Pneumonia Is Fatal Here To Ed Muckleroy

Ed M. Muckleroy, believed to have been the first soldier from this section to see action in France in World War I, died at a local hospital at 1:35 o'clock this morning of pneumonia and complications.

Funeral services are to be held from Johnson Chapel at 3 o'clock Friday afternoon with R. T. Williamson, minister of the Church of Christ, 17th and Irving, officiating. Burial is to be in Fairmount Cemetery with Johnson Funeral Home directing. Members of the VFW, in which Muckleroy was quite active, the American Legion, and Disabled American Veterans, are to be honorary pallbearers.

Mr. Muckleroy, 60 years old, was a lifelong Texan, having been born in Lavaca County March 26, 1887. He had been a resident here the last 41 years, serving as a market manager and meat cutter in local grocery stores until about a year ago when his health began to fail. An injury in France sustained in World War I had bothered him during later years.

TUSCANIA SURVIVOR

Surviving him are the widow, the former Alberta G. Barnes, three daughters, five brothers, a sister, a granddaughter, and several nieces and nephews. The daughters are Mrs. George M. Eller of San Marcos, Mrs. Marvin S. Bassett of Los Angeles, and Betty Jean Muckleroy, a senior in high school here. The brothers are Richard L. of Fort Worth, Mike of Fort Stockton, C. P. of Lubbock, R. K. and Herbert of this city. The sister is Mrs. Bertie Rutledge of Sonora. The grandchild is Genevieve Eller.

Mr. Muckleroy on two occasions had sought the office of justice of the peace here. He had gone across

the Atlantic in World War I on the Tuscania which was sunk in the Irish Sea with the loss of 273 lives.

Word had been sent back that he was among the missing, but his lifeboat in which there were 23 soldiers had been picked up by a chaser and taken to Ireland instead of to Scotland where the other First Division survivors were carried. He was a member of Co. H., 28th Infantry, and was wounded at Soissons by a shell explosion.

When the Tuscania was torpedoed Mr. Muckleroy had just stepped out on deck as corporal of the guard, the torpedo striking the vessel about 10 feet below the water line immediately under the spot where he stood.

2,000 ON BOARD

It was early in the night and the vessel was one of a convoy of eight ships which had left Hoboken on Jan. 23, went up the coast to Nova Scotia, picked up a Canadian transport, a British cruiser and five freighters, and then spent 13 days zigzagging across the North Atlantic in wintry, sloppy weather. Everything was confusion. There were 2,000 troops aboard as well as a few regular passengers. Some soldiers took out revolvers and committed suicide. Boats were lowered, and Mr. Muckleroy went down a rope at a time when his boat was nearly full. Another soldier came down behind him, and both fell into the sea. Both were picked up quickly and the San Angeloan cut the rope and they pulled away from the Tuscania.

Muckleroy, as corporal outranked any other man aboard and took charge. A British subchaser almost ran the craft down. They were taken to Londonderry briefly, and later as a replacement, Mr. Muckleroy was sent to the First Division. He was in the St. Mihiel advance, and on July 18 that year he fell wounded at Soissons.

He has been active here in Legion and VFW affairs.

SAN ANGELO, Texas, Feb. 12.—Ernest E. Bridges of Van Court is the third young man from Tom Green county reported by the government as being among the survivors of the Tuscania. Bridges is the son of D. E. Bridges, a farmer living in the southern part of the county, and is only 19 years of age. He enlisted about six months ago as a truck driver.

The other survivors of the Tuscania from this county are Edwin Muckleroy and William Byrd, both of San Angelo.

Tuscania Survivor Writes Home From Point In England

Edward M. Muckleroy, the San Angelo man who was saved when the transport Tuscania was torpedoed and sunk early in the year off the Irish coast, has written to his father, Pat Muckleroy, here. The letter was written from "somewhere in England" about a month ago at which time Muckleroy presumably was on his way to France.

He says he and the other Americans who landed in Ireland were treated royally but gives no details of the sinking of the transport. Whether or not survivors have been forbidden by the government to tell of their experiences is not known. Muckleroy was in fine health when he wrote but said the weather in England was disagreeable.

"I have not seen the sun shine very long at any time since I left Texas," he said in conclusion. Muckleroy's address is, care of the American Expeditionary Force, Casual Detachment No. 2.

Local Veterans Recall War's Closing Incidents as Well as Battles of Cognac and Paris

Ed Muckleroy, now a partner in the Central Market, enlisted in January, 1918, trained at San Antonio and left for New York on Sept. 17. Feb. 5, while in his bunk on the Tuscania it was torpedoed off the Irish coast and 271 men were killed. For two hours he drifted around in an open sea until picked up by the convoy. He said that things got pretty "rollicky" about that time. He was in the battle of Cantigny, where the Germans made eight desperate counter attacks after being beaten back by the steady thrusts of the American troops. Soisson was his next engagement. There on July 18 he was hit by a shell fragment and wounded in the back and shoulder, being taken to a base hospital for a month's treatment before recovering to rejoin his command for the St. Mihiel drive. In this drive, four Lieutenants were all casualties, two of them being killed and the other two listed as missing in action. This

engagement was marked by two days of vigorous fighting. After this he was taken down with the flu and confined again to the hospital. While there he was asked if he wished to rejoin his regiment, join the M. P.'s or go home. He said, "home," and said it quick. He landed in San Angelo April 27, 1919.

to office several years ago. This is Mr. Muckleroy's first time to seek a political office.

The candidate came to San Angelo from Lavaca County in 1906 and since that time has been engaged in the market business in various places here. Mr. and Mrs. Muckleroy, who reside at 124 E. 19th St., have three children: Willie May, 15; Sue Eleanor, 10; and Betty Jean, five. The candidate is a brother of H. I. Muckleroy, officer in the local post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The candidate also is a member of the V. F. W.

Mr. Muckleroy, on the Tuscania, sister ship of the Lusitania, when it was torpedoed by Germans off the coast of Ireland on the night of Feb. 5, 1918, survived the disaster which cost 183 lives. Twenty-three were saved in a life boat, being picked up by an English ship. He survived Cantigney, Soissons and St. Mihiel, spear-points of activity in the World War. At Soissons he was wounded, but he has neither received nor sought government compensation.

BRIDE OF TWO WEEKS KILLS SELF WITH GUN

**MRS. EDWIN MUCKLERoy, DESPONDENT BECAUSE
OF ILL HEALTH, SENT BALL INTO RIGHT TEM-
PLE LAST NIGHT AT FAMILY HOME.**

TRAGEDY ON HER BIRTHDAY

**Deceased Was to Have Undergone An Operation Today and It
is Believed the Horrors of Going on the Surgeon's Table
Induced Her to End Her Own Life.—The Body Will
Be Laid to Rest in Fairmount This Afternoon.**

Mrs. Edwin M. Muckleroy, formerly Miss Golda Wright, shot herself through the right temple Friday night at 9:30 o'clock, while at her home at 124 East Nineteenth street, and died one hour later, despite the efforts of three physicians to save her.

"Death by a gunshot wound, inflicted by her own hand" will be the coroner's verdict, according to a statement made this morning by Judge J. A. Branch, justice of the peace, who conducted the inquest.

BROODED OVER ILLNESS.

Fear of an operation, which it was believed would relieve a slight pressure upon the brain and would restore her health, is thought to have induced the woman to resort to suicide. Mr. Muckleroy had just stepped out of the room at his home last night when a pistol shot rang out. Rushing back into the building, he found his brother, Richard Muckleroy, carrying the limp and bleeding form of his wife to a near-by bed.

Mrs. Muckleroy had reached into an overcoat pocket from which she secured the pistol, seated herself on a trunk, and had then pulled the trigger with the weapon aimed at her head. There was never a ray of hope entertained by physicians that Mrs. Muckleroy's life could be saved after the shot was fired. She never regained consciousness and only gasped weakly as the life blood flowed from the ghastly wound in her temple.

Killed Herself on Birthday.

ty-third birthday, having attained that age on Friday. She had been married only fifteen days. On Thursday, November 2, the fourth day of the San Angelo Fair, she became the bride of Edwin M. Muckleroy, an employee of Beatty's Star Market & Bakery, Rev. Joe F. Webb, pastor of the First Methodist church, performing the ceremony at the home of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. D. Wright, 230 East Twelfth street.

The couple went to the groom's home, where the latter's father, Pat Muckleroy and two brothers, Richard and Herbert, reside. Richard Muckleroy was married only a few months ago and with his wife also continued to reside at the family home, 124 East 19th.

Was to Have Undergone Operation Today.

During the summer, she suffered a nervous collapse and was forced to resign. The engagement to Mr. Muckleroy had been announced for some time and the wedding was at one time planned for August. It was postponed, however, due to Miss Wright's continued ill health. Near relatives of the girl are said to have objected to her wedding while ill, but love prevailed and the vows were pledged on November

2.

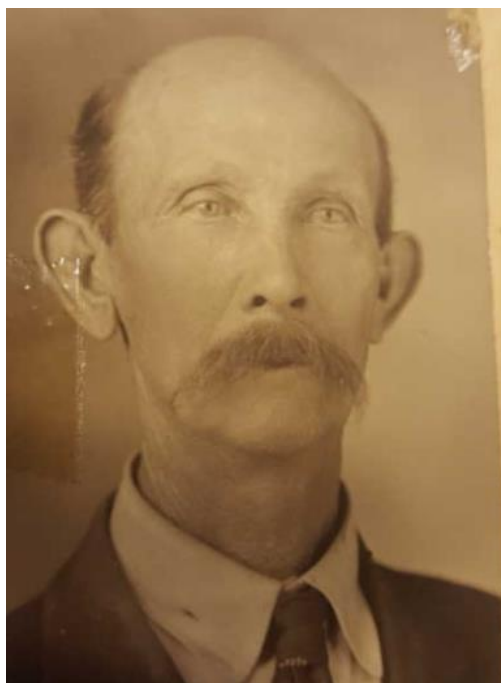

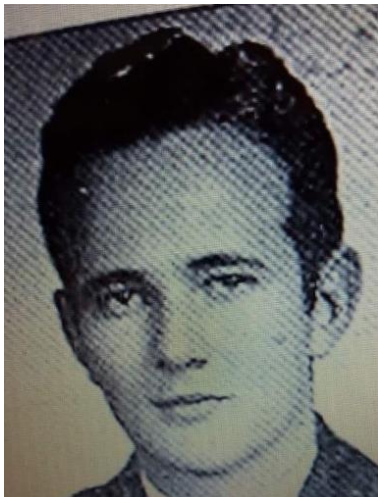
