In Oklahoma**

Mrs. John C. (Aunt Carrie) Motsenbocker who has been quite ill periodically for several months, passed away at 4 a. m. April 20th in Anadarko, Oklahoma where she has lived for the past 37 years.

Born in LaFayette, Alabama, came to Texas a small child with her parents (William and Martha Wright) in about 1870, settling in Collin County at Weston, after a few years there the family moved to Wise County, Anneville and Boyd communities, she was married in 1888, moved to Bridgeport in 1897, thence to Anadarko in 1913 where she has lived since.

Mother of three sons and two daughters.

Survivors are John F., Anadarko, Mrs. Lucy Cox, Norman, Oklahoma, Mrs. Goldia Keathley, 3245, Northwest 31st St., Oklahoma City, and one brother W. H. (Will) Wright, 305 West Market- St., Anadarko, (formerly of Wise County) there are eight grand children and 12 great grand children.

The body laid in state at the home, 308 West Main St., from 4 p. m. Saturday until 2:30 p. m. Sunday.

Services were held in the First Methodist Church of which she had long been a member and Rev. Farrington (who was born in Wise County) who has known the Motsenbockers more than 40 years and a former pastor of the Anadarko church said the last rites in a very impressive and elligent manner.

Mr. Motsenbocker preceeded her in death February 1934.

His principal talk was on his trip and the torpedoing of the Tuscania and the kindness shown the survivors by the Irish people, where they had drifted to the town of Larne, Ireland; and also talked of going over the top at Chateau Thierry, and again they went over the top at Wasson front.

Edward and Mrs. Braddy entertained at dinner last Wednesday in honor of Johnnie Motsenbocker, our hero of this part of the great Caddo county; and, as it rained, they were invited to supper, and spent the evening in listening to war and soldier life over there, and there was a game of rook in which the girls carried off trophies. Those present: Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Motsenbocker, Miss Goldie and J. F. Motsenbocker of Co. L, 9th Inf.; Mrs. M. S. Hobbs and son Willard and little Marion. A day and an evening were spent to be long remembered by all present.
