Eight More Texans Added to List of Tuscania Survivors

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—Eight Texans and four Oklahomans, previously listed among the missing in the sinking of the transport Tuscania, were reported as safe Tuesday afternoon.

Nine Texans and Oklahomans were among the twenty-one soldiers removed from the Tuscania at Halifax before sailing on account of illness, one of whom was Jacob W. Martin of Fort Worth. The others were: Rupert A. Davis, Frisco; Albert Diaz, Mission; Henry E. Forshee, Hayward, Okla.; Jefferson Davis Jones, Winfield; Edward W. Menely, Shawnee, Okla.; Theodore Pollack, Adkins; Rufus W. Taff, San Saba, Texas, and Joe L. Taylor, San Antonio, Texas.

The following additional survivors of the Tuscania were announced late Tuesday: Private John Kemper, Fairfax, Okla.; Private Virgil J. Roberts, El Reno, Okla.; Private Benjamin Birmingham, Corpus Christi, Texas.
