Funeral Services Held For Joseph Mynar

Funeral services were held at 1 p.m. Wednesday in the Schmidt Funeral Home Chapel for Joseph Mynar of the Pattison Community. Interment was in the Catholic Cemetery at Waller.

Mr. Mynar died Tuesday, April 12 at 4:35 a.m. in the Veteran's Hospital in Houston after being seriously ill for several months. He would have been 74 years of age on his next birthday, June 16. He was born in Gonzales but had been a Waller County farmer for the past 27 years. He was in the 125th Infantry 32nd Division in World War I.

Survivors include his wife Mrs. Frances Mynar, and a son, John of Brookshire; 2 daughters, Mrs. Julia Dobb, and Heneretta Mynar, both

of Waco; 2 sisters, Mary Mynar and Annie Blazek of Houston and a number of nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Survivors are her husband Joe Mynar, asister, Mrs. Fannie Pucek of Clodine, three nephews and six nieces.

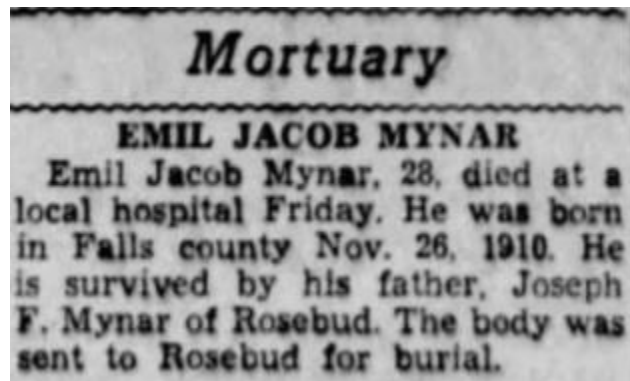
Funeral services were held at the family home with Rev G. Z. Saddler officiating. Burial was in the Waller Cemetery. A. H. Muske and Son directing.

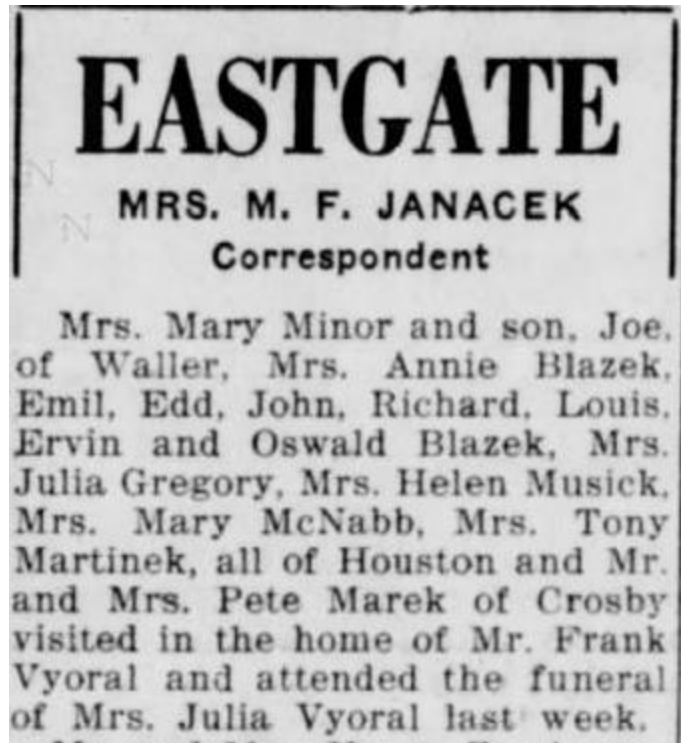
Final Rites Held In Eastgate for Mrs. Julia Vyoral
