Hospital, Eau Claire, last night at midnight, after a month's illness from kidney trouble. His condition took on a critical aspect last week, and on Friday a transfusion of blood was made from his sister Katinka, without which, it was evident, he could not survive.

The people of Chippewa Falls, have been greatly concerned during the illness of Charles Brecke, and though for the last two days, there has been practically no chance for his recovery, all hoped that the operation performed as a last resort would prove beneficial, and that he would regain his usual health. The announcement this morning of his death, was received with deepest sorrow, among his numerous friends in this city, as well as in Eau Claire.

Charles Brecke, Jr., was born in Chippewa Falls, April 2, 1889, the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Brecke, Sr., 216 Prairie street. He received his education in the public schools of this city and spent the greater part of his life here. He was married June 28, 1909, in Minneapolis to Miss Nellie Morency, of this city. For a time he was a faithful employee on the Independent staff, but for the past four years has been employed by the Eau Claire Press Co., and made his home in that city. Deceased was a member of the Eau Claire Typographical Union No. 558.

Besides his parents and wife, he is survived by one son, Milton, five sisters as follows: Mrs. Harry Johnson Katinka and Minnie Brecke, all of Minneapolis, and Mrs. Joseph Gagnon and Mable Brecke of this city and one brother Roy. To them is extended the heartfelt sympathy of the entire community.

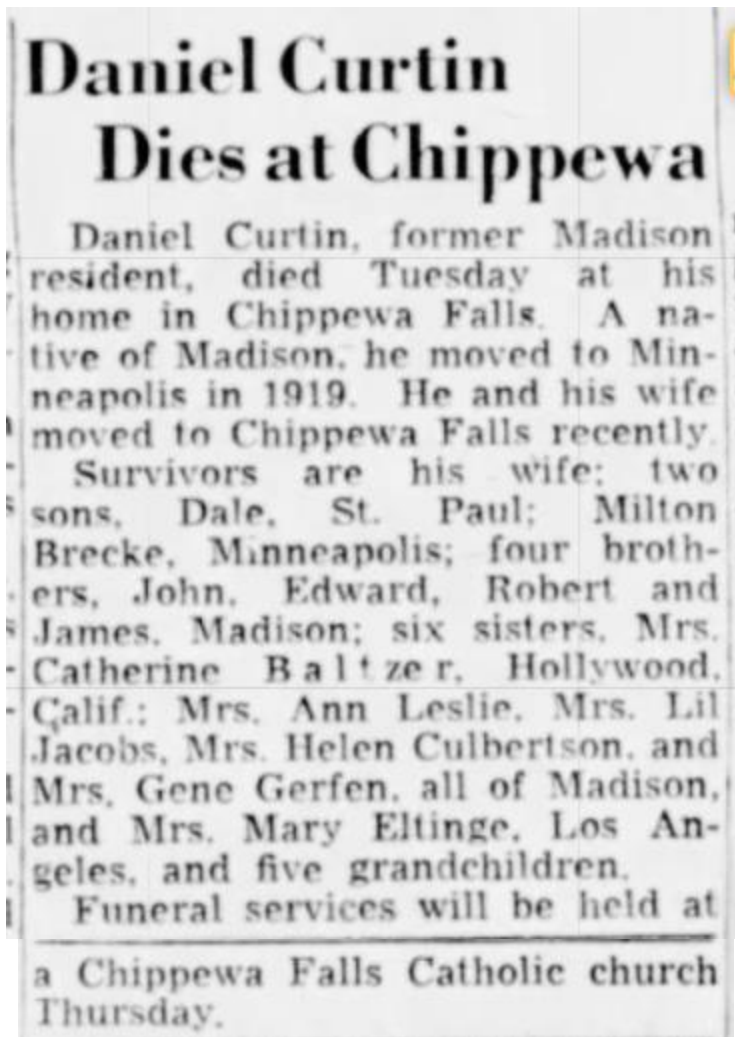

Deputy Marshal Carlson has sold the mortgaged property in the case of the Washington-Alaska bank vs. Ernest Morency and his heirs, the whole being bid in by Receiver Noyes, of the Washington-Alaska bank for \$4,080. The judgment was for \$390.84 and costs.

"Alaska Citizen" (Fairbanks AK) Monday 1 Jul 1912 p 7

His father Ernest Morency took out a mortgage for a Fairbanks, Alaska, gold placer mining claim 6, of \$3191.50. He died 1909. The Washington-Alaska Bank brought suit 3 May 1912 for default, against Alphonse & his widow Mary (actually Edmere, F: 146705465) & Ernest's children: Mary, Nellie & Ernest Jr. A temporary guardian was appointed for minors Nellie & Ernest Jr. The U.S. District Court for the Alaska territory orders the property sold & it is purchased for \$4,080 (fees & mortgage total slightly less) in Fairbanks.
